BUHL — Harrison F. Bates, 73, former Magic Valley area resident, died Tuesday at Orting, Wash., of a month's illness.

He was born at Lake Preston, S.D., March 22, 1896, and moved to Washington with his parents in 1900. He moved to Idaho in 1916 and served in World War I. Mr. Bates was employed in farm work in the Eden area, and later worked at the telephone office in Filer.

## 31 SOUTHWEST WASH. MEN ON LIST OF SURVIVORS

Four Tacoma soldiers and 27 others from southwest Washington are among the 88 Washington survivors of the torpedoed troopship *Tuscania*, according to word received today from Washington, D. C.

The Tacoma men are Floyd S. Hill, 527 No. E st.; William W. Cooper; William E. Farrar, 3710 51st st., and George F. Raugh, 3316 No. 17th st. Herbert G. Root, former Tacoma boy with the 100th aero corps, also was rescued. Gothard Xavier of Parkland was saved.

Other southwest Washington

survivors are Talmadge Smith, L. Brunk, William T. Toomey, Adolph Lemka and Warren Paquette of Vader; Henry E. Dresher, Sherman F. Stover and Rollo Mulford of Chehalis; L. H. Olmstead, Company D, 6th battalion, 20th engineers, of Tenino, and Private Eugene W. Snyder, Company E, of the same battalion, of Rimrock and Charles L. Hall, Vancouver.

This does not necessarily mean that they have been lost, as there are many missing names.



## SIXTY-THREE TUSCANIA SURVIVORS RECOVERING IN IRISH HOSPITALS

WASHINGTON, D. C., Feb. 25.—Sixty-three American survivors of the torpedoed troopship Tuscania are reported to the war department as recovering in Irish hospitals from the effects of injuries or exposure. The dispatch said none of the cases was serious and it was expected all the men soon would be discharged.

All of the 63 had previously been reported saved, and the presence of many of them in hospitals had been recorded in press dispatches, although yesterday dispatches brought the first official list of those in hospitals. The list includes:




