Crawfordsville Man Receives Message From Brother in Ireland.

[Special to The Indianapolis News]

CRAWFORDSVILLE, Ind., February 12.—Holllis H. Baugh, of this city, a motorman on the Ben-Hur traction line, received a cablegram today from somewhere in Ireland informing him that his brother, Lieutenant Arthur P. Baugh, was among the survivors of the transport *Tuscania*. Lieutenant Baugh, whose home is in Oregon, gave up his business and entered the first officers' training camp, at the Presidio in California. He was commissioned a lieutenant of field artillery. A few weeks ago he was assigned to service in France, and with Mrs. Baugh visited relatives in Crawfordsville before he left for New York city on January 22. His brother here did not know he was on the *Tuscania* until he received the cablegram announcing that he had been saved.

Lieutenant Describes the Sinking of the Tuscania

[Special to The Indianapolis News]

CRAWFORDSVILLE, Ind., May 3.—Thrilling scenes that were enacted following the torpedoing of the Tuscania by a German submarine off the coast of Ireland on the evening of February 5 are vividly described in a letter written by Lieutenant Arthur P. Baugh to Mrs. Baugh and to his brother, Hollis H. Baugh, of this city. The letter was written from Winchester, England, under date of February 12. Lieutenant Baugh, who is a young business man of Portland, Ore., entered the second officers' reserve training camp at the Presidio, in California, and was commissioned a first lieutenant of artillery. He was promptly chosen for overseas service.

"Lieutenant Bently and I were sitting in my stateroom on the evening of the 5th, waiting for dinner, which was to be served at 7 o'clock," Lieutenant Baugh writes. "Just as I locked my trunk and pushed it aside the explosion came. The lights went out instantly. We went for our lifebelts, which we always kept handy, and made for the top deck. I can tell you it did not take long for us to get on top. The boat trembled, just like something alive, when she was struck. The boat listed to starboard and began to settle.

"I previously had been assigned to life-boat 6-B, which was the third boat over from No. 6 on port side. I was to be in charge of fifty-four men, who would be in this boat. Lieutenant Bentley and myself, assisted by our crew, one mate and one member of the boat crew, lowered three boats very nicely, right side up and all loaded.

"My boat was the third over. We made a graceful landing, but just as we struck the water a destroyer came alongside to rescue the men, and it smashed our lifeboat like an egg shell between it and the Tuscania. We all grabbed for the deck line of the destroyer, and I think every one of my men got aboard all O. K., but just in time. We took on seventeen officers and 256 men, and made for the northern coast of Ireland. The Tuscania was torpedoed at 5:45 o'clock, and we were landed about 2 o'clock the next morning. I don't think heaven will look any better than Ireland did that night.

"We were treated royally by the Irish and English, especially by the army officers. If I ever meet an English army officer in the good old United States of America he is going to get the best I have.

"One thing happened that touched me. A young chap came up to me when we went on deck and appeared to be very nervous. He said to me, in the dark: 'Are you an officer?' I told him, 'Yes.' Then he said: 'Everything is all right then.' He asked me if I thought

the boat was sinking very fast. I consoled him all I could. Then I heard him praying. But I never saw him after that time. I did not know his name, but he must have been a Christian lad."

A SQUAW MAN "CAN'T TAKE IT" WHEN JUDGE PASSES SENTENCE

Ukiah Attorney Has A First-Hand Sight Of Court Drama

PLANNED BURNING ALIVE

An intercepted letter, made public by Sheriff Taylor Day, alleged to have been written by Richard Morrow, white member of the burglar trio, discloses one of the Indians planned to tie Arthur E. Rutledge station owner to a bed and burn the station. The letter written to a relative states in part:

"I've not said this before because I was afraid but I was forced to do that on the threat of getting an awful beating and I didn't know until the sentence was passed (one of the Indians) told me he was going to tie Rutledge to the bed and burn the place down. Please believe me. I never told the more truer truth than now and you know I wouldn't harm anybody or anything and (one of the Indians) said when he got out he was going to finish Rutledge."

Sheriff Day and District Attorney Busch requested The Lakeport Bee to withhold the name of the party to whom the letter was addressed.

A local member of the bar, who was attending court in Lake county last week, states a most unusual commotion occurred when Judge Benjamin C. Jones passed sentence on Richard Morrow, a white man, William Fred and Mark Hopper, Indians, directing they be confined in San Quentin from five to 15 years on a first degree burglary charge. Mr. Morrow fainted when sentence was pronounced and his mother, who was in the court room at the time, also collapsed and became hysterical. She had to be taken from the court room.

They Were Armed.

The three men pleaded guilty to the burglary charge two weeks ago and asked probation. When Probation Officer Jack Anton made his report Friday he stated the men had taken a shotgun along when they robbed the Rutledge Service Station between Kelseyville and Lower Lake. When the men confessed to District Attorney Burt Busch and Sheriff Taylor Day they did not state they used a gun.

Intended To Use Gun.

The men were put on the witness stand Friday and when questioned by the District Attor-

ney one of them stated the gun was taken and the three had agreed to use it if Mr. Rutledge put up a fight. Mr. Rutledge, however, was not at home when his place was robbed.

Sentence Mandatory.

The carrying of the gun made the offense first degree burglary, which carries a state prison sentence.

Prefers The Indians.

Richard Morrow, who is 26 years old, is married to an Indian and has a two-year-old child. His wife was present when he was sentenced. His mother, who resides in Mariposa, told the District Attorney her son had become associated with the Indian people several years ago and she was unable to persuade him to return to his own people. He had been living at the rancheria near Sulphur Banks.

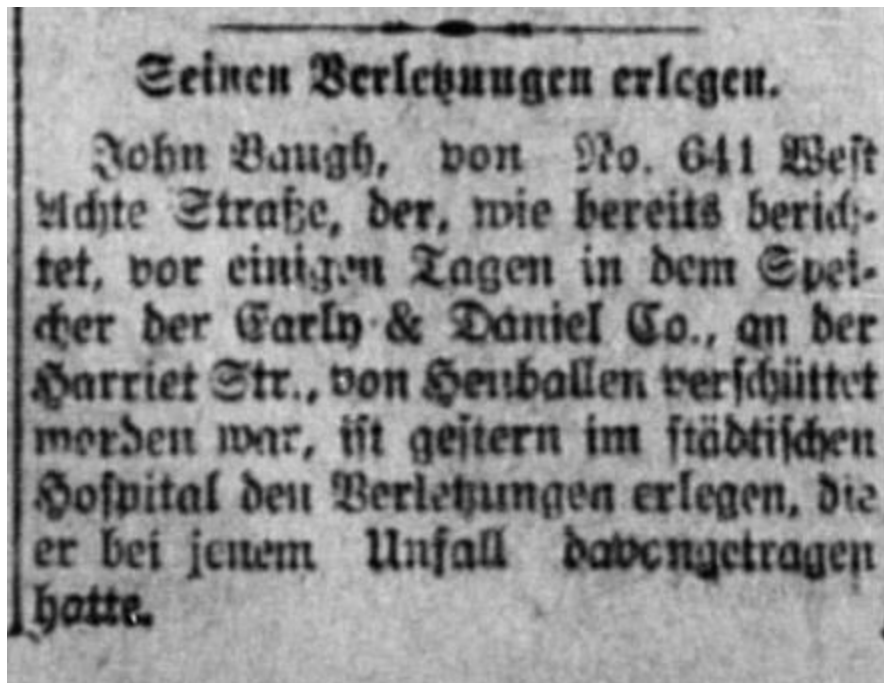

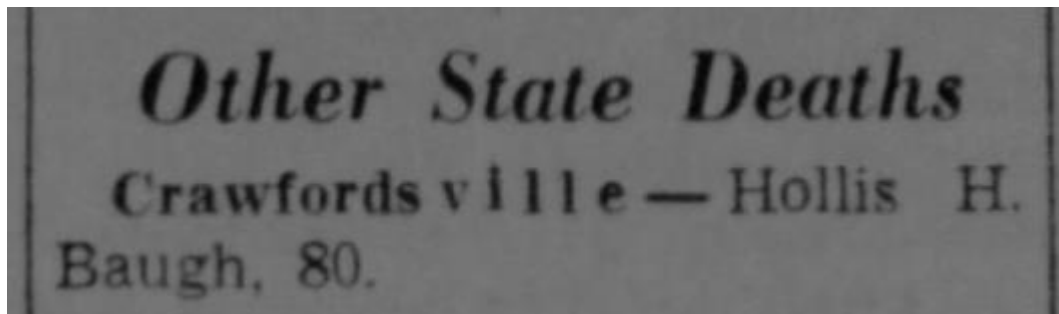

Mar 1873, farmer, lived with wife Clara Lay, 31 KY, parents b. KY, b. Nov 1868. They had been married 4 years. – Milton Perkins Lay was born 8 Mar 1873 Somerset, Pulaski KY & died 13 Jan 1953 in Toledo, Lucas OH. He was the son of Isaac T. Lay & Thankful Owens. Baugh, a conductor, Republican, residing at 382 – 31st Ave. - On his WWI draft registration (12 Sep 1918), Colonel resided at 382-31st Ave., San Francisco CA. He said he was retired; the registrar noted “total blindness.” His next-of-kin was Hollis H. Baugh of Newmarket IN. In the 1920 census (dated 9 Jan 1920) for San Francisco, San Francisco CA, line 90, Colonel Baugh, 48 KY, parents b. KY, single, with no occupation, was a lodger on Clement St. – The 1921 San Francisco CA city directory listed Colonel A.
