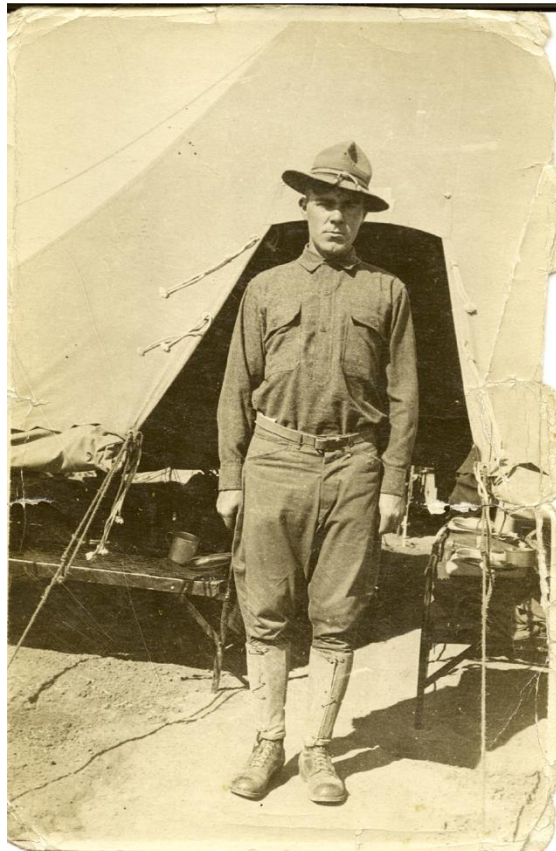

## **FALL OFF TRUCK KILLS WORLD WAR AVIATOR**

Garland, Wyo., Nov. 14.—(AP)—Alva Beall, 38, an American aviator in France during the World war, was killed late Saturday night when he fell from the seat of a truck and struck a cement wall of a bridge, near here. Beall and a party of friends were en route to Denver, after having attended the dedication here of the new American Legion hall.

In rounding a curve at the bridge approach, Beall fell from the truck, his head striking the cement wall. He was killed instantly.

## Deaver Man Dies When Truck Overturns Near Garland.

Deaver, Wyo., Nov. 13.—(Special)—A. L. Beall of Deaver, well known among the people of Deaver as Pete Beall, was killed Saturday night in an automobile accident on the highway between Garland and Powell. Early in the evening Mr. Beall left Deaver for Powell and at a point just the other side of Garland the truck in which he was riding and which was being driven by a man by the name of Duncan overturned. The full details have not been learned, but it is reported that the accident occurred at a bridge about a mile beyond Garland.

Mr. Beall was an ex-service man, a portion of his time in service being spent as airplane observer. One of his war experiences was that he was aboard a transport that was torpedoed and sunk off the coast of Scotland. Mr. Beall was in the water at this time for several hours, and was among the few men rescued.

A few months ago, since the reorganization of the Frannie division of the Shoshone project, he made application for a homestead at Deaver. He was a member of the Fred D. Griffin post of the American Legion, and he took an important part in the observance of Armistice day at Deaver last Friday. He was about 38 years old.

# BEALL'S DEATH WAS ACCIDENTAL

## Coroner's Inquest Is Held for Ex-Serv- ice Man.

Powell, Wyo., Nov. 15.—(Special)—At the coroner's inquest held here Monday a verdict of accidental death was brought in the death of Pete Beall, who was killed when he fell from a truck on the highway east of Powell early Sunday morning.

Beall was an ex-service man who had been living at Deaver, where during the last summer he was a ditch rider on the Deaver irrigation project. Funeral services are being held at Deaver in charge of the American Legion post, and the body will be shipped to his old home at Greencastle, Mo., for burial. His parents, who survive, still reside there. A brother has been living at Deaver also.

In company with Manager Duncan of the Schwendiman coal mine north of Garland, Beall started back from Powell late Saturday night. The men were riding in the cab of a truck, in the back of which Duncan's two stepdaughters, 14 and 16 years old, were riding. Some four miles east of Powell, Beall attempted to

miles east of Powell, Beall attempted to climb from the cab of the truck to the back, just as the car rounded a curve in the road. The momentum of the car threw him from the truck. He lit upon his face in the frozen road. His face, head, and neck were badly crushed, and he died in a few minutes.

It is of interest that the accident occurred just at the bad curve in the road that has been called Dead Man's curve, because of the accidents that have occurred there in the past. About a year ago three persons were killed when their car failed to make the double curve over the end of the Garland irrigation canal. The road has since been protected with heavy wire fencing but the curve is still dangerous. In the present case, however, it is apparent that the road was not the cause of the accident, but that the man's trying to move from the cab of the truck to the back while the car was moving rapidly threw him out into the road and the impact of his head with the frozen road caused death, local officials say.

### **Watch for Blackhead of Turkeys.**

[Prize Letter.]

To the Missouri Ruralist:

Many flocks of turkeys are seriously affected with what is known as blackhead, which comes on the turkey when partially or full grown. This disease quite often makes its appearance in the fall, although it is evident in August and early September also. It is an infectious disease of the intestines and liver. It is caused by a small parasite which attacks the lower bowel causing it to become thickened, enlarged and full of sores. The liver becomes spotted and covered with small, round yellow spots.

The following disinfectants are strong enough to kill spores of bacteria:

Corrosive sublimate 1 ounce in about 8 gallons of water. The water should be put in wooden tubs or barrels and the powdered sublimate added to it. The whole must be allowed to stand 24 hours so as to give the sublimate an opportunity to become dissolved. Since this solution is poisonous it should be kept covered and well guarded. It may be applied with a broom or a mop and used freely on all woodwork of the premises. All manure and other dirt should be entirely removed before the application is made. All floors should be covered with lime.

# A. L. BEALL WRITES OF THE TUSCANIA WRECK

**Greencastle Boy Says He Did  
Not Even Get Wet, but  
Lost Friends.**

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Alvin L. Beall, the Greencastle boy who was one of the survivors of the Tuscania, has written home to his parents, but he touches very briefly upon his adventures, merely stating that he did not get wet and praising the Irish hospitality. The Greencastle Journal publishes the letter as follows:

Somewhere in Ireland,

Sometime in February.

Dear Father and Mother: I will drop you a line to let you know I am safe and well and have plenty to eat. Suppose you have heard everything so will not say anything that will be censored, as this is my first attempt to write. Everything went lovely until the crash came which happened when we least expected it. I held my head although it was something fierce, and I never got wet. We are sure treated fine and are with some fine people. Ireland is some wonderful place. I sure could write a lot but will not. I just wanted to let you know everything is well with me but can't say that for some of my friends.

I will write again when I get located, as we will not be here very long. Write to all the boys as this is all I can write for some time.

With love to all. I remain,
