





William Hunt, age 26 years, who was shot Sunday afternoon by his brother-in-law, Mack Bailey, died in the Wilson hospital Monday afternoon at 3.30, and was buried Tuesday afternoon in the Reck cemetery. Rev. Karl Moore, pastor of the Baptist church here, conducted the funeral services at the Reck school house, seven miles southeast of Wilson.

BAILEY MURDER CASE TO JURORS IN RECORD TIME

Late Night Session Held To t Complete Case: Speed In Entire Trial.

BULLETIN

Deliberating less than forty minutes the jury in the case of M. A. Bailey, charged with the murder of his brother-in-iaw, last night at 11:45 returned a verdict guilty of manslaughter in the and recommended first degree that his sentence be 20 years in the state penitentiary. The case was one of the speediest murder I fals on record in the local courts.

Working at record speed, the case of M. A. Bailey, charged with the murder of William Hunt, his brotherin-law, was completed last night at a special night session and the case given to the jury. The court, presided over by Judge Asa Walden, began trial of the case yesterday at C noon. The jury was selected in record time, the sta'e exercising two of its challenges and the defense waiving all preemptory dismissals.

Presentation of evidence was in 4 progress throughout the afternoon and was competed at a night session 6 that continued until nearly 11 o'clock. t Argument by counsel started at 9 o'clock. Brevity was the feature of the counsels' statements to the ju-9 rors and every effort was made to hasten completion of the case in record time.





MOTION FOR NEW TRIAL IS FILED


M. A. Bailey, Convicted of Manslaughter, Makes Move.

M. A. Bailey, who was found guilty of manslaughter by a jury in district court Thursday night and sentenced to four years in the penitentiary, filed a motion in district court today for a new trial. The motion alleged that the court erred in several sections of the instructions, and that the jury was allowed to examine a pistol that was not introduced as evidence in the trial.


Bailey was convicted of killing his brother-in-law, William Hunt, during a quarrel believed to have arisen from family troubles. The killing occurred on a highway near Wilson last May 2.

He was tried at the fall term of court and was given a 20-year sentence but filed motion for a new trial, which was granted.



This is a difficult family to research. There are several men named Mack Bailey in the Wilson OK/Hewitt OK area. Many family trees online are erroneous. His alleged son Mackie DeRoy Bailey (1 Apr 1919 – 4 Jul 1980, both Carter Co. OK) is the son of Mack's brother, Joseph Washington Bailey.

Wartime:

Post-war:

On 2 May 1926 (although the date sometimes switches to 3 May 1926), Mack Bailey shot his brother-in-law, William Dewey Hunt, in Carter Co. OK. William died the next day (3 May 1926). This was due to "family troubles" or "domestic disturbances." Mack was originally tried for murder, although the death penalty was not part of the considerations, found guilty of manslaughter in the 1st degree & sentenced to 20 years in the state penitentiary, then at Bucklesby, Pittsburg OK, where he is incarcerated in the 1930 census. Mack appealed the original trial but the second trial, in May 1927, again found him guilty, this time of manslaughter, with a sentence of 4 years. He appealed again; in Aug 1929, the sentence was affirmed. He was paroled in Feb 1932.

Mack's name is listed in the "Tulsa (OK) World" of Sunday, 24 Jun 1934, page 9, in a lengthy list of paroled convicts, in a critical article about the liberal granting of pardons by Oklahoma Governor William Henry Murray (served 1931-1935) entitled "Oklahoma's Prison Gates Opened Wide by Governor."
