# 13 CONNECTICUT MEN WERE ON TUSCANIA

# One Hartford Man on List-Their Fate Not Yet Known.

Washington, Feb. 7. An even thirteen men from Connecticut were passengers on the transport Tuscania which was sunk by the German submarine. Up to an early hour this morning the names of only twenty of the survivors had been received by the war department out of about 2,000 who have been rescued. The names of none of the Connecticut men appear among the first twenty known survivors.

Washington, Feb. 9. A partial list received by the war department today of the survivors of the disaster which befell the transport Tuscania, carrying American troops to France, when she was torpedoed in British waters several days ago, gives the names of eight Connecticat men.

The names of thirteen Connecticut men appear on the passenger list of the Tuscania. These names were contained in the dispatch contained in this paper Friday morninf.

## SIXTY-THREE FROM THE TUSCANIA

Reported Recovering in Hospitals in Ireland.

Washington, D. C., Feb. 24.— Sixty-three American survivors of the torpedoed troop ship Tuscania were reported to the war department today as recovering in Irish hospitals from the effects of injuries or exposure. The despatch said none of the cases were serious and that it was expected all the men would be discharged.

All of the 63 had previously been reported saved, and the presence of many of them in hospitals had been recorded in press despatches, although today's despatch brought the first official list of those in hospitals. # 63 TUSCANIA SURVIVORS RECOVERING IN IRISH HOSPITALS

Washington, Feb. 24.—Sixty-three American survivors of the torpedoed troop ship Tuscania were reported to the war department today as recovering in Irish hospitals from the effects of injuries or exposure. All of the sixty-three had previously been reported saved, and the presence of many of them in hospitals had been recorded in press dispatches. Almost all of them enlisted in western states.


