Last Saturday afternoon about four o'clock Customs Inspectors Merrim and Gilmore made a big haul about 16 miles from this city. They caught Francisco Martinez and Juan M. Benavides with 25 gallons of mescal, 75 pounds of Mexican tobacco and a small quantity of other Mexican products. The men were traveling on horseback through the country. They confessed to the officers that they were taking it to San Diego to sell during the present political campaign and election. The men were both armed with Winchesters, but made no resistance and the officers seized the smuggled goods, horses, saddles and Winchesters and brought the men to this city and placed them in the county jail.


