From Samuel T. Bennett's Find A Grave record #130081638. Samuel b. 28 Jun 1859 Washington Co. MO, d. 23 Sep 1913 St. Louis MO. Buried in the Potters Field (cemetery for the poor):

Samuel Bennett was the son of Jackson Bennett and Nancy Rutledge of Liberty, Washington Co, MO. He married Susan J. Hays, d/o John Hays and Josephine Tanguier, also of Washington Co, MO. They had 4 children: Lilly, Mary, Herman and Caroline. When the youngest, Caroline was about 3 years old, her mother Susan died. Unable to care properly for his two youngest children, Herman and Caroline, Sam put them in St. Vincent's Children's Home in St. Louis and they were later adopted out. However, Samuel retained the right in Caroline's adoption papers to continue to have rights to see her and that she know him to be her father. However, her grandchildren do not believe she ever saw him again. It is unknown what happened to his two oldest daughters. They were in their teens at the time and likely married young. Although Sam and Susie lived in DeSoto, MO at the time of her death, Sam moved to St. Louis and remained there, working until the time of his death.

Mother:

Died, at De Soto, Mo., on Jan. 23, 1902, of consumption, Mrs. Susie S. Bennett, aged 32 years. She was the wife of S. T. Bennett, formerly of Potosi.





In the 1860 census for Liberty, Washington Co. MO, Jacson [sic] Bennett, age 30, b. VA, blacksmith, lives with wife Nancy (26 MO) & son Saml (age 1 MO).

In the 1870 census for Liberty, Washington Co. MO, Samuel lives with his mother Nancy & sister Eliza, listed on the same census page as his future wife, Susan Hays. His 2 younger children. Her marital status is not recorded; his father is not listed.

In the 1880 census for Liberty, Washington Co. MO, Nancy lists herself as a widow. Samuel's two younger children – Herman & Caroline – were adopted after the death of his wife in 1902. He appears to have had rare, or no, contact with them.

Buried in Potter's Field, St. Louis, St. Louis City MO.

Mother: Susan Josephine (Susie) Hays Bennett, Apr 1870 [or Jul 1870?] Liberty, Washington Co. MO – 23 Jan 1902 DeSoto, Jefferson MO [erroneously found as 1903] Daughter of John P. Hays, ca. 1817/1819 MO. He had fought in the Civil War for the Confederacy. There are several earlier marriage possibilities for John in Washington Co. MO.

Her mother was listed as Josephine Tanquer when she married her 1st husband, Elijah Bays, on 29 Oct 1850 in Washington Co. MO. Elijah had fought in the Civil War for the Union, in the 31st Infantry. In the 1880 census for Liberty, Washington Co. MO, John Hays (61 MO), farmer & miner, lived with wife Josephine (45 MO) & daughters Susan (10 MO) & Eliza (6 MO). According to her obituary, buried in Potosi, Washington Co. MO, which has numerous cemeteries.

This, however, appears to be a record for a different Mary Bennett, who crossed the Atlantic with the Bennett surname. Mary Pilley did not become a Bennett until her 1920 marriage to Herman Lee Bennett. Birthdate & place remains a question.
