TUSCANIA SURVIVORS HERE ELECT OFFICERS FOR 1959

Survivors of the sinking of the Tuscania held their annual banquet at the Fireside in La Crosse recently.

At 6 p.m. Feb. 5, 1918, the troop ship Tuscania was hit by a torpedo from the German submarine U-77. There was a loss of about 200 men, including some members of the 32nd Division, Wisconsin's National Guard unit. The British transport was carrying 2,397 officers and men bound for the battlefront in France when it was hit off the coast of Ireland.

The ship sank by 9:30 p.m. The men boarded life boats as the ship went down and were soon picked up by a British destrover.

The Tuscania survivors here elected Erick Benz, president, Nat Carhart, vice-president, and Ray March, secretary-treasurer for 1959.

At the meeting the group decided to hold its annual picnic June 21 at Lake Delton, near Baraboo.

Honorary member Clarence Brown of Galesville presided over the meeting.

The group originally formed Feb. 5, 1948. Tuscania survivors are scattered all over the country and the local group hopes to combine with other area groups to form a larger organization.
