



Elton, who lives near Marshfield; William Bell and a young man named Johnson. Also in the regiment are Sidney Bernitt and Will Curtis. Both were employed in the local postoffice. Curtis is a son of W. B. Curtis, who for years was postmaster here. Bernitt is a son of Captain Bernitt, a boat operator.



# Tuscania Victim's Body Received at Marshfield Home

Marshfield, Or., Oct. 23.—The body of Sidney Bernitt, Marshfield boy, brought from overseas, arrived here Friday morning, accompanied by his brother, William Bernitt of Portland, and Private J. J. Dahlman of the Thirty-second infantry, as escort. A public funeral will be held by the American Legion post, and burial will be here.

Bernitt was the son of Captain Bernitt, and was employed in the Marshfield postoffice when he secured leave to enter the army. He was with the troops on the Tuscania and was drowned when the vessel was torpedoed. Although several from Coos county were aboard, Bernitt was the only man from this locality lost in that disaster.

# MAY BUILD MILL In Near Future

W. G. ROBERTSON AND WM. COOPER LOOK GROUND OVER

Says Plans Will Depend on Developments in Lumber Market—Have Waterfront Site

W. G. Robertson of the Portland, Eugene, Coos Bay Townsite Co. and Wm. Cooper of Chehalis, Wash., left for the north last evening after spending a few days here inspecting sites for a small lumber mill which they are figuring on building when conditions in the lumber market warrant.

Mr. Cooper is an efficiency expert for about a dozen different mills in Washington and is greatly interested in the lumber prospects in this section.

Mr. Robertson's company has 1,306 feet of waterfront just south of the Kruse & Banks shippard which will probably be the site chosen as it will afford rail and water shipping advantages. However this remains to be determined later.

Mr. Cooper served with Mr. Robertson in the U. S. Engineers during the war and was on the Tuscania when she was torpedoed and sunk. Sidney Bernitt of Marshfield was one of the victims of the disaster. They recently received the official government report of the disaster which shows that 357 lives were lost on the Tuscania although at the time it was thought that only about 200 were lost.

## 3 Survivors Of Tuscania Recall Tragedy In 1918

Ten years ago Sunday the Tuscania was sunk in the North Channel off the coast of Ireland. Sunday evening over 1000 troops aboard the British vessel heard the thud of the torpedo as their ship was struck and heard the screams of hundreds of men who were drowned on that same night.

Of those two hundred or more who drowned, one was a Coos Bay man, Sidney Bernitt. A monument raised in his memory is today in Sunset cemetery on the Coquille highway.

Of those hundreds who were saved were John L. Doane of Marshfield, head of the Business Men's Assurance Co., in this territory; W. G. Robertson, of the Empire Development Co., at Empire, and Bill Curtis of the Ekblad Hardware store.







## Gurnea Service Set In Coos Bay Monday

Funeral services for Martha M. Gurnea, who passed away Thursday night, will be held at the Episcopal church in Coos Bay Monday at 1:30 p.m. under the direction of the DeMoss-Durdan funeral home.

The daughter of William Edward and Elise Bernitt, she was born on December 13, 1890, at Coos Bay, where she received her early education.

She was married to Harvey P. Gurnea on July 6, 1920 at Portland. The couple lived in Coos Bay until 1942 when they came to Corvallis

to make their home.

She was a member of the Good Samaritan church.

Survivors include her husband; one brother, John Bernitt, Cashmere, Wash.; one sister, Mrs. Nellie Kolm, Oakland, Calif., and numerous nieces and nephews. A brother, Sidney Bernitt, passed away during World War I.

Father: Edward William Bernitt, 25 May 1856 Neustadt, Schleswig-Holstein, Germany – 28 Aug 1919 Coos Co. OR (body found in Isthmus inlet).

Son of Friedrich Wilhelm Bernitt (1822-1846, both in Germany) & Margaretha Amalie Lisette Frehsa (b. 1823 Germany). Obituary in "Coos Bay Times" 28 Aug 1919 p. 1, but left margin of article is too deep in the fold to read. Can make out: his body was found in Isthmus inlet; appeared to have fallen off his launch "Koos" and drowned. Body was found entangled near a log boom. Expert swimmer in good health, so believed he suffered a heart

attack while pulling up anchor. Had been seen earlier by other boatmen. Survived by 2 daughters: Martha (something to do with Panama Millinery) & Mrs. Nellie Kolm (Portland), William & John (Seattle); one son died on Tuscania. Born Nystadt, Germany 25 May 1856, emigrated directly to Coos Bay (but year unreadable), raftsman all that time. Recently complained of heart issues. - "Coos Bay Times" 6 Sep 1919 p 1 – his will filed for probate, with W.C. Bernitt & Martha executors. Valued at \$10,000, mostly in Coos Bay property. Specific bequests & rest divided among his 4 surviving children: Willie Carl, John A., Martha & Mrs. Nellie Kolm. He was 1 of Coos Bay's best-known pioneer raftsmen & citizens, who drowned a few weeks ago in Isthmus inlet. - "Coos Bay Times" 9 Sep 1919 p 4 – estate of \$8,000 in real estate & \$2,000 in personal property, shared by Willie Carl, Nellie Frieda Kalm [sic], both of Portland, John August of Seattle & Martha M. of Marshfield. – Although he was found in the water, the cause of death was angina pectoris.

Buried in Sunset Memorial Park, Coos Bay, Coos OR.

OR. - Also found as Eliza Margarette and as Eliese Margaretha (on her probate records). - "Coos Bay Times" 16 Jun 1916 p 1 – Mrs. Bernitt's funeral will be held 18 Jun 1916. Sons Will & John have arrived from the north [Will is identified in a later story as from Portland] and Sidney arrives tomorrow from Globe AZ where he is employed by the US Postal Service. - "Coos Bay Times" 21 Jun 1916 p 3 – Sidney Bernitt, who was called here by the death of his mother, Mrs. E.W. Bernitt, left this morning to resume his position in the post office of Globe AZ. - "Coos Bay Times" 12 Jun 1916 p 6 – Eliza Bernitt, 60, pioneer of Coso Bay, died at the family home at 372 – 1st St. N of Bright's disease. Survived by her husband E.W. & 5 children: Mrs. Nellie Kolm (Coos Bay), William C. (Portland), John (Cashmere WA), Sidney (Globe AZ) & Martha (Coos Bay). Born 20 Jan 1856 Holstein, Germany; came to NY in 1880, two years later to Marshfield OR, married 1 year later. Buried in Sunset Memorial Park, Coos Bay, Coos OR.

Kolm was employed by the Breakwater office in Coos Bay & then was a railroad agent at Myrtle Point. For the last year he has worked in NE where the couple will live. Mr. & Mrs. William Kolm (the former Nellie Bernitt) of Schuyler NE. The couple will spend at least part of next summer on Coos Bay. "Coos Bay Times" 29 Jun 1927 p 5 - Mrs. & Mrs. William Kolm of Portland & their 3 children (Leland, Lorene, Roger) were guests of Mrs. & Mrs. Harvey Gurnea ([her sister] of North Bend OR. She was formerly Nellie Bernitt; William was once the Southern Pacific agent for the Str. Breakwater. "Coos Bay Times" 26 Jun 1939 p 2 – Mrs. William Klolm (former Nellie Bernitt) of Seattle visited friends & relatives in Coos Bay. William was at one time with the railroad & Breakwater agency on the Bay. He was recently transferred to Omaha with the Union Pacific after many years in Seattle. She will join him as soon as the children finish at the U of WA. "Coos Bay Times" 1 Mar 1955 p 3 – attending the funeral of her sister Martha: Mr. & Mrs. William Kolm, Oakland CA, just back from a 3-month trip east. William's obituary: "Oakland (CA) Tribune" 26 Jun 1956 p 32 – Funeral 26 Jun 1956 in Albany [Alameda Co.] CA on 26 Jun for William L. Kolm, 71, retired accountant, of 4553 Shafter Ave., Died 23 Jun 1956 in Salt Lake City where he was visiting his daughter, Mrs. Lorine Hanna. Also survived by wife Nellie F. - William Carl Bernitt, 21 Jun 1885 Marshfield [now called Coos Bay], Coos OR 3 Nov 1951 Seattle, King WA. Also known as Willie Carl Bernitt & Will Bernitt. Married in 1911 to Willa A. Levis (1883-1972, F: 115498078). Buried in Acacia Memorial Park & Funeral Home, Lake Forest Park, King WA. F: 115498096
- John August ("Jack"/"Whitey") Bernitt, 3 Apr 1888 Marshfield [now called Coos Bay], Coos Co. OR [3 Apr 1889 on both WWI & WWII draft cards Apr 1887 in 1900 census] 19 Apr 1970, Wenatchee, Chelan WA. Sergeant in the 644<sup>th</sup> Aero Squadron in WWI. The NOK on his WWII card is his sister, Mrs. Martha Gurnie [sic] of North Bend OR. Married in 1924 to Velma Jordan (1891-1941, F: 38542609). Buried in Cashmere Cemetery, Cashmere, Chelan WA. F: 38542621
- Martha Margaretha/Magaretha Bernitt Gurnea, 13 Dec 1890 Coos Bay, Coos OR 24 Feb 1955 Corvallis, Benton OR. First wife of Harvey Persell Gurnea (1890-1963, F: 732767), who is buried with his 2<sup>nd</sup> wife Verna Irene in Willamette National Cemetery. Martha is buried with her parents. Martha & Harvey married 6 Jul 1920 in Portland, Multnomah OR. - "Coos Bay Times" 1 Mar 1955 p 3 – Most of the surviving relatives of Mrs. Harvey (Martha) Gurnea of Corvallis were in Coos Bay 28 Feb 1955 for her funeral. Among survivors: her widower Harvey, John Bernitt of Cashmere WA. The former Martha Bernitt is from an old-time Coos Bay family. Her brother Sidney was lost on the Tuscania. The Sidney Burnitt [sic] VFW Post is named for him, but a typographical error when it was named has remained. - "Corvallis (OR) Gazette-Times" 25 Feb 1955 p 8 – Funeral for Martha M. Gurnea held 24 Feb 1955. She died in Coos Bay on 28 Feb. Daughter of William Edward & Elise Bernitt, born 13 Dec 1890 Coos Bay, where she received her early education. Married Harvey P. Gurnea 6 Jul 1920 in Portland OR. The couple lived in Coos Bay until 1942, when they moved to Corvallis. Survived by husband, brother John Bernitt (Cashmere WA) & sister Mrs. Nellie Kolm (Oakland CA). Her brother Sidney died in WWI. - "Salem Statesman Journal" 26 Jun 1963 p 15 – Harvey P. Gurnea, age 72, d. 24 Jun 1963, b. Tacoma

WA. Married Martha Bernitt, who died in Corvallis in 1955. He married Verna Siegner in 1956; she survives. He is buried in Willamette. – Martha Gurnea is buried in Sunset Memorial Park, Coos Bay, Coos OR. F: 95652834

#### Notes:

The city of Coos Bay, Oregon, was established as the city of Marshfield in 1853. Its name was changed on 11 Nov 1944.

The Veterans of Foreign Wars Post No. 1180 in Coos Bay OR named for him, but due to a typographical error when it was established, the post has remained with the name of the Sidney Burnett Post (or sometimes the Sidney Burnitt Post). It took over 2 weeks for his parents to learn of his death.

Articles cited here as from the "Coos Bay World" were often from the newspaper when it bore its earlier name, the "Coos Bay Times."
