Text submitted on 29 Jan 2024 to Find A Grave record 57041426 Herbert Christian Joseph Besner is listed as the son of Joseph Besner and Edith Elizabeth Sauil [spelling of her surname questionable].

Joseph "Betsner" married Elizabeth Sauil on 10 November 1893 in Bay City, Bay County, Michigan. His parents were Joseph Besner and Catherine Dubois (sometimes found as Woods, the English translation of Dubois). Elizabeth's parents are listed as Adam and Anna Sauil.

Herbert was apparently his mother's only child. He was born in 1889, prior to her marriage. In 1910, Herbert is found twice in the census. On 20 April 1910, Herbert C.J. Besner is a boarder in Flint, Genesee County, Michigan, age 21, born Ohio, father born Canada, mother born Michigan, a machinist in an automobile factory.

He is also enumerated on 29 Apr 1910 in Saginaw, Saginaw County, Michigan, where 21-year-old Herbert Besner, age 21, born Ohio, father born Canada, mother b. Michigan, is a laborer in an automobile factory. He lives with his parents, Joseph Besner, age 52, born

Canada, a sawyer in a saw mill, and Elizabeth Besner, age 41, born Michigan, parents born Germany. She has given birth to one child, with one living.

Herbert and his father make the news in Michigan, when, on 19 February 1911, Joseph is arrested at their home after a post-midnight scuffle with son Herbert after Joseph had arrived home. Herbert has a bullet lodged in his arm. His father claims Herbert shot at him, breaking a glass lamp. There is broken glass on the floor.

On 21 October 1915, Elizabeth Besner divorced Joseph Besner in Saginaw County, Michigan. The divorce notice includes the information that they had married 10 November 1893 in Bay City, Michigan.

Herbert Christian Joseph Besner registered on 1 June 1917 for the World War I draft. His draft registration has two addresses, one in Pontiac, Michigan, and one in Saginaw, Michigan. He is employed on a dairy farm in Pontiac, Michigan, and reports he has a dependent mother. His left arm is described as "stiff."

Herbert entered the U.S. Army on 5 November 1917 at Camp Custer, Michigan (according to Michigan WWI records) or 20 December 1917 (according to the U.S. Veterans Administration Master Index). As a corporal in Co. F, 20<sup>th</sup> Engineers, Herbert C.J. Besner sailed aboard the troopship SS "Tuscania" from New York City on 24 January 1918. On 5 February 1918, the "Tuscania" was torpedoed and sunk by German submarine UB-77 in the North Channel between Scotland and Ireland. There were 215 soldier casualties, one of them being Herbert.

Sometime between her 1915 divorce and Herbert's death, his mother had remarried, since, on the "Tuscania," he listed his mother, Mrs. E.E. Tottingham of Saginaw, Michigan, as his next-of-kin.

Herbert was among those living and dead carried by lifeboats to the isle of Islay on the western coast of Scotland after the "Tuscania" was torpedoed. He was first buried in the cemetery at Kilnaughton on Islay in grave 43, misidentified as C.M.H. Besner. His body was exhumed post-war in 1920 and was transported to the U.S. on board the ship "Antigone" which arrived in Hoboken, New Jersey, on 29 September 1920. Herbert was buried in Arlington National Cemetery in Virginia on 15 October 1920.

The Georgia death certificate of Herbert's mother, Edith Elizabeth Tottingham, indicates she was born 14 December 1867 in an unknown location. The names of her parents and their birthplaces are also unknown. She is listed as a widow, but her husband's name is unknown. Edith Tottingham, a resident of Atlanta, Georgia, died 2 October 1923 in Atlanta, Fulton County, Georgia, in Grady Hospital. She was age 56. Edith was buried in Greenwood Cemetery, Atlanta, Fulton County, Georgia.

In her last will and testament, filed 27 October 1923 in Fulton County, Georgia, Elizabeth Edith Tottingham bequeaths her real and personal property, and her dogs, to her friend, Mary Magdalene Reeves, since she attests she has no living relatives. In addition, she directs that "the insurance from the United States of America, certificate no. 293343, of my beloved son Herbert Christian Joseph Besner, taken out January 1<sup>st</sup>, 1918 and it is my will and desire that the Government whom my son served so loyally, forward each month the installment check of \$57.50 (fifty-seven dollars and fifty cents) to the said Mary Magdalene Reeves."



It is my will and desire that at the time of my death that all of my dogs which I will at the time own be taken in charge by my friend Mary Magdalene Reeves, and be put to death by a competent veterinary surgeon, that my dogs be buried in the manner in keeping with the treatment that these devoted companions have been, this I earnestly bequest my beneficiary to follow.

I hereby appoint Mary Magdalene Reeves, as my executrix of this will and I relieve her from making any inventory of my property or appraisment, or from giving any bond, and she is required only by this will to probate the will, and she is further relieved from making any returns of her acts and doings to any court whatsoever.

Find A Grave record says he was a lumberman. In Feb 1911, police are called to the Besner home. Herbert has a bullet in his arm, claiming his father shot him. The scuffle occurred after midnight on 19 Feb 1911. Joseph claimed Herbert shot a lamp out of his hand. Pieces of glass were found on the floor. Joseph was arrested; he was not talking. [Unable to locate follow-up stories.]

Parents listed as Adam & Anna Sauil on her 1893 marriage license. Could be spelled Sauel, Saal, Saul, Saeel, etc. According to the 1910 census, her parents were born in Germany. Her GA death certificate lists both her parents' names & birthplaces as "unknown." At some point her divorce from Joseph Besner on 21 Oct 1915 & Herbert's departure on Tuscania on 24 Jan 1918, she presumably married a man named Tottingham & is listed as E.E. Tottingham of Saginaw MI in 1918.

In her last will & testament, filed Oct 1923 in Fulton County GA, Edith Elizabeth Tottingham "wills her real & personal property & her dogs to friend Mary Magdalene Reeves as she has "no living relatives." She directs Mary Reeves to take care of her dogs, have them euthanized when needed by a competent veterinary surgeon & buried in a manner "in keeping with the treatment that these devoted companions have been." In Article 4, she writes: "I do especially will, in addition to all my real and personal property to my beloved friend Mary Magdalene Reeves, the insurance from the United States of America, certificate no. 293343, of my beloved son Herbert Christian Joseph Besner, taken out January 1st, 1918 and it is my will and desire that the Government whom my son served so loyally, forward each month the installment check of \$57.50 (fifty-seven dollars and fifty cents) to the said Mary Magdalene Reeves."

Her GA death certificate also states she is a widow but the name of her husband is unknown. She died of uremia, with chronic interstitial nephritis as a contributing factor. She was age 56, engaged in housework. She resided on Cambelton Rd., Atlanta GA. Buried in Greenwood Cemetery, Atlanta, Fulton GA but not on Find A Grave as of 29 Jan 2024.

#### Find A Grave:

Parents' marriage - 10 Nov 1893 - Joseph Betsner, son of Joseph Betsner & Catharine Wood, married in Bay City, Bay MI, to Elizabeth Sauil, daughter of Adam & Anna Sauil. Divorce: 21 Oct 1915 Saginaw Co. MI. Elizabeth & Joseph Besner – stated marriage date was 10 Nov 1893 in Bay City MI.

#### Pre-war:

Numerous MI newspapers carried the story, such as the "Lansing (MI) State Journal" 20 Feb 1911 p 3 – in Saginaw, "Son Wounded; Father is Held" – "Each Accuses Other of Doing Shooting in Mysterious Affair at Saginaw" – Joseph Besner, age 45, is at the central police station in Saginaw, having been arrested after shooting his son, Herbert, age 22. "The affair is very mysterious, the police being unable to determine who is to be blamed." A bullet from a .32-calibre revolver is lodged in Herbert Besner's arm, and a revolver with an empty chamber was found by police when they went to the house to investigate. Joseph came home after midnight and was "scuffling" with Herbert during which a revolver was discharged. Herbert says his father shot him. Joseph said his son shot a lamp out of his hand. Pieces of broken glass were found on the house's floor by the police. "Chief Kain endeavored to get a statement from the elder Besner but he refused to talk." When Herbert registers for the WWI draft, it is noted that he has a stiff left arm.
