



Below are the final names of the first 802 called for examination by the Board of Exemption in connection with the national army draft. This group will appear at the Courthouse for examination on next Thursday morning at 9 a.m.

Claims for discharge or exemption are required to be filed within seven days of the date your notice to appear is mailed. Note the date on your notice and file any claim inside of seven days, or it may be disregarded.

Within ten days after filing claim, any affidavit in support of it must be

filed.

The local boards have no power to exempt men as engaged in industry of importance and necessity, as farming. Such exemption is made by the district board, and may be asked for a fter the local board has completed hearing and found a man liable for service.

COUNTY QUOTA NOT FILLED; MORE MEN ARE SUMMONED

Almost 800 More Men Called to Appear for Examination

PARTIAL LIST OF MEN NOW CALLED

Those Summoned to Appear August 22, First of Three Examination Days

The examination of registered men is called out for the first draft has shown, as fully expected, that neither Stanislaus nor Merced will fill its tquota from the number called out, and that a second contingent Laist be summoned.

The second call in Stanislaus was issued at Modesto this morning, and calls out 798 men, county numbers 803 to 1600, to appear in three sections on Wednesday, Thursday and Priday, August 22, 23 and 24.

Last evening's News asserts that the first call will not even fill the first one-third of the county's quots, the men who are ordered mobilized on September 5th. Therefore prompt action was necessary to get the remaining men selected by the date of mobilization.

The names of the men summoned to appear on the first day, August 22, have been obtained by phone from Modesto, and are given below, subject to correction, as it is very difficult to be sure of proper names over a telephone wire.

TUSCANIA SAVED IS GIVEN

List of Survivors Begins to Come; Many Californians Are Reported Safe.

.WASHINGTON, Feb. 9.—Out of the war zone today came the names of hundreds of American boys saved from the torpedoed transport Tuscania, to ease the anxiety in the homes of this country. The names are now being sent across the water in a steady stream and as rapidly as possible being compiled for publication. Not until the entire list is in will the war department be able to check up and determine those who gave up their lives.



FOUR LIVES NEARLY LOST AUTOMOBILE FIRE

NEWMAN, Jan. 2.—A large automobile driven by Manuel Bettencourt, who lives between here and Turlock, was wrecked and burned late last night on the sharp turn at the Lee Moorehead ranch four miles north of Newman. Bettencourt was accompanied by his friend Louis Brazil of San Francisco, who is here on a holiday vacation and two Newman school girls, Birdie Hammers and Louise Cunha.

The car caught fire and but for prompt assistance, lives would have been lost. Brazil, who has a leg badly fractured, and Miss Hammers were able to get out, but the other pair were caught and had to be dragged out after the car was blazing.

The other three suffered only surface cuts and bruises. The car is a total loss.






