

KINGSVILLE — Lincoln Baker, 73, died July 4 in a Corpus Christi hospital. He was a retired Missouri Pacific carman who moved to Kingsville from De Quincy, La., in 1933.

Baker was a veteran of World was I, and was one of the survivors of the United States transport Tuscania, which was torpedoed in the Atlantic by a German submarine. The Tuscania sank with a loss of 522 lives. With the American Expeditionary Forces in France, Baker was in the battles of Champagne, Marne, Aisne-Mare, St. Mihiel, and the Meuse-Argonne offensive.

He is survived by his wife, Pauline; two brothers, John C. of Burleson, and C. M. of Woodward, Oklahoma; and two sisters, Mrs. Harry A. Murray at Kingsville, and Mrs. Dollie Stegall of Fort Worth.

Funeral services will be at 4 p.m. today at Cage-Piper Funeral Home in Kingsville, with the Rev. J. S. Evans of Corpus Christi, officiating, Burial will be in Baton Rouge, La.

Former Local Railroad Employee Dies In Texas

Lincoln Baker, 73, a former DeQuincy railroad employe, died July 4 in a Corpus Christi hospital. He was a resident of Kingsville, Texas. Funeral services were held Monday.

Survivors are his wife, the former Pauline Mackey, Kings-ville; two brothers and two sisters.

He was a veteran of World War I and a survivor of sinking of the SS Tuscania, torpedoed off the coast of Ireland.



Mrs. Chriss Baker, 96, widow of the engineer of one of the first trains to enter Denison, died Sunday at the home of a daughter, Mrs. A. Stegall of 1236 W. Devitt.

Both Mrs. Baker and her husband were natives of Denmark, but were married after her arrival in Denison in 1872, the year that city was established.

Mrs. Baker made her home in Denison until eight years ago when she moved to Fort Worth to make her home with Mrs. Ste-



Smallpox Death in Denison.

Miss Lula Baker, night operator at the telephone office, died Tuesday night of malignant smallpox. The deceased was about 20 years of age. She resided with her parents at No. 720 South Austin avenue. The question occurs in connection with this young lady, is vaccination a preventive of smallpox? About one year ago Miss Baker was successfully vaccinated. Two or three months ago she was a second time vaccinated. This is a case precisely the same as that of Sidney Pope, who was carried off with malignant small pox.—Denison Gazetteer.
