10 More Saved From Tuscania Are Announced

Gustav Beyer, Utica, Minn.,
Reported as Missing,
Appears on List.

NAMES GARBLED ON
CABLES YET UNKNOWN.

Roll of Soldiers on Liner
Still Unaccounted For,
Stands at 340.

James Buckley, 225 West Fifteenth street, is the only Minneapolis man still reported missing in the revised rolls of the Tuscania disaster. Albert I. Nauman, 413 East Grant street, until yesterday reported missing, was accounted for in late cables as a survivor.

(By Associated Press.)

Washington, Feb. 12.—Only 10 names were added to the roll of survivors of the Tuscania by dispatches to the War department yesterday.

The list of American soldiers who were on board the liner and who have not been reported rescued now stands at 340, although it is certain that about 200 of these and probably more are safe.

The War department last night still was trying to decipher a number of names received by cable in garbled form and a considerable addition to the list of survivors may be announced today.

Eleven names have been reported since Sunday, but one of them, John M. Shortwell of De Soto, Mo., had appeared on a list of the saved previously cabled. In many instances it is considered possible that men still recorded as unreported have succeeded in getting private messages to their families.

Pair in Row Both Shot With Same Gun

Two barroom acquaintances shot and critically wounded each other with the same gun in a downtown Minneapolis sidewalk shooting early today.

The shooting followed an altercation between the pair shortly before 1 a.m.

James L. Maynard, 23, 1423 N. Fremont Av., was shot in the right chest and Robert A. Fisher, 31, no permanent address, was shot in the stomach, police said. Both were in General hospital today in critical condition.

Police obtained slightly different versions of what happened from the two.

Maynard was found wounded in the doorway of 824 Hennepin Av. by police at 1:12 a.m. Witnesses told police that a man ran away from the scene shortly after the shooting.

When questioned at the hospital, Maynard said he met Fisher for the first time last night at Brady's bar, 6th and Hennepin.

When the bar closed the two left, intending to walk to 11th and Hennepin to get something to eat, Maynard said. As they passed 8th St. they got into an argument. Fisher tried to take from him a loaded pistol Maynard had tucked in his belt.

Maynard, who gave police no reason for carrying the loaded .22 caliber pistol, was shot during a scuffle over the gun.

About 4:30 a.m. Fisher was found in the hallway of an apartment at 20 N. 12th St., by Gustav Beyer and his wife, Caroline, who live on the second floor.

"I've been shot, call the police," Beyer heard Fisher cry.

After the argument started, Fisher said, Maynard shot first. Then Fisher grabbed the pistol and fired at Maynard, he said.

After the double shooting, Fisher said, he went to sleep in an alley behind the Hennepin-Orpheum theater for several hours. He then walked to the N. 12th St. apartment.

Police found the six-shot pistol in the hallway where Fisher dropped it. They said two shells had been expended, three live bullets were still in the chambers and one chamber was empty.

Police said Maynard had been in Minneapolis only a short time. He had two traffic citations from Akron, Ohio.

Fisher recently came from Chicago. His mother lives in north Minneapolis.

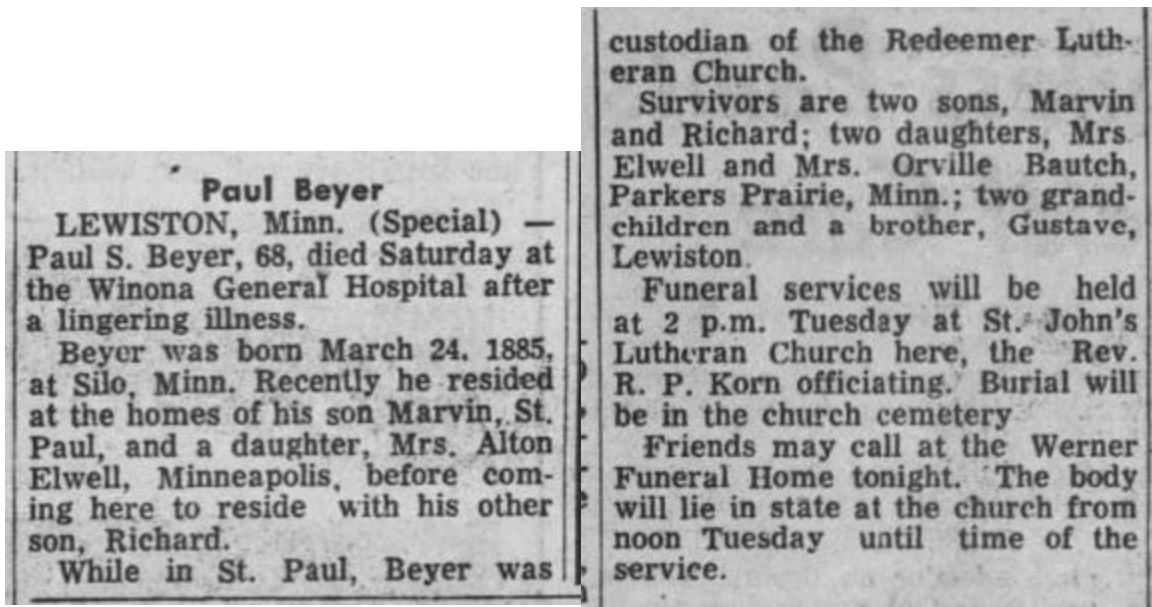
