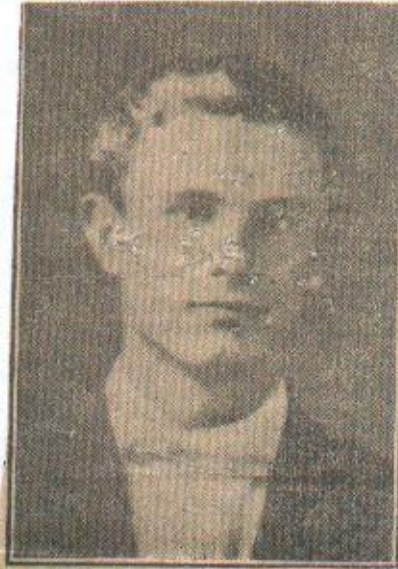

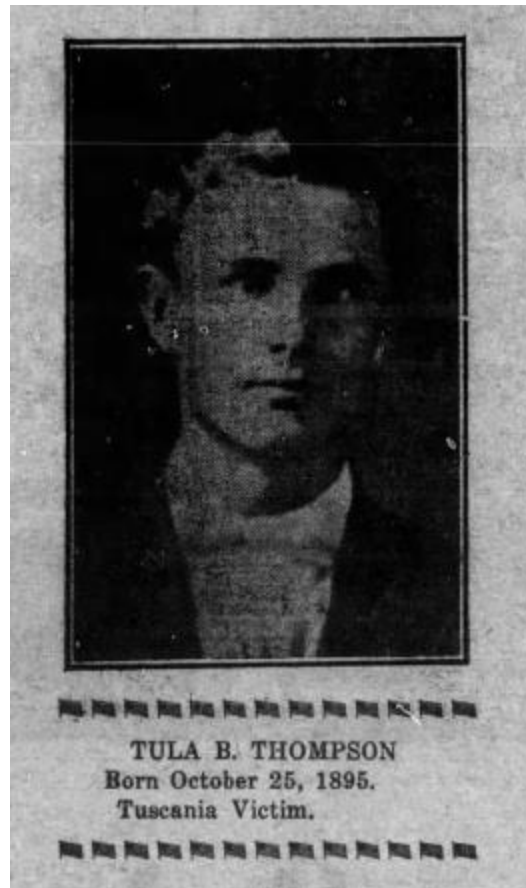

Tula B. Thompson was the son of Mr. and Mrs. J. V. Thompson of Dill. He went into the service with the contingent that left Cordell October 4, 1917. He was given a brief period of training and was among the first selected men of Oklahoma that were sent overseas.

He went down with the sinking of the transport, *Tuscania*, which was sunk by a German submarine, February 6, 1918, about 12 miles off the coast of Ireland.

He was single and 22 years of age. He made his home with his parents at Dill prior to entering the service.

# TO OBSERVE DECORATION DAY MONDAY

Graves of All War-Veterans Who Died During War or Since Will Be Decorated Next Monday.

The Legion boys of the Cordell Post have planned a big program and down town parade for next Monday morning, May 30th, and will fully observe decoration day. All the Civil war, Confederate, Spanish-American and World war veterans are requested to meet at the Legion hall at 10:30 prompt in order that all may go together to the services and program at the Baptist church. All of the World war veterans are asked to be dressed in the O. D. Blouse, Regulation trousers and leggins for this occasion. The children are to meet at the Court House square at 10:30 A. M. when the parade will be formed.

Up to this time only a few names of the deceased war veterans have been received by the Post here and assistance along this line will be very much appreciated by the boys as they do not want to miss a single soldier's grave.

The Legion boys of Cordell also report that they have sent money to National headquarters in order to have all the graves of our buddies of Washita county decorated on May 30th, Decoration Day.

The program which has been prepared will be held at the Baptist church at 11 o'clock and will be as follows:

## 123 ENTRAIN FOR CAMP TRAVIS TODAY

Washita County's Contingent Given  
Lively Reception Before Leaving  
for Training at Army Camp.

One hundred twenty-three men leave this evening by special train as Washita county's contingent to the training camp at Camp Travis, San Antonio, Texas, to become members of the national army of the United States. They are in command of one of their number for the trip.

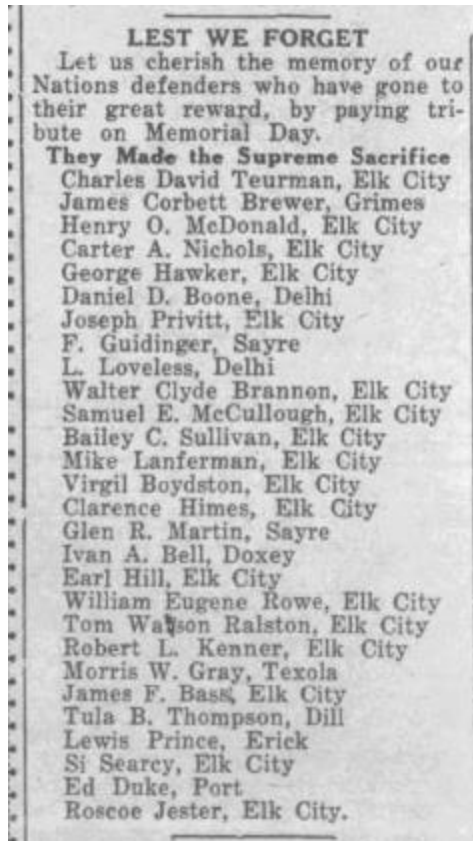
The men were honored this afternoon by a general program for their benefit. A parade was formed, headed by the members of the contingent, the Cordell band and the Boy Scouts, and followed by the children of the city schools. The band furnished music following the parade and addresses to the boys were scheduled by Attorneys Beets, Burnette and Billups and by Bob Harvey, mayor of Cordell and chairman of the local board for Washita county. It was intended to have S. P. Freeling, attorney general of the state of Oklahoma, here to make an address but he could not come, and it was impossible to get any one else of state-wide reputation to address the boys, although an effort to get them was made.

Wars can't be fought and all the participants be returned to their homes and loved ones. Ours, like all other American communities shared the losses from killed in action and deaths from disease in hospitals.

The following list is as near correct as I have been able to ascertain of boys who enlisted from the Elk City vicinity and never returned:

Killed in action: James F. Bass, Ellis R. (Si) Searcy.

Died at sea, victim of German torpedo: Tufa B. Thompson.

Died of disease in hospitals:

Charles D. Teurman, George G. Hawker, Sam E. McCullough, William Eugene Rowe, Carter A. Nichols, Walter Clyde Brannon.

There may have been others who made the supreme sacrifice. We honor the memory of every one of these brave boys who "Placed all in the scales of war and lost all save honor."

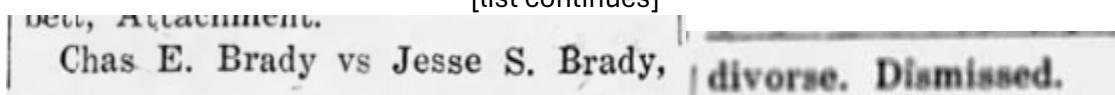

Lack of documentation on Jessie. Her marriage to Tula B. Thompson is based on online family tree information. Tula reported he was single on his 5 Jun 1917 draft registration. His Veterans Administration Military Index card reports his address is Marion KS – which agrees with Jessie's data for the time period.

Newspaper articles show Jessie was listed at this time period as "Miss Jessie Swehla." She is listed in newspapers as Jessie Swehla when she obtains a marriage license & marries Charles Elmer Brady in Marion, Marion KS on 8 Oct 1919. He is a resident of Peabody KS & she of Marion KS at the time. Charles Elmer Brady was born 25 Mar 1898 in Grenola, Elk KS & died 4 Dec 1965. He is buried in Memorial Lawn Cemetery, Arkansas City, Cowley KS, F: 43791277.

In the 1920 census for Peabody, Marion KS, C.E. Brady (21 KS), father b. MO, mother b. IA, a laborer, tool dresser, lives with his wife Jesse (23 IA, parents b. IA). This census is conducted 28/29 Jan 1920.

So – between the end of January, Jessie is supposed to have married William Razor & died in California at the end of March.

Buried in Marion Cemetery, Marion, Marion KS. Tombstone reads: Jessie Swehla Razor. Spouse Find A Grave: 132590968 & 65937890. Birth & death dates differ on records. The latter record indicates she was married to Tula B. Thompson & they had a daughter, then married to Charles Brady, then to William Razor. as death date of 18 Mar 1920

Freestone Co TX 25 Oct 1895, came with parents to OK in 1911. Only son, mainstay of aged parents. His father was injured in a car accident over a year ago & is unable to work so Tula farmed & was making a success of it, liking the work. While in the Army, he sent home all but \$5 of his wages to his parents. Kind & considerate to all, a "noble son and brother." Survived by 2 sisters Mrs. E.E. Hefner of Elk City & Mrs. E.W. Morris of Dill. Enlisted 4 Oct 1917, a private at Camp Travis. Was hard of hearing so he expected to fail the physical exam so he had made no arrangements for a replacement on the farm.
