## Tramontas, Kiriakos (Charles) 1888 Greece – 1961 CA

### Charles Tramontanas

LODI, Jan. 6—Charles Kiriakos Tramontanas, 72, of 500 E. Pine, who lived in Lodi the past 21 years, died this morning in a local hospital after a short illness.

A shoemaker, he assisted his son, Gus, in the operation of the Economy Shoe Repair Shop, 10 W. Oak.

A native of the Isle of Samos, Greece, he came to this country 45 years ago and settled in Eureka. He moved to Lodi in 1939.

Mr. Tramontanas was a member of St. Basil's Greek Orthodox Church, Stockton. He was a U.S. Army veteran of World War I.

In addition to his son, Gus, he leaves his wife, Rose, also of Lodi; three daughters, Mrs. Theodora Halkias of San Francisco; Mrs. Vassie Manolakis of Lodi; and Mrs. Katherine Kokonas of Stockton; a brother, William Tramontanas of San Francisco; and six grandchildren.

Funeral services will be conducted at 1:30 p.m. Monday in the chapel of the Lodi Funeral Home with the Rev. Theodore Phillips of St. Basil's Church officiating.

A Trisayion, or rosary, will be recited at 7:30 p.m. Sunday in the funeral chapel. Interment will be in Cherokee Memorial Park.

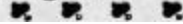
## Stork Shower Honors

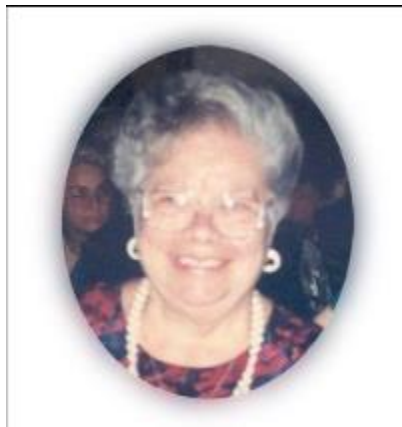



#### Notes:

Researching Kiriakos was complicated by the spelling variations of his first name & surname.

Kiriakos's 1<sup>st</sup> child – son Gus – was born in Samos, Greece, in 1915. In the 1920 census for Anderson, Mendocino CA, Kiriakos said he had emigrated in 1915.

Kiriakos was in the US in Jun 1917 when he registered for the WWI draft (indicating he had a wife & 1 child), served in the US Army and resided in Mendocino County CA in the 1920 census.

His US Veterans Administration Master Index card lists him as a resident of Samos, Greece, where his 3 daughters were born – Theodore (Teddie) in Jul 1922, Vasillia (Billie) in Jan 1924 & Katherine (Kay) in Feb 1927.

In a 1950 newspaper article, when asked why he did not make a trip home to his native Greece, Kiriakos said when he had done that the last time, he was conscripted into the Greek army and made to fight against the Turks. It is unclear from the story if he was among the Greek troops that had to be rescued from Turkey by Japanese ships. He does claim to have served as a private in the Greek Army for half a year on his WWI draft card.

Kiriakos had sailed to the US from Piraeus, Greece, departing 12 Jul 1926 & arriving in Providence RI on 31 Jul 1926 aboard the “Asia” and heading to Peabody MA. This would indicate that his wife Triandafilio (Rose) was a few months pregnant with Katherine when he left Greece. Son Gus was not on the manifest page with him.

Rose & his 3 daughters came to the US in 1930, and all reports indicate that Kiriakos & Gus were in the US awaiting their arrival.
