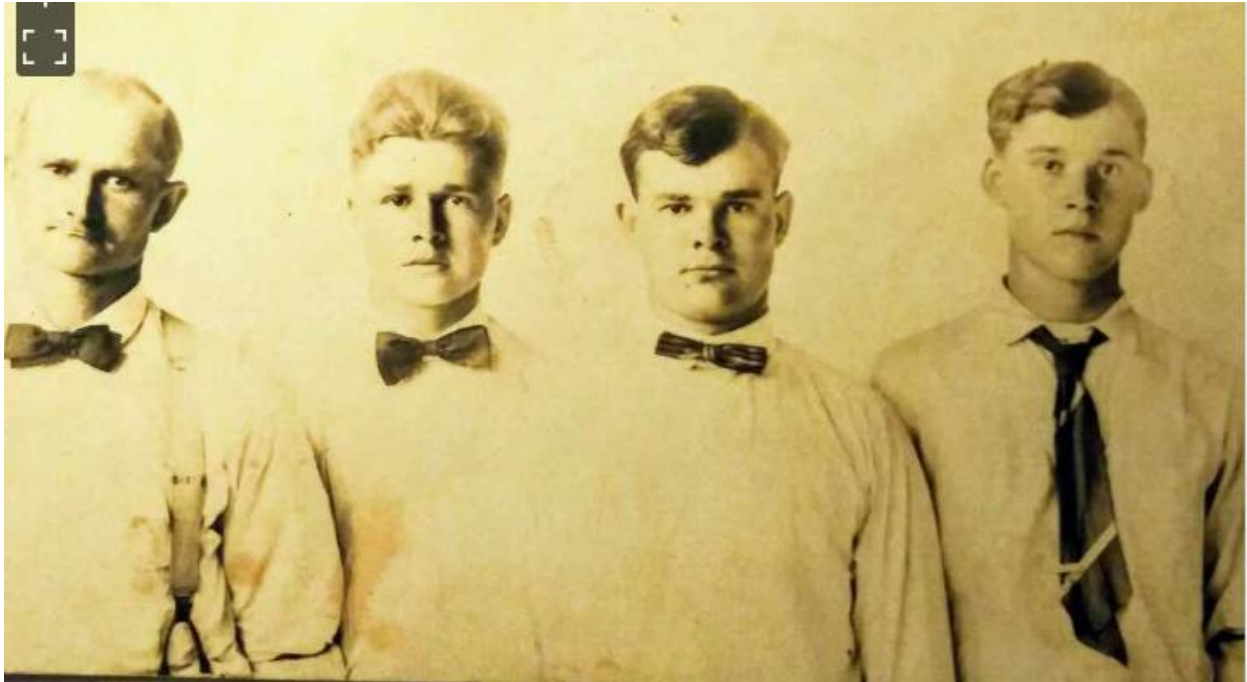

TROWBRIDGE — Daniel W. Trowbridge was born August 28, 1890, at Osage City, and lost his life February 6th, 1918, on the *Tuscania*, which was torpedoed by a German submarine off the coast of Ireland. His early life was mostly spent in Osage City up until he was 16 years of age. He then moved to Texas and had made his home in Oklahoma and Texas until he was called for service last September. Since that time he has been in training at Camp Travis in Texas.

At an early age he united with the Church of Christ at Strawn, Texas. He leaves to mourn his loss a father, Peter Thowbridge, of Strawn, Texas, and five sisters and three brothers, Mrs. W. E. Romine and Mrs. G. W. Romine, both of Osage City, Mrs. L. S. Private of Barclay, Kans., Mrs. I. S. Burgner of Dewar, Okla., Mrs. E. B. Brackeen of Gunter, Texas, and James L. Trowbridge and William I. Trowbridge of Osage City and Jesse L. Trowbridge of Barclay, Kansas.

His mother preceded him in death fourteen years ago. Besides these he leaves many other relatives and a host of friends.

He was of a loving disposition and was loved by all who knew him. He was 28 years, 4 months and a few days old and was buried in Scotland with many others of the *Tuscania* soldiers who were on their way to France.

BODY ARRIVES FROM OVERSEAS

Private Daniel Trowbridge was born in Osage City, Kansas, August 28, 1890, and was drowned February 5, 1918, on the Tuscania, enroute to Scotland and France with the American troops, at the age of 28 years. The remains arrived from overseas Tuesday afternoon. Military services were held Wednesday, Sept. 15, at 2:30 o'clock at the Osage City cemetery, in charge of the Robert Heizer Post, No. 198, American Legion. Rev. L. F. Waring of the Methodist church gave a short, but impressive talk.

Daniel Trowbridge was born and raised in Osage City and spent the greater part of his life here. After the death of his parents, he lived in Oklahoma and from there he enlisted. He leaves to mourn his loss a number of relatives and many friends.

5,000 PAY HOMAGE TO TEXAS HEROES

Gather at Strawn and Con-
duct Memorial for Men
Lost With Tuscania.

Special to The Record.

STRAWN, Feb. 24.—Five thousand persons gathered from neighboring towns under the stars and stripes here today in a memorial service for Daniel W. Trowbridge and El. L. Edmondson, Strawn youths, lost with the ill-fated Tuscania Feb. 5, when that transport, bearing American soldiers to Europe, was torpedoed by a German submarine.

The services were conducted under the auspices of the southern Palo Pinto county chapter of the American Red Cross. A large parade was formed, led by the Thurber and Strawn brass bands, followed by some 500 school children, women members of the Red Cross, and representatives of the Polish and Italian societies of this city.

The opening address was given by Douglass Smythe of Strawn, after several patriotic hymns. Hon. John W. Weaver delivered the address of the afternoon. He was followed by Percy Smith and S. E. Miller of Mineral Wells. A duet was given by Misses Oma Link and Eva Owen.

A silent prayer was engaged in, after which the bands played "The Star-Spangled Banner."

TROWBRIDGE— Peter Trowbridge was born Nov. 28, 1854, at Palmyra, Ind., and died Jan. 27, 1920, at Strawn, Texas, age 65 years, 1 month and 29 days. He obeyed the gospel call at the age of 17 years and was a loyal Christian until the date of his death. He was married to Amanda Voyls on Nov. 12, 1875, and to this union were born 9 children, five girls and four boys; eight of whom are still living. The wife preceded him 15 years ago and one son lost his life on the Tusana. Mr. Trowbridge was a kind-hearted man always ready and willing to help those in need. He was a member of the Church of Christ at Strawn, Texas, where he lived for nearly 15 years. He has two sons and two daughters living at Strawn and three daughters and one son living at Osage City, Kansas, where the remains were shipped for interment in the North cemetery beside the body of his wife. "We have hopes that our loss is his gain."

SWEETWATER — Funeral for James L. Trowbridge, 81, retired carpenter, was to be held at 4 p.m. Tuesday in the Lamar St. Church of Christ with Abe Lincoln of Midland and Paul Rogers of Sweetwater officiating.

Mr. Trowbridge, a local resident for 36 years, died Monday afternoon at his home.

Born June 19, 1881, in Pleasanton, Kan., he married Minnie Hurst in Osage City, Kan., Jan. 25, 1906. They moved to Strawn in 1918 and to Sweetwater in 1926.

"Osage City Free Press" (Osage City KS) 19 Feb 1918 p 8 - Daniel W. Trowbridge, b. 28 Aug 1890 Osage City KS, spent most of early life in Osage City until he was 16 years old. Then he moved to TX & lived in OK & TX until called for service Sep 1917. Did training at Camp Travis TX. At an early age, he united with the Church of Christ at Strawn TX. Survived by father Peter (Strawn TX) & 5 sisters: Mrs. W.E. Romine & Mrs. G.W. Romine (Osage City), Mrs. L.S. Private (Barclay KS), Mrs. I.S. Burgner (Dewar OK), Mrs. E.B. Bracken (Gunter TX) & 3 brothers: James L. & William I. (Osage City) & Jesse L. (Barclay KS). His mother died 14 years ago. "He was of a loving disposition and was loved by all who knew him." Died at age 28 years, 4 months, a few days. Buried in Scotland.

Military services were held 15 Sep 1920 at Osage City Cemetery by the American Legion. Daniel was born & raised in Osage City KS where he lived the majority of his life. He moved to OK after his parents died [note: his father was alive in 1918] & he enlisted there.
