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



GIVES DETAILS OF DEATH OF PHOEBUS MAN DURING WAR

Mrs. Bernard L. Tullington Receives Letter Showing Her Husband Died a Real Hero. Mrs. Bernard L. Tullington, of Phoebus, has received a letter giving her some of the details surrounding the death of her husband. Mr. Tullington went down on the steamer Tuscania, while he was going to France with his aero squadron. The letter was received a few days ago from a lady in Michigan, and is as follows:

"According to William Weigler's story their squadron was ordered up on deck, near the life boats, and they were all standing around talking and wondering why they had been ordered up there, for it was cold and they did not know that they were in the danger zone. But while they were talking the torpedo struck the boat, and their lieutenant called for 20 volunteers to go up and take down the life boats and 10 volunteered. Your husband and our nephew were two of the 10 volunteers, for the boats were up high and the ship tipped to one side, and it was a very dangerous deed to do. Only two men were ordered into each boat, one at each end to work the tackle as the boat was lowered to the water. Then they were filled with men from the decks. William says the last he saw of Clyde and Bernard Tullington they were lowering one of those life boats, when the ropes or tackle that held the boat at each end broke with a jerk at one end and threw them into the water several feet below, and the last sight he had of them they were struggling in the water.

"Of course the tackle must have been old and rotten and it certainly was negligence of the government inspectors that the tackle should have been rotten, when our dear boys' lives depended on it.

"It seems like a terrible crime that certainly could have been prevented, but what can anyone do, nothing, and we could not bring the dear boys back, if we would. "We can only be proud of the memory of their bravery and you can teach your little children to be proud of their brave father, who gave up his life for his country. "You and your children and Mr. Tullington's brothers and sisters certainly have our most sincere sympathy and if there is anything further that you would like to know, perhaps I may be able to tell you. For I have probably heard other details that I do not recall just now."

Phoebus, Va., July 12.—Capt. Robert Tullington died suddenly of heart failure at his home, at 10 o'clock Wednesday night.

He had attended to business during the day and seemed in usual health.

Born March 22, 1840, and was aged 67 years, three months and eighteen days at death.

On June 19, 1861, he married Miss Eliza Stanworth. His children are: Mrs. Sarah E. Fuller, Mrs. Ida Hedgepeth, Mrs. Julia Brown and Charlie and Bernard Tullington.

The funeral was conducted by Rev. J. W. Stallings at 3 p. m. today, at the residence.

The remains were laid to rest in Oakland cemetery, by the side of his daughter, Mrs. Anna Horn, who died some years ago.

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MRS. TOELLE DIES AT HOME

Mrs. Ida May Toelle, 70, died at 2:45 yesterday afternoon at her home, 25 Poplar avenue, after a short illness.

Although it is clearly the same Bernard Tullington who marries India Hayes & Margaret Merz, some questions remain about divorces. He lists neither wife as his WWI next-of-kin but gives the name of his sister, Julia Tullington Brown. It is apparently India Tullington & her children who get a sympathy letter from one of his comrades after Tuscania sinks.

Pre-war:

Was serving in the US Army by the year 1900 with the name Bunnard L. Tullington. He continued to enlist in the Army as Bunnard until 1912, when he enlists in the US Marine Corps with the name Bernard L. Tullington.

Wartime:

"Newport Daily News" (Newport News VA) 26 Nov 1919 p 7 - Mrs. Bernard Tullington of Phoebus VA got a letter from a woman in MI about her husband's last moments, with information taken from a letter written to the MI resident by William Weigler (i.e. William W. Wingler, 158th Aero Squadron). Wingler said the unit had been called to the deck by the

lifeboats & were standing around asking why they were waiting when it was so cold, when the torpedo hit. Wingler said a lieutenant asked for 20 volunteers & got 10, among them Tullington & the MI woman's nephew Clyde (likely Clyde Pelley of the 158th), to launch lifeboats, 2 men per boat. "Your husband" and her nephew Clyde got in the boat. Because of the ship's list, the lifeboats were up high. When the rope broke, they were thrown in the water & last seen struggling in the water. Blames the rotten rope [may have been launching technique].
