

John Bloomer, 72, dies in Alabama

MOBILE, Ala. — Wabash, Ind., native John W. Bloomer, 72, a former editor of the Birmingham News who helped a Georgia newspaper win a Pulitzer Prize in the 1950s, died yesterday after becoming ill on a business trip.

Bloomer had a lengthy career in journalism, working for newspapers in Indiana, Tennessee, Florida, Virginia, Mississippi and Georgia.

Bloomer died during surgery at Mobile Infirmary. He was hospitalized Wednesday night, apparently suffering an aneurysm.

A friend, A. J. Washington, said Bloomer was in Mobile in connection with his work as editor of Caribbean Magazine.

He was managing editor of the Columbus (Ga.) Ledger and Enquirer when it won a Pulitzer Price for meritorious public service in exposing crime and corruption in Phenix City, Ala.

"Muskogee (OK) Daily Phoenix & Times-Democrat 8 May 1957 p 7 Mrs. Lula McClelland, 77, a widow, began her romance on a sidewalk bench in St. Petersburg FL. One-and-a-half years later, her romance & life savings were gone.

She lodged a petition in federal court in Muskogee OK on 7 May 1957 against Samuel J. Tullos, who first brought romance & then disaster to her life. The petition is also against his two brothers & his former wife.

The suit alleges that Samuel, his brothers James A. and B.H. Tullos, and his divorced wife Alice Tullos of Kiowa OK conspired and "mulcted" her of \$53,204. The Tulloses live in Atoka County OK. She sued them for that sum plus \$100,000 in punitive damages.

Lula claims she met Samuel while sunning herself on the beach. He told her he was a lonely widower. After other meetings he told her he loved her and wanted to marry her. He set January 1955 for a wedding, but he knew he was still married to Alice J. Tullos of Kiowa OK.

In December 1954 Sam borrowed money from Lula saying he wanted to visit his 96-year-old father and to buy a car for their trips after their marriage. Early in 1955 Sam admitted he was married "but said that in effect it was not a real marriage."

She gave \$25,000 to Sam's brother B.H. [Bell Houston] Tullos, who said it was needed for witnesses & affidavits for Sam's divorce from Alice.

Although the formal divorce decree of Alice and Samuel did not occur until 11 November 1955 at Atoka, Sam took Lula to Valdosta GA for a marriage ceremony there 20 May 1955.

On 11 June 1955, Sam said since Lula's name was no longer McClelland, she should transfer her savings to a joint savings account. Between 8 June 1955 and 22 July 1955, he withdrew \$39,050 and also received other money from Lula.

Sam took Lula to a hotel at Hot Springs AR, arriving there 19 November 1955. His two brothers arrived the next day. After a "huddle" of the brothers, James Tullos told Lula he was "terribly worried" that Samuel had lost all her money in a poker game in Tulsa OK [other reports say a dice game or craps game] after "millionaires" got him drunk. James tried to leave Lula at Hot Springs and return to Atoka, but she did not believe the poker game story & persuaded them to take her along. At Atoka, she tried to enter a bank, but was forcibly restrained by Samuel, who said he & Alice had an account there.

James left for Kiowa, and Sam and brother B.H. took her to Hot Springs & put her on a bus to her home in St. Petersburg FL – "old, penniless and disillusioned."

Lula said Sam was also courting Mary Dwyer at the same time in St. Petersburg. He gave Mary a "cheap wedding ring" and she gave him \$1,900.

"Muskogee Times-Democrat" 21 June 1957 p 2 – attorneys in federal court on 21 June 1957 asked the judge to dismiss the suit of Mrs. Lula McClelland. In this story, Sam loses his money in a dice game. Lula said Sam told her that he & Alice were never really married. The Tullos attorneys said the case should have been settled in a Florida court when she divorced Tullos. They also argued that the federal court has no jurisdiction in the case. In Florida, she could not testify against Sam because they were married at the time.

No resolution of this situation could be located.


