



# Faith In Men Gone With \$53,204 Life Savings, Widow Tells Court

Romance, deceit and fraud have left Mrs. Lula McClelland Tullos of St. Petersburg, Florida, a lonely and disillusioned old woman, her faith in the man who married her gone and her life savings—\$53,204—gone with her faith, she complained to the Federal Court here Tuesday.

Mrs. Tullos, who is 77 years old, sued Samuel J. Tullos; his two brothers, B. H. and James A. Tullos, and Samuel Tullos' wife, all of Atoka County, for this money plus \$100,000, alleging they conspired with Samuel to mulct her of her savings in a dubious marriage scheme.

Samuel Tullos struck up an acquaintance with her about three years ago while she was sunning herself on a park bench at St. Petersburg, she said. He told her, she said, he was a widower and lonely. Their friendship ripened, she said, and eventually he promised to marry her in January, 1955,

although "well knowing at the time he was married to . . . Alice J. Tullos" of Kiowa.

Her story, outlined in her petition to the court:

In December, 1954, he borrowed money, saying it was for a visit to his 96-year-old father and to buy a car which he told her he (Samuel) and she would use for trips when married.

Early in 1955, he admitted he already was married — to Alice J. Tullos—but told her the marriage never had been "real."

She let him have \$2,500 on his representations that it would be used to pay witnesses and obtain affidavits for a divorce at Atoka.

The divorce decree was granted November 11, 1955.

Meantime, May 20, 1955, Samuel took Mrs. McClelland to Valdosta, Georgia, before the decree had become final and went through a

marriage ceremony with her.

June 11, 1955, Tullos told her that as her name no longer was McClelland, she should deposit her savings in a joint checking account.

Between June 8, 1955, and July 22, 1955, he withdrew \$39,050 from the account and also obtained other money from her.

Finally after her savings were exhausted he took her to a hotel at Hot Springs, Arkansas, November 19, 1955.

Samuel's brothers, James and B. H. Tullos, were there. The brothers went into a huddle and then James told her money had been lost in a poker game at Tulsa.

The brothers tried to leave her at Hot Springs, but she insisted on going with them to Atoka.

There she attempted to follow Samuel into a bank, but forcibly (Please see WIDOW on page 2)

## Widow, 77, Says Life Savings Cheated From Her By Quartet

On a sunny April day in 1934 romance came to Mrs. Lula McClelland, 77 and a widow, on a sidewalk bench at St. Petersburg, Florida.

A year and a half later it was gone and with it her life savings.

So Mrs. McClelland, or if you prefer, Mrs. Tullos complained in a petition she lodged in Federal Court here Tuesday against Samuel J. Tullos, who she said brought romance and then disaster, and his two brothers and former wife.

### Conspiracy Alleged

Mrs. Tullos alleged that Tullos, the brothers, James A. Tullos and B. H. Tullos, and Samuel Tullos' divorced wife, Alice Tullos of Kiowa, conspired to take advantage of her lapse into romance and mulcted her of \$53,204. The Tulloses live in Atoka County.

She sued them for this amount, plus \$100,000 punitive damages.

She met Samuel Tullos while sunning herself on the bench that fateful April day.

He told her he was a lonely widower and after other meetings that he loved and wanted to marry her, she said. January, 1935, she said, was set for the marriage, although, she added bitterly he well knew "at the time he was married to—Alice J. Tullos" of Kiowa.

Her story, as she told it in her petition:


Tullos, argued that the Federal Court here lacked jurisdiction of the case.

In December 1954 Sam borrowed money from Lula saying he wanted to visit his 96-year-old father and to buy a car for their trips after their marriage. Early in 1955 Sam admitted he was married “but said that in effect it was not a real marriage.”

She gave \$25,000 to Sam’s brother B.H. [Bell Houston] Tullos, who said it was needed for witnesses & affidavits for Sam’s divorce from Alice.

Although the formal divorce decree of Alice and Samuel did not occur until 11 November 1955 at Atoka, Sam took Lula to Valdosta GA for a marriage ceremony there 20 May 1955.

After a “huddle” of the brothers, James Tullos told Lula he was “terribly worried” that Samuel had lost all her money in a poker game in Tulsa OK [other reports say a dice game or craps game] after “millionaires” got him drunk. James tried to leave Lula at Hot Springs and return to Atoka, but she did not believe the poker game story & persuaded them to take her along. At Atoka, she tried to enter a bank, but was forcibly restrained by Samuel, who said he & Alice had an account there.

James left for Kiowa, and Sam and brother B.H. took her to Hot Springs & put her on a bus to her home in St. Petersburg FL – “old, penniless and disillusioned.”

Lula said Sam was also courting Mary Dwyer at the same time in St. Petersburg. He gave Mary a “cheap wedding ring” and she gave him \$1,900.

They also argued that the federal court has no jurisdiction in the case. In Florida, she could not testify against Sam because they were married at the time.
