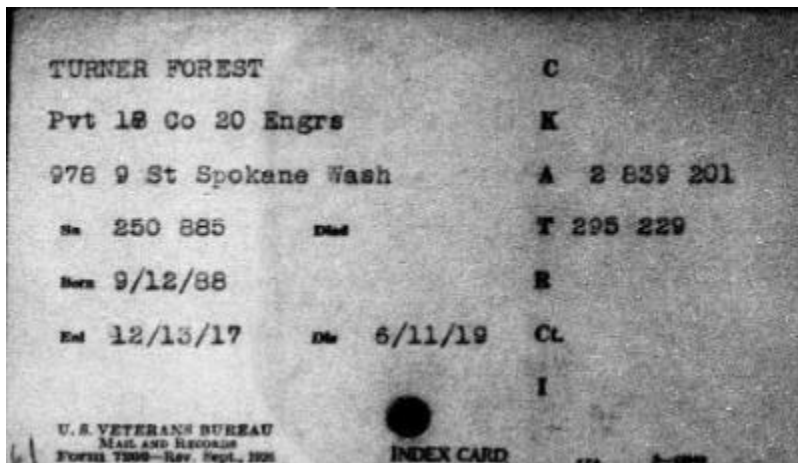

DIES OF ACCIDENT INJURIES

Forrest Turner, World War Veteran, Succumbs at Lewiston.

LEWISTON, Idaho, Oct. 28.—Forrest Turner died yesterday at St. Joseph's hospital from injuries received Saturday in a planing mill at Kooskia. He was brought here and operated on Tuesday. Mr. Turner was on the Tuscania when it sank, en route to France with his company. Since the war he and his brother, Wilmot Turner, have been operating the mill at Kooskia. The boys are the sons of the late Frank Turner, pioneer of this section. Besides his brother, Mr. Turner is survived by his mother and a sister, both residing in Clarkston.

SURVIVOR OF TUSCANIA DIES AT LEWISTON

Wednesday morning, by long-distance, the sad news of the death at St. Joseph hospital, Lewiston, of her nephew, Forest P. Turner, of Kooskia, was received by Mrs. S. Day.

The young man and his brother were proprietors of the Turner Bros'. saw mill, a few miles above Kooskia. On October 16, he had the misfortune to have his left foot caught and mangled in the planer.

The family physician was hastily called and dressed the wound and advised he be taken to a hospital. On arrival at St. Joseph's it was thought there was a chance to save the injured member but on October 25 it was realized that the foot would have to be amputated. He did not rally from the operation, passing away Tuesday evening at 10 o'clock.

He was about 31 years of age and is

survived by his mother and sister who were with him, and three brothers.

He enlisted in the Twentieth Engine

ers of the A. E. F. in 1917 and was a survivor of the ill-fated Tuscania. Returning from France, early in the summer he resumed business with his brother. The body will be taken to the home and laid to rest beside his father, who passed away in 1916.

KOOSKIA BOYS SAFE

Kooskia Mountaineer: A cablegram received by the Mountaineer is to the effect that Jack Parsall, Rex Orser, Forest Turner, Ivan Griffith and R. J. Clemens are safe. The boys were on board the Tuscania, which was sunk off the coast of Ireland by a submarine and it was feared that they had been drowned when the transport sank. All the boys with the exception of Ivan Griffith and Rex Orser escaped without injury, and Rex and Ivan incurred only slight wounds. The message did not give the boys' location.

A telephone message received Tuesday from Kooskia by George D. Smith announced the death that day of Frank B. Turner, of Kupro postoffice above Kooskia. Deceased was a brother of Jack Turner, formerly of this place, Mrs. Lone Day residing here, and Dr. Turner of Cottonwood. He was a pioneer homesteader of this section, and was the oldest of the family. The funeral, it was stated would take place Thursday.

CLEARWATER PIONEER DEAD.

Frank P. Turner, one among the oldest settlers of upper Clearwater sections, died Tuesday evening at 7 p. m., at his home on the Middle Fork about seven miles above Kooskia. Death came as the result of Brights disease after several months suffering. He leaves a family consisting of a wife, four sons and one girl, nearly all grown. Interment will take place today at two o'clock in the family cemetery near the home. Mr. Turner was about sixty years of age and had been a resident of the Kooskia section a long period of years, building up a beautiful home where he passed away. Mr. Turner at one time published the Alta Area, the first newspaper in the upper Clearwater country, also being a civil engineer, this occupation he followed several years. The deceased circle of friends was large and the sympathy of an entire community goes out to the family in their bereavement.—Kooskia Mountaineer.

GAS BLAMED FOR TRAGIC DEATH OF 2

Police Find Mrs. Ella Turner and Nurse Asphyxiated; Investigate

Workmen continued digging Wednesday afternoon in their efforts to locate a probable break in a gas main which is believed responsible for the deaths Tuesday night of Mrs. Ella W. Turner, 78, and Mrs. Una Graves, 60, in the former's home at E978 Ninth.

C. J. Melrose, superintendent of the Spokane Gas and Fuel company, said that the main had been turned off entirely while the work is in progress. Investigations pointed to the conclusion that gas had leaked from a broken main and had seeped through the ground into Mrs. Turner's home, causing the tragedy.

Police and employees of the Spokane Gas and Fuel company were continuing their investigation Wednesday to determine how gas fumes, which were declared responsible for the deaths of Mrs. Ella W. Turner, 78, and Mrs. Una Graves, 60, in the former's home at E978 Ninth Tuesday night, had entered the premises.

Mrs. Graves, whose home was at N1355 Normandie and who had been serving as nurse for Mrs. Turner, was found lying dead on the basement floor. Mrs. Turner was found dead in her bed.

NO ANSWER TO TELEPHONE

The tragedy was discovered by Mrs. Ben Hosford, E968 Ninth, and G. A. Shau, E1624 Thirteenth, when they went to Mrs. Turner's home to see if she were all right. Mrs. Hosford said she had tried to reach Mrs. Turner by telephone several times and became alarmed when she received no answer.

The basement light was burning, and Shau looked through the window to see Mrs. Graves, who evidently had been on her way to tend the furnace, lying dead on the floor.

Unable to enter, they summoned police, and Steward Doust of the emergency hospital, with Detectives Tesdahl and Self, hurried to the scene.

The officers forced the rear door and burst into the house, which was filled with the odor of gas. Coroner T. C. Barnhart was called when both women were found dead, and he pronounced death due to asphyxiation by gas.

NO GAS FIXTURES IN THE HOUSE

Barnhart said that death had occurred probably late in the afternoon or early in the evening. Police arrived at the scene at 8:30 p. m.

The problem of how gas had entered the house proved more baffling when it was disclosed that Mrs. Turner had no gas fixtures in her home, although a "dead end" pipe entering the house from the main was located.

C. J. Melrose, superintendent of the gas company, was called by police and J. S. Crosby, E218 Rich, service man for the company, also came to the scene to aid in detecting the cause.

Police officers believed that the gas had entered through the service pipe entering the building, but Melrose and Crosby said it was possible that the main in the street had broken and that the fumes had seeped into the house through the ground.

Mrs. Turner, who had lived in the city for the last eight years, resided with her son, Wilmot Turner. She also is survived by a son, Jay, of Spokane; one daughter, Miss Mary Turner, a teacher at Coolin, Idaho; one brother, T. A. Wilmot, Spokane, and two sisters, Mrs. Zinith Riffin, Yakima and Mrs. Emma Dale, Atlanta, Idaho.

Mrs. Graves is survived by one daughter, Mrs. Nina Rivers, and one son, Everett Graves, both of Spirit Lake, Idaho.

The bodies are at Hazen & Jaeger's.
