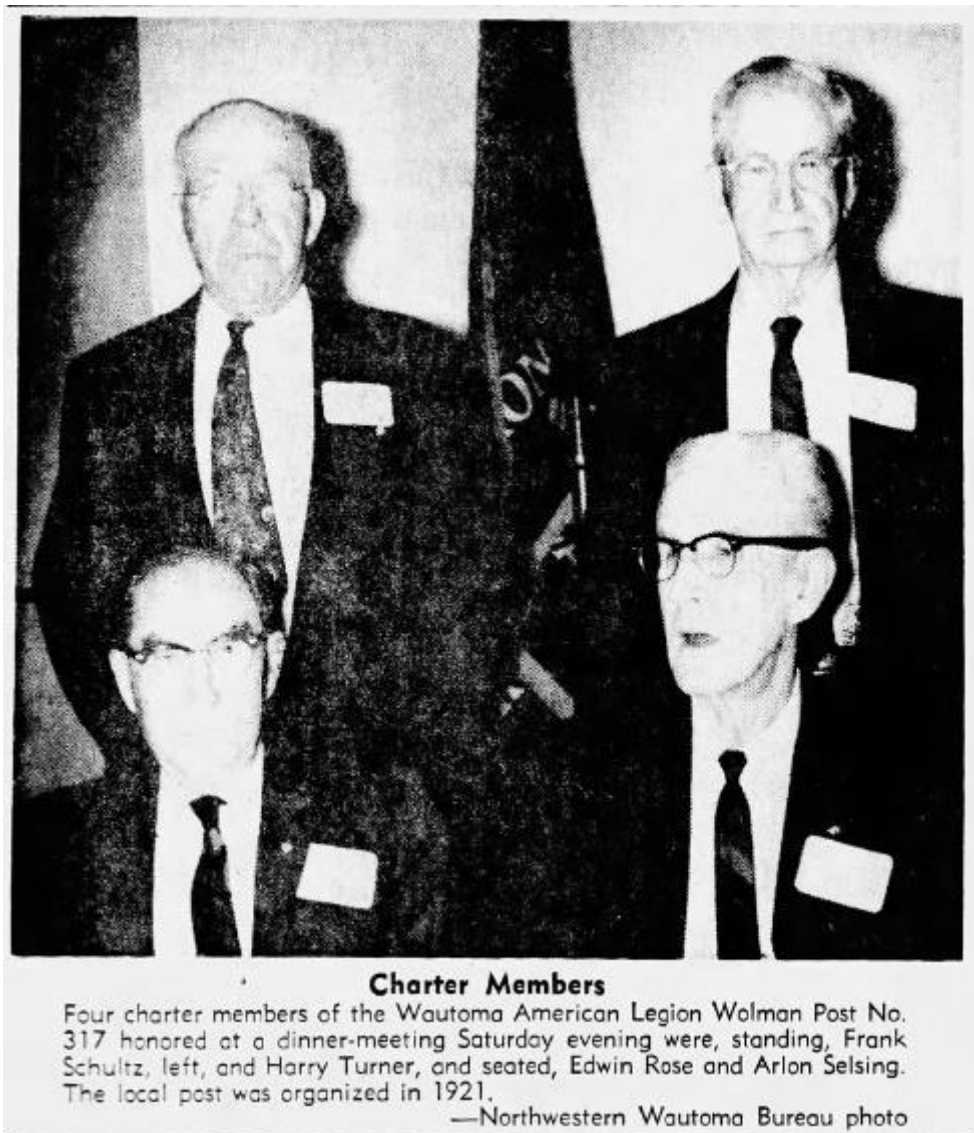
## *Turners Near Golden Date*

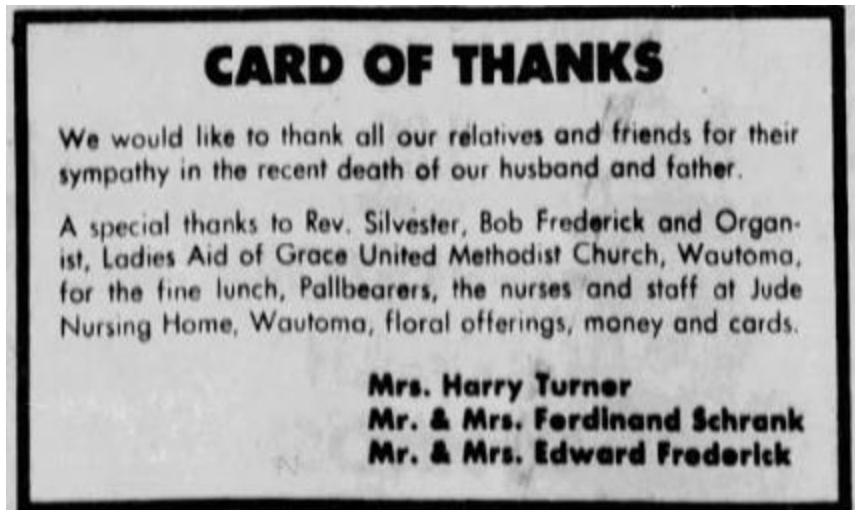

## WAUSHARA SURVIVORS TO ATTEND TUSCANIA REUNION

**Redgranite, Wis. — (Special) —** Waushara county survivors of the S. S. Tuscania torpedoed Feb. 5, 1918 of whom there are a considerable number, are looking forward with interest to the reunion of the National Tuscania Survivors association to be held at Kenosha, Feb. 3 and 4. Seventy Waushara county boys were aboard the illfated vessel when it was torpedoed and one of them, Jesse Johnson of Wautoma, was instrumental in forming one of the first local unit groups in this country. Its first meeting was held at Wautoma in the G. A. E. hall in 1927. Other groups were formed in various localities at about the same time from which the national association was the outgrowth. Among Waushara county survivors still living are John McArdle, Redgranite; Harry Turner, Charles Eagan, Irvin Peterson, Miles Colligan, Arlon Selsing, all of Wautoma, George Gunderson, Ted Gehrke, John Inda, A. 



## Kileen Named President Of New Corporation

WAUTOMA — Fourteen shares of capital stock at \$100 per share were sold at the organizational meeting of the newly-formed Wautoma Development Corporation here Thursday evening.

The corporation was formed last week and incorporation papers were received Wednesday with the organization's purpose to work towards attracting new industry to Wautoma. One such project is im-

structing the building and the firm will lease the building for a year, with an option to buy it after that period at the actual cost.

Also discussed was the surveying of the four acre land tract in the southwest sector of the city on which the corporation has taken option. A Montello surveyor is expected here Saturday or Monday to survey the land which will be purchased from Harry Turner for \$100 per acre.

Informal discussion centering on zoning restrictions and consultation on the project with the City Council rounded out the closed session conducted in Atty. Kileen's office.



mediately forthcoming and the corporation is going ahead with plans to construct a building for an incoming firm.

Five directors elected by the stockholders to serve a one year term were Atty. Earl Kileen, M. F. Chipman, Duane Ellickson, Arne Holvedt and Al Hackbarth. Of this group, the directors elected Kileen as president; Ellickson, vice president, and Chipman, secretary-treasurer.

The directors were also named as a committee to construct and read the by-laws of the corporation for presentation at the next meeting.

Other stockholders, in addition to those serving as directors, include Frank Klinger, Melvin Nero, Charles Luhm, Leo P. Minsky, Karel A. Grimm, Richard I. Matthews, Clayton Olson and Kenneth Woodworth.

Plans were discussed for the immediate construction of a 30 by 54 foot cement block building by Olson and Hackbarth in accordance with specifications set up by the incoming firm. The directors will confer with representatives of the firm here Monday to make further plans and go over terms of the lease. Construction of the building is expected to start Tuesday.

The price of the Brunner land is \$285 per acre while the cost of the Formiller land is \$200 per acre. Presented from the floor, by Mrs. Bruce Woodliff, was a 40 acre tract on the southwest side of the city (the other land is on the east side of the city). The land is owned by Harry Turner who prior to the meeting told Mrs. Woodliff that he would sell the land for \$200 per acre if less than 40 acres were purchased. # Fire Hits Farm At Wautoma

WAUTOMA — A spectacular fire at 6 p.m. Wednesday was the first time the Wautoma volunteer department has used its new truck which arrived earlier this month.

The fire completely destroyed a large barn belonging to Harry Turner, located at the south city limits on Highway 22. The blaze, which could be seen for considerable distance, drew crowds of spectators from Wautoma and the area.

Before the fire was discovered by Mrs. Turner, it had completely engulfed the building, sending flames high into the air. The fire department and the Wisconsin Conservation Forest fire department were called, but all they could do was to see that the sparks soaring into the night sky did not start other fires.

The barn was not used for animals as the Turners do not farm anymore. It was used for storage. In the upper part of the barn was new and used furniture belonging to Harold Bovee, who owns a furniture store east of Wautoma. A tire was burned off a tractor near the barn, but firemen pulled the vehicle away before it was destroyed.

Cause of the fire is not known. It is covered by insurance, but no estimate was given on its value.
