W. J. Lightfoot and his party are in town awaiting better weather for surveying. The stormy weather has interfered seriously with their examination work. W. J. Kerr and F. J. Twynham, of the party left for Lamar yesterday.

EL PASO automobilists had a thrilling experience at the Elephant Butte dam Sunday, when they rode from the bottom of the pit up to the top, a distance of 350 feet, at a rate of 900 feet a minute, in buckets on the aerial derricks. There were 10 of them in each car.

R. J. Schmalhausen, superintendent of construction, took them all over the works Sunday in a special train, which he ordered out for the purpose. After visiting all of the plants, they went down into the pit, and then made the trip in the buckets.

The party left El Paso Saturday morning at 11:30 in four machines. J. M. Pollard had his Cadillac, and in the car with him were: Tom Newman, Otto Armstrong, Gwynne Foster, Ted Houghton and A. R. Burges. W. K. Marr, in his Buick "40," had F. J. Twynham, W. R. Piper, C. B. Feagin and Walter Harold, the latter driving. This was the pilot car. W. K. Ramsey had H. A. Hamilton, A. H. Rodes and Vance Stewart in his Studebaker "25." Dr. J. M. Ridley, H. B. Harding, T. H. and R. A. Ramey were in the Ramey brothers' Hupmobile "32."

They arrived at Las Cruces at 2:15 and had dinner there. Between Rock Point and Aleman they ran into mud and ran for five miles through eight inches of water, having struck that point five minutes after a rainstorm. Here the Hupmobile threw a tire.

They reached Cutter after dark and continued to the dam, reaching there supperless at 9:40 Saturday night. They made the difficult descent along the winding rocky roads into the dam, while it was pitch dark and rather dangerous.

After going all over the works, they started for home at 11:45 Sunday morning. Bob Moore was at the dam and made the trip in the buckets with them, but did not come back to El Paso. They reached Cutter at 1 oclock and stopped 20 minutes for lunch. The Turney's main ranch was reached at 3:30 and they left there at 3:55, reaching Las Cruces at 4:49, left there at 5:18 and reached the plaza in El Paso at 7:25. The speedometer on the pilot car showed they had covered 117.6 miles from the dam.

Will Marr had a blowout 26 miles out from the dam and Will Ramsey got a short circuit 25 miles out of Las Cruces and had to run into the Mesilla valley town on two cylinders. He did not get into El Paso until 11:15.

Mr. Twynham made a new log of the road all the way down from the dam, and says the road between Cutter and the dam is in good condition. They made good time over most of the roads, but did not attempt any records conceding that Will J. Rand's record of 5 hours and 53 minutes by way of Engle will stand for some time.

They are to make corrections in the map for the benefit of future tourists, as there are several errors, particularly as to the ways of getting into and out of the ranches along the route.

AUTOISTS VISIT BUTTE DAM

Party of El Pasoans Take Aerial Ride
Over the Gorge in Buckets
Used for Concreting.

Another band of El Paso's automobile enthusiasts went on a pathfinding expedition to the Elephant Butte dam. This party left Saturday and returned to El Paso Sunday evening. There were four automobiles in the party, made up of a Buick "40," Hup "32," Studebaker "30" and a Cadillac "50" and all made the trip without accident.

The party in the four automobiles left El Paso at 11 o'clock Saturday morning, spent an hour at Las Cruces and reached the dam site about 8:30 in the evening. They say the roads were in fairly good condition except for a stretch of bad mud running ten or fifteen miles above Turney's ranch.

Sunday morning was spent in viewing the dam site. Mr. Schmalhausen, the superintendent in charge of the work, did everything to make the visit interesting. The party was taken for a joy ride on the dummy engine over the narrow gauge railroad around the works and finally were swung across the gorge in the big bucket used for slinging cement from the mixer to the dam. This aerial escapade was a thriller and gave all the sensations of flying in an airship, the automobilists say.

Leaving the dam the party stopped over at Cutter for a short time and were back in El Paso at 9:15 in the evening. A meter on the Cadillac registered the round trip at 238 miles, and a member of the party asserts that the round trip can easily be negotiated in fourteen hours.







"The British soldiers in France had a saying, 'fed up,' which meant much and expressed the soldier's viewpoint," said Lieut. Frank J. Twynham, recently returned from overseas. " 'Fed up' means that feeling which a soldier gets that he cares little whether the war lasts 14 years or that he 'gets hit' today. I did not understand it until our hard three weeks' deal at Chateau Thiery, when my particular company had had 53 casualties. Then I was 'fed up,' I felt it, too, to the depths. It is not the yellow in a man. One sees them go around him and the soldier becomes a fatalist, that when his time comes that he will go and worry ceases. Soldiers also have a saying that if your 'name is on the shell' it is yours to get you. That 'fed up' feeling causes men to do things that might be looked upon as extraordinarily brave. I have seen them go right through terrific barrages when they could easily detour around them. Now that we are out we have a feeling that this is just the 'bit over' of life and we are restless, aimless, want to wander and cannot bring ourselves to settle down to the steady grind of work like we used to do. It is the 'bit over' that we did not look for. We Americans did not get that feeling as strong, probably, as the soldiers of the allies who saw so much more of the real warfare. But a good lot of us got 'fed up' and it is a factor and a big one in the returned soldiers' lives which has to be reckoned with in readjustment."

Wordy Battle Is Fought In Office Of The Board

There was a hot time in the office of the Board of Supervisors on Tuesday morning last in which former County Engineer Vandercook and Assistant County Engineer Twynham, were the actors. At times, during the heated discussion, Mr. Twynham was ably supported by his wife, who at one stage of the proceedings is alleged to have declared to her husband: "If you don't whip that fellow (Vandercook) I'll do it myself" Whereupon it is alleged that Twynham agreed to do the job when he got the former county engineer on the outside. During this act Vandercook, playing up center, announced that the officers of the law would look after Twynham's case, and sure enough they did. The former assistant county engineer is now under a peace bond in the sum of \$300.

The fracas in the office of the Board was brought about by the issuance of a subpoena by the Chairman of the Board, on the complaint of B. Vandercook, commanding F. J. Twynham to appear before the Board with records

and notes pertaining to the Clifton-Springerville road.

In answer to the subpoena the former Assistant Engineer appeared and Chairman Stanton came down from Morenci to receive the records consisting of two field note books.

Mr. Twynham was indignant at the procedure and stated that the records had been given into his keeping by the county engineer to enable him to complete some work he was engaged upon in connection with the pending lawsuit of Webster & Kerby against the county, and that the County Engineer could have had the records for the asking. The former county engineer disagreed with the statement by his former assistant and the wordy battle started. Such epithets as "crook," "liar," etc., were bandied about in a careless manner, followed by threats of violence.

Chairman Stanton sat back in his chair and got both ears full and the court house attaches were afforded the first diversion they have had since the first of the year.

Judge Allows Father To Take His Children To Coast For Vacation

Frank Twynham was granted permission to take his two minor children, Franklin P., 12, and Margaret, nine, to California for a vacation, in a habeas corpus hearing before judge W. D. Howe in the 34th district court.

Jessie Mae Twynham, plaintiff in the hearing and divorced wife of the man, had appealed to the court to restrain her former husband from taking the children beyond the jurisdiction of the court. She alleged that the divorce which she was granted, included a court order that she might see the children and contended that the trip was a ruse to remove the children from El Paso.

The father told judge Howe he merely wanted to take them to California for a trip. After hearing the case judge Howe granted Twynham the permission, with the stipulation that he return and report to the court on or prior to September 5. The judge also ruled that prior to the departure for California the mother might spend several hours with her children.

MOTHER WINS HABEAS CORPUS.

In a habeas corpus hearing transferred from the 65th to the 41st district court, judge P. R. Price awarded Mrs. Jessie Twynham, who sued her husband Franklin J. Twynham, custody of two minor children until September 3, after which time they are to be returned to the father and taken to his home at Tucumcari, N. M.

No doubt he would be greatly awed by the radio, automotive and airplane improvements and devices made possible by electricity. He could hardly be more surprised, however, than the layman who would for the first time see Escondido's sewage disposal plant in operation.

It took several years for the city of Escondido to build the plant, much of the time being devoted to a study of the city's needs by the firm of Black & Veatch, engineers. But, this city now has a plant that will be adequate to the city's needs for several years and upon which, at a reasonable cost, additions could be made if needed to take care of a larger population.

This new plant is located in the Escondido river bed, in the eastern part of town. G. L. Dodds, who besides being a geologist has a goodly knowledge of engineering work, and the writer were privileged to see the plant in operation Friday, being conducted about the various units by Frank J. Twynham, the city's resident engineer from the firm of Black & Veatch.

Mr. Twynham accompanied the afore mentioned persons about the entire plant and explained, in detail and with interesting side lights, the operation of the entire plant. Sewage from the city, upon arrival at the plant, first enters what is known as a pumping station. It is there that the larger

fier acts so as not to disturb the effluent and collects solids at the floor of the tank, such solids being transferred to the "bug house."

Next, the liquids, having now gone through the process of elimination of solids, passes through the chlorination plant for final purification. The final station through which the liquids pass before going into the Escondido river creek bed is the weir gauging station, where measurements can be made. In case the city enters into a contract with ranchers for the use of the water for irrigation purposes, the gauging station will be utilized.

Next, we were taken to another building known as the blower station. There the engines are located that operate the plant. Mr. Twynham informed us that at the present only about half capacity was being employed.

Throughout the inspection we had heard much of the "bug house," which is a building 40 feet square, and it was natural that we were very much interested in the structure. We were informed that it contains four compartments, each treating the sludge materials. About three months from now the sludge will be released from the "bug house" and will be placed in drying beds. It is said to be about the best fertilizer that money can buy. "Aerobic bacteria," meaning bacteria like air, but generally known as "bugs," eat and digest the solids in the "bug house," leaving a waste material which settles at the bottom of the tank and is without odor.

It is necessary to have a safety valve on this large structure for gases. There is also an overflow outlet. If the plant becomes full, the overflow will allow the sludge to go back over the process of the entire plant. The

particles are screened out from the fluid. This unit, No. 1, is controlled by an automatic switch and is therefore of little bother to an attendant.

The second unit is known as a screening chamber and catches most of the solids which the first does not obtain. This is not a large unit, but is quite essential in the process.

Next we were taken to the third unit, known as the preliminary settling tank. There, the solid particles left after the former process sink to the bottom and the scum goes to the top and is carried off. When there is a quantity of sludge in the tank it is carried off to the sludge digester, but in the parlance of those who have been engaged in the work at the plant is "the bug house."

The third unit is in two sections and releases its effluent content to unit No. 4, known as the mixing flume. From this point there is a decidedly noticeable clearing up of the effluent, the liquid being aerated. Compressed air is forced through 22 filtros plates, which diffuses the air through the sewage, causing what looks like boiling of water. This action breaks up whatever materials there are left in the effluent and when the sewage goes to the next unit, No. 5, it is more able to settle.

The fifth unit is similar to the fourth, being known as an aeration plant. There are four compartments, with 39 filtros plates in each. Only a small amount of solids reach the fifth unit, but those that do go to the bottom and are carried aside by a current and then through the entire plant again. There is a depth of ten feet in the aeration plant.

Effluent then goes to the final settling plant, unit No. 6. It is a 25-foot circular tank, 25 feet in depth. There is a clarifier at the bottom which revolves around the tank once each 13 minutes and 20 seconds. This clari-

roof is made of concrete, over which there is a large quantity of sand to make pressure against the gas pressure which is naturally created.

According to Alva J. Smith, division engineer of Black & Veatch, consulting engineers, the plant is the best he has ever seen in the 30 years that he has been engaged in that line of construction. He made this statement to Escondidans.


The plant is now in such a state that the city is contemplating its acceptance and cleaning up the bills relative to the contract with R. E. Burgund. However, there have been several extras placed in the plant by the contractor and he is asking additional payment for them. This has caused somewhat of a controversy between the city and the contracting company and Friday evening at a meeting of the city council, the city officials passed a motion "—that the bill of Contractor R. E. Burgund for estimate No. 5 for sewer disposal plant be rejected in toto." The motion carried unanimously. An attorney, who represented the contractor, offered to arbitrate the differences that have arisen over the rejected estimate.

The entire matter of differences was set aside until next Thursday evening, when another meeting of the council will be held and the matter will be thrashed out, it is expected.


However, the differences between the city and the contractor have nothing to do with the Escondido's sewage disposal plant as a marvelous triumph of science. It is all of that. Black & Veatch, engineers, declare that it will be a "show place" and that officials of cities who are interested in such plants will be brought here from time to time to inspect and study the works. Escondidans, too, now have an opportunity to survey the plant and it is believed that they will be amazed.

"El Paso (TX) Herald" Thursday 17 Aug 1922 p 3 – Frank Twynham was permitted to take children Franklin P. (12) & Margaret (9) to CA for vacation. The plaintiff Jessie Mae Twynham, his divorced wife, had asked the court to restrain him from taking them outside the court jurisdiction thinking this a ruse to take the children from El Paso. The divorce order gave him permission to see her children. Frank said he wanted to take them to CA. The judge ruled this was all right except he had to report to court on/before 5 Sep 1922. Prior to their leaving for CA, Jessie could spend several hours with the kids.

"El Paso (TX) Herald" Tuesday 29 Aug 1922 p 9 - habeas corpus hearing was transferred from the 65th to the 41st district court. Judge Price awarded custody of the 2 children to Mrs. Jessie Twynham, who had sued husband Franklin J. Twynham. She has custody of the children until 3 Sep 1922, then they will be returned to their father & taken to his home at Tucumcari NM.
