# 34 IN CLUTCHES OF UNCLE SAM

Thirty-four men now held in the federal jail of Muskogee were arraigned before the U. S. district court late this afternoon on indictments by the federal grand jury of last week.

## A Letter From France.

June 14, 1918

Mrs. S. F. Ussery.

Dear mother.

Your welcome letter just received and I am glad indeed to hear from you all.

I am working every day but not much hard. I am logging with four mules and am riding bare back, but am looking and hoping for a saddle soon.

I have a good partner and we quarrel like brothers some time but never do fight.

We are improving our camp fast. We have a little Y. M. C. A. and a canteen now. We sure did have a time getting tobacco until we got a canteen, but we are sitting on easy street now. I bought enough to last me 90 days and I think the war will be over before I need to buy any more, or I hope so any way. Our boys are making it hot for them now.

I missed my calculation a little when I said I would be home by the forth of July. We have been on this side for four months, already, and it does not seem like more than 30 days. The most of our time was spent

in England and I do not like that country a bit. I like to have starved there. We are getting plenty to eat here now and this is a pretty country. The prettiest woods and wild flowers I have ever seen. There are lots of squirrels here but not many birds. The squirrels are a dark red and about as big as a cat squirrel. We have one



for a pet.

Well I think if I keep logging until the war is over I think I can hold a job with John Kilburn up in the mountains.

Well there isn't any news, only company boys news, so I will have to quit for this time, so write often.

## A Letter From France.

Haworth Herald Editor,  
Sir:—

Just a few lines as everything is quiet to-day, and all the boys are in good spirits.

We are all having a very nice time to be Cemetery candidates.

We have been in France about 4 months and liking it better every day. The French people treat us like we were their own boys—they have nothing that is too good for us, and we are always welcome at their homes.

We are camped near a little village called——it is only a small place but very beautiful.

There are but a few men here to work, but that doesn't stop the mills, and car loading, the women keep every thing going as good as the men did. One French girl can do more hard work in a day than two of us engineers. It looks funny to see women hauling logs and lumber. They work their mules with yokes as we do our oxen, they drive them with a long stick. Their wagon is a two wheeled cart and they haul as much on it with two mules as we do with four. They keep their stock well trained and in

good condition, if one doesn't pull they gather a bunch of weeds and grass and feed them then Old Buck, will give them another lift.

The people here drink wine instead of water, and a lot of the U. S. A. Boys are getting the habit. They have two kinds of wine, one is Vin Blonk, and the other is Vin Birhe. We all prefer the blonk for it has a little stronger "kick" than the other, but no one ever gets too much.

Well we are working every day and doing a good part towards going through Berlin. It was a little lonesome for us when we first landed in England, but it wasn't long until another load of U. S. Boys came in there. Sure is a lot of us over here now every place we go we find the town full of O. D. S. and they

all want to hurry and get on the front. I haven't been on the front yet, but have been in a few places where I couldn't rest at ease. When the Boches hand the Boys a little package it only makes them more determined to get revenge, which they will do soon.

Well it is time to line up for our Ham and I would be Sol if I were late, so will close by asking you to send me the Herald. I will send the money when I get to go to town again.

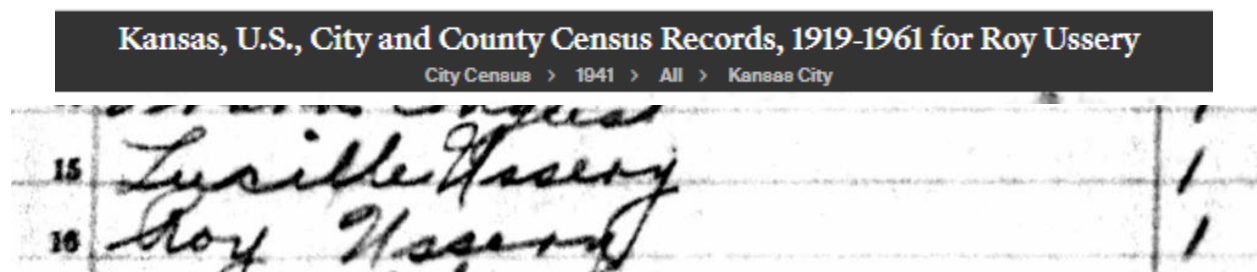
