

ı r Vaught, an employe of the Casteel Grocery, was born at Lake Dallas Oct. 8, 1893, and had lived in Denton county all of his life. He was a veteran of World War I, having served as a corporal in the army, and was a member of the Methodist Church.

Survivors include his wife and one son, Lee Edward Vaught, U. S. Navy; one daughter, Margaret Frances Bederka of Houston; three sisters, Mrs. Zepha Mae Sharber, Mrs. Jennie Smith and Mrs. Maude Paty, all of Denton; and two brothers, Bob Vaught of Vernon and Willie Vaught of Oklahoma.

Funeral arrangements were incomplete at noon today. The body will remain at the Schmitz Funeral Home until time for the services.


