# George E. Vaught Dies Suddenly

George Edward Vaught, 51, died suddenly when stricken by a heart attack while eating breakfast at his home, 116 Hann Ave., at 7 a. m. today.

Vaught, an employe of the Castle Grocery, was born at Lake Dallas Oct. 8, 1893, and had lived in Denton county all of his life. He was a veteran of World War I, having served as a corporal in the army, and was a member of the Methodist Church.

Survivors include his wife and one son, Lee Edward Vaught, U. S. Navy; one daughter, Margaret Frances Bederka of Houston; three sisters, Mrs. Zepha Mae Sharber, Mrs. Jennie Smith and Mrs. Maude Paty, all of Denton; and two brothers, Bob Vaught of Vernon and Willie Vaught of Oklahoma.

Funeral arrangements were incomplete at noon today. The body will remain at the Schmitz Funeral Home until time for the services.

Funeral services for Mrs. Nancy Marguerite Collins, 84, Denton County pioneer who died of pneumonia at 10:30 p. m. Friday in the home of her son, Ben Collins, 600 South Locust Street, will be held at that residence at 4 o'clock Saturday afternoon.

Born in Farmersburg, Ind., March 12, 1852, she was Miss Nancy Marguerite Johns before she married John Benjamin Collins July 22, 1869, and the couple moved to Denton County, settling near Argyle, in 1873. They lived there until Collins' death in 1922, when Mrs. Collins came to make her home with the son here.

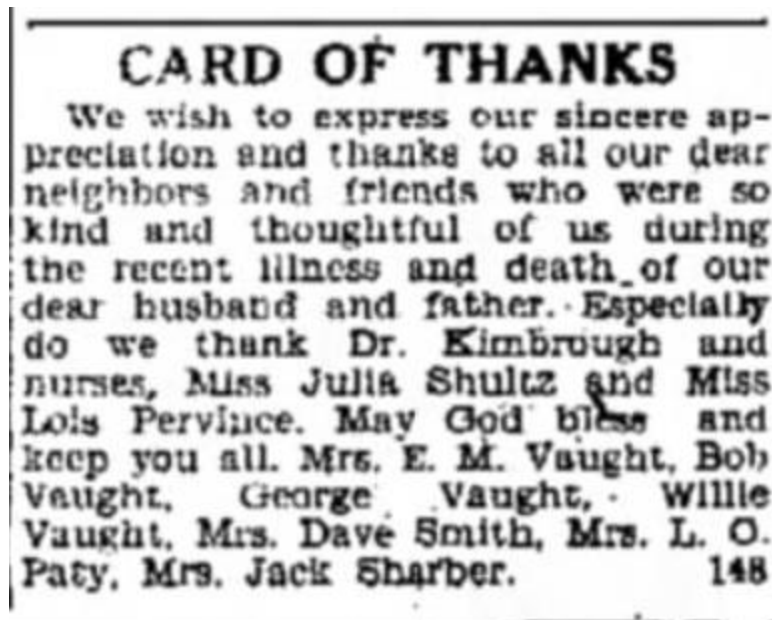
