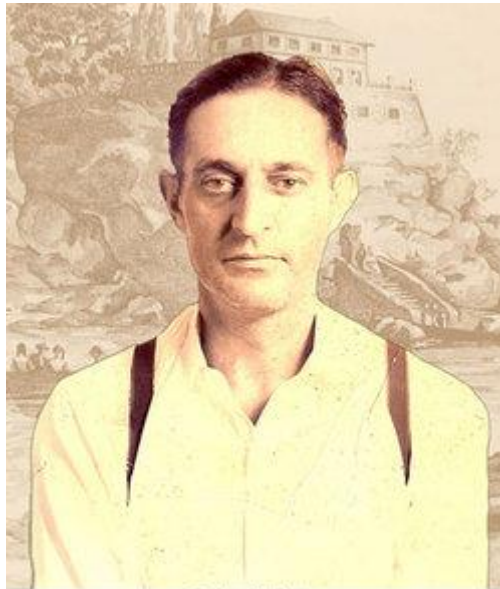


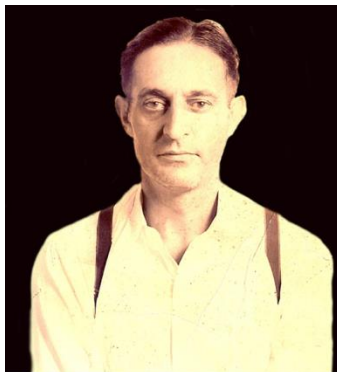

Rollie Vibert, Renown Camp Cook, Dies

Roland H. Vibert, known throughout the area as an unexcelled lumber camp cook, died Wednesday in his sleep. Death was attributed to a coronary attack. He had been suffering from heart trouble for the past several months.

Mr. Vibert was born May 21, 1897, in Cloquet and received his schooling there. On Nov. 11, 1933, he married Mary Lakosky in Virginia, and they made their home in Gheen. He worked as a cook in lumber camps during the days of big timber operations in the area, and the past few years he was employed as a cruiser and woods foreman for his stepson, Harold Lakosky.

He was a veteran of WWI and served 17 months overseas. He was a member of the Cook American Legion, the Last Man's Club of Cloquet, and his church affiliation was Episcopalian.

Rollie was official chef for the annual Loggers' Party instituted 11 years ago by Dr. W. C. Helam, and was famous for his men's-style menus, including Canadian pea soup, roast beef, mashed rutabagas and sour milk pancakes.

Surviving Mr. Vibert are his wife, Mary; three stepsons, Harold Lakosky, at home, Claude, Tower, and Frank, Elgin, Ill.; two step-daughters, Mrs. Doris Kochevar of Gheen and Mrs. Donna Edwards of Orr; one sister, Edna Shannon, Vancouver, B. C.; one niece, Elizabeth Vibert, Cloquet, several nephews, 17 grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.

Funeral services will be held Saturday morning at 10 a.m. from Cron-Nelson-Harris Funeral Home in Virginia with Rev. Colbert officiating. Visitation will start at 3 p.m. Friday and continue until the hour of service. Burial will be in the family plot of Calvary cemetery, Virginia.

Pallbearers will be Pete and Joe Skraba of Gheen, Bob Pederson, Cook, Clarence Long, John Rogentine and Ervin Kroger of Cloquet.

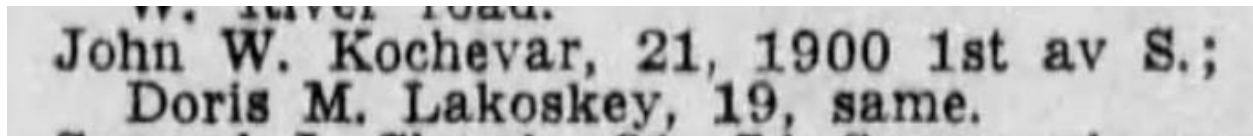

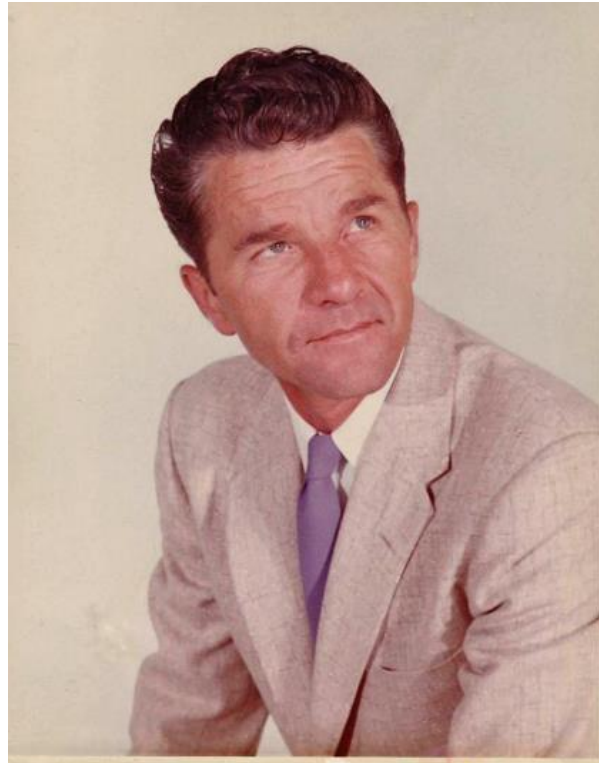



Vibert Fred D, Cloquet. Publisher. Born Nov 14, 1874 in Gaspl Canada, son of R D and Helen (Hollick) Vibert. Married May 8, 1897 to Agate Roney Educated in public schools Rochester England. Moved to Cloquet 1887 and has been engaged in newspaper business from that time; purchased the Pine Knot 1896 from Pine Knot Pub Co and has continued to publish same. Member Masonic fraternity.

Fred D. Vibert, editor and proprietor of the Pine Knot, published at Cloquet, Minnesota, is one of the rapidly rising young newspaper men of Carlton county. He has made a success of his work in that locality, and since taking charge of the Pine Knot as proprietor has doubled the plant and circulation of the paper, and added many improvements thereto.

Mr. Vibert was born in the province of Quebec, Canada, on a farm November 14, 1874. His father, Robert D. Vibert, was born in the Jersey Island, lived there two years and then with his parents removed to Canada. He was a farmer in early life, and later engaged in the real estate business. The mother of our subject was of English descent and her parents were born in England.

Of a family of nine children, Mr. Vibert was the second in order of birth. He was raised on a farm in Canada until he was six years of age, when he went to England with his mother. In 1886 he came from London, England, to the United States and located in Cloquet, Minnesota. His father was among the oldest settlers of Cloquet, and there our subject grew to manhood. He received most of his early education in the schools of England, and during the winter of 1892-93 he took a commercial course at Valparaiso, Indiana. He had worked in the office of the Pine Knot in Cloquet and learned the printers trade, and started to learn the trade at the age of thirteen years. After completing his commercial studies he returned to his work on the Pine Knot, and was thus engaged until December, 1896, when he bought a half interest in the paper. He bought the remaining interest in April, 1898, and has since been sole proprietor.

The Pine Knot was established in July, 1884, and was the first paper in the county. A DeLacy Wood, of Carlton, was the founder, and after a few months he moved the paper from Carlton to Cloquet, and it became the first paper of that thriving town. It changed ownership several times prior to the purchase of the plant by Mr. Vibert, but the name remained the same. It is a weekly paper, published Saturday, and is a six-column quarto. It has the largest circulation and is one of the leading papers of the county, and is eagerly sought in Carlton and surrounding counties. Since Mr. Vibert became the owner of the plant he has put in new types, presses and other improvements, and the job department is well equipped for neat and prompt service, and all lines of job work are done there.

Mr. Vibert was married, in May, 1897, to Miss Lena Roney. Mrs. Vibert was born at Stillwater, Minnesota, and was of Irish descent, and her parents are of American birth. She was a school teacher in South Dakota, and is a lady of rare attainments. Mr. Vibert is a Republican in political sentiment, and was a member of the county central committee for Carlton county in the campaign of 1900, and is an earnest worker for party principles.

Ex-Senator Fred Douglas Vibert is one of the best known men in Minnesota, not only because of his valuable services to the state but also because of his personality which somehow keeps him in the memory of all who meet him.

Fred Douglas Vibert was born at Perce, in the Gaspé country, Quebec, Canada, November 14, 1873, his parents being Robert Douglas and Ellen (Hollick) Vibert. His father was born in Canada, but his grandfather came from the Isle of Jersey. His mother's people were English. He began his schooling in the place of his nativity but at the age of seven was taken to England by his mother and during the next six years attended school in that country. In 1886 his parents settled in Cloquet, Minnesota and he completed his education, except for a short course at Valparaiso, Indiana. At fifteen he began to learn the printer's trade, became a reporter, and worked on the Pine Knot at intervals until 1896, when he purchased that paper and conducted it alone for some time subsequently selling a half interest. Since 1896, however, he has been the guiding spirit of the Pine Knot and the paper has increased greatly both in prestige and circulation under his management.

His life has not been entirely devoted to newspaper work. Three fields of endeavor have opened gates to him, and as a newspaper man, a businessman and a public man he has achieved success. In 1896 he began to take an active part in politics. That was the "free silver" year and Mr. Vibert campaigned the county with Page Morris. Thereafter he was always active in the republican party. For seventeen months he was deputy register of deeds and clerk of court for Carlton county. In 1913 he was elected mayor of Cloquet. He took office January 1, 1914, but in the fall of that year he was elected to the state senate. So satisfactory was he to the public as senator that he was re-elected in 1918, and at the expiration of his second term he voluntarily withdrew and declined to be a candidate for a third term. During his eight years in the state in the state senate Mr. Vibert commanded the respect of his colleagues, irrespective of party affiliations, and he was instrumental in helping to enact much good legislation. He was chairman of the public domain committee and was the author of the bill to lease state school lands for exploration, on a sliding royalty basis, and the bill was passed almost unanimously. Again after the city of Cloquet was completely destroyed by fire in October, 1918; he proposed and directed the management of the bill which appropriated one million, eight hundred thousand dollars to aid in rebuilding the city. That bill passed the senate the day it was introduced and went through the legislature two days later. All of his public acts have been directed toward the public good and in his own city, as well as throughout the state he regarded as a safe and wise leader.

On May 8, 1897, Fred Douglas Vibert was married to Aurelia A. Roney.

Mr. Vibert takes a very active interest in the public and social welfare of Cloquet and has long been a member of the Commercial Club, at which he served as president for a number of years. He is a member of the Masonic fraternity, the Rotary Club and the Cloquet Gold Club and is a vestryman in the Episcopal church.

Graton, N. D. Postmaster Here for Lesson, Somewhat Pessimistic.

I am of the opinion that the Grafton bank will not secure any large extent of business, although I shall expect to show a satisfactory record."

With the casting vote of Chairman P. A. Gandrud as the deciding factor, the Senate Temperance Committee late yesterday decided to report favorably on Senator F. H. Peterson's "official" County Option Bill.

The measure was the subject of a public hearing in the Senate chamber earlier in the afternoon, when adherents and opponents of the measure discussed its good and bad points for nearly three hours.

Immediately after the conclusion of the hearing the committee went into session to take action on the bill. Several typographical errors were corrected by an amendment and then Senator Van Hoven proposed that the Bill be laid over so that the Committee on Judiciary could be consulted with regard to Section 2, which provided for the attestation of signatures to the petition calling for an election. After some discussion it was decided to put the vote on the Bill as it stood. Senator Ward objected and while he said that he stood for Prohibition and would vote for the County Option Bill on the floor of the Senate he thought it better to postpone action on the measure as it stood.

Senators voting for the bill were P. A. Gandrud, Fred D. Vibert, J. L. Vermilya, Theodore C. Blomgren and E. E. Lobeck. Those who opposed its recommendation for passage were John W. Pauly, Albert L. Ward, Peter Van Hoven and Pierre A. Hilbert.
