William E. Vickers was born Dec. 28th 1888 in the state of Kansas, Montgomery county and died from the sinking of the Tuscania. He had joined the colors and was on his way to France when the Tuscania was torpedoed by a German submarine. He was among the 164 American soldiers buried on the Scottish coast, which were lost.— Republic.

McPherson of Aurora, who has four sons with the colors, delivered an address in honor of this young man who died for the honor of the Stars and Stripes, and his words of praise brought tears to the eyes of all his listeners. It was a great meeting and Hon. McPherson spoke with consoling words to the bereaved parents and friends of this loyal young American whose body now lies in the soil on the Scottish Coast, with 164 more brave boys who have been laid to rest from the same disaster of the sinking Tuscania.

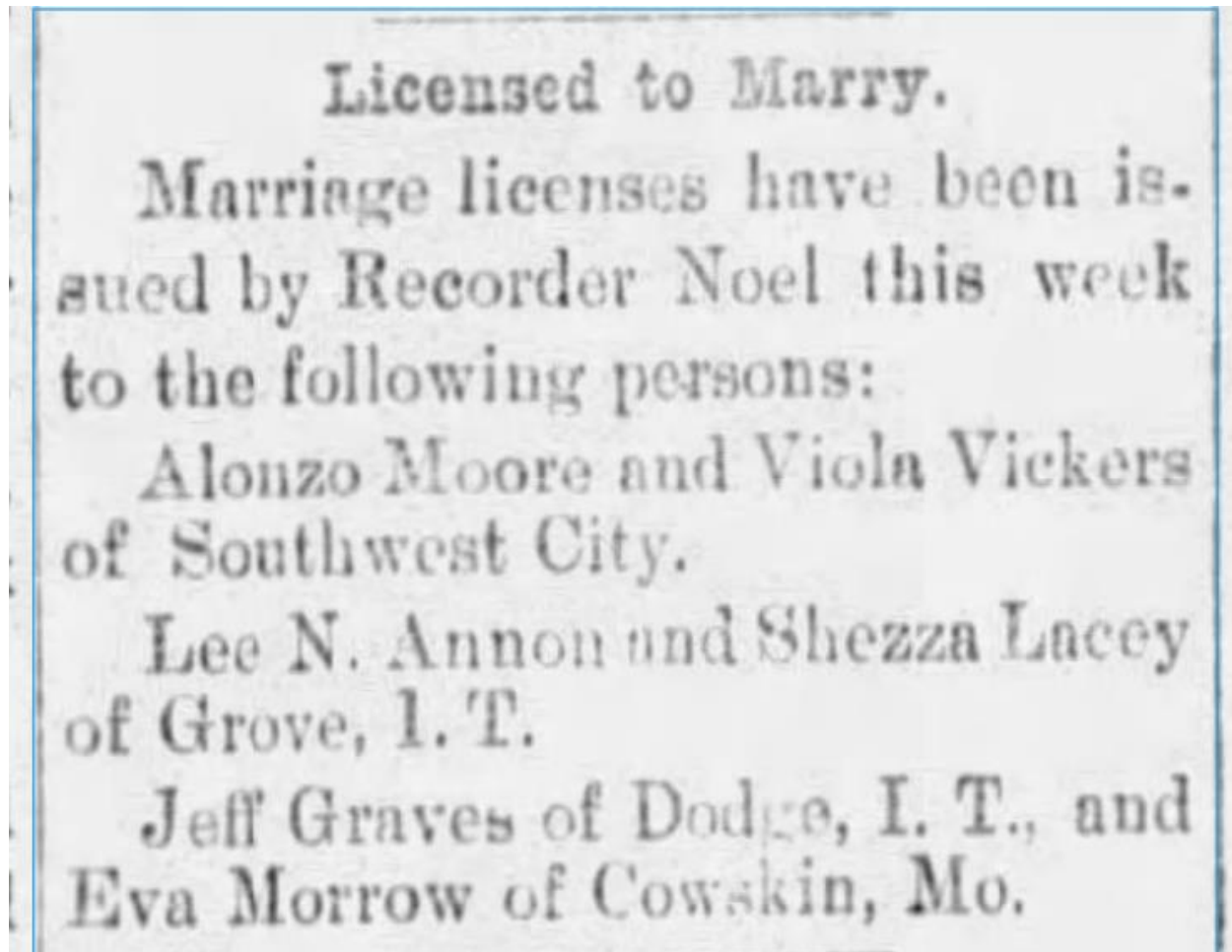

OK & in 1920 in Afton, Ottawa OK. Buried in Fairview Cemetery, Vinita, Craig OK. F: 61434092
- Mamie Pearl Vickers Benedict Bond, 11 Jan 1886 LaCrosse, Rush KS – 18 Oct 1915 Portland, Multnomah OR. Mamie married Lester Hamilton Benedict (19 Nov 1879 Nevada, Vernon MO – 28 Jan 1951 Wichita, Sedgwick KS, F: 157263148) on 20 Jan 1909 in Fayetteville, Washington Do. AR. They had 2 sons: Ensign (1909) & Charles (1911) Benedict. – In the 1909 Fort Smith KS city directory, Lester H. Benedict, laborer & wife Mamie live at 210 E. 4th. – In the 1910 census (conducted 19 Apr 1910), Mamie P. Benedict, age 24, b. KS, father b. IN, mother b. MN, married 1 year, gave birth to 1 child, 1 is living, and her son Ensign M. Benedict, age 5 months, b. KS, father b. MO, mother b. KS, live with Mamie's father-in-law & mother-in-law, John K. Glassford (84 OH) & Anne E. Glassford (66 OH) who have been married 9 years. On Nov 1910 Lester left her & married Helen Sanborn, age 16, on 30 Jun 1911 without divorcing Mamie. Helen left him upon discovering her marriage was invalid. On Lester's Find A Grave record is pictured the wife whom he left after they had 6 children together, giving her the impression he had died, and another wife he deserted after she gave birth to his twins. – Mamie Benedict married David Bond on 28 Jun 1913 in Ottawa Co. OK. David was born in AR. She gave birth to John W. - Clark Haven Vickers, 1 Oct 1891 Southwest City, McDonald MO [also found as Osceola, St. Clair MO on his WWI draft registration] – 16 Mar 1978 Bowden, Creek OK. SSN 442-03-4540.- Did not live with his family in the 1900 census, but is reported with them in the 1910 census. In 1910, Clark Vickers, 8 MO, father b. IL, mother b. MN, born Oct 1891, is a boarder with August Tipp (40 TX), wife Frances (26 Germany) & their daughter Dorie (1 TX) in Justice Precinct 8, Colorado Co. TX. – When he registered for the WWI draft in 1917, he was a blacksmith for C.M. Pritchard in Tulsa OK. He was single & listed himself as the "sole support of family" – "father & mother & invalid brother." Married 24 Jul 1919 in Tulsa Co. OK to Goldie Vinita ("Neta") Bilby (1902-1976, F: 91544350). Employee for over 43 years of the Ozark-Mahoning Chemical Co. Buried in Green Hill Memorial Gardens Cemetery, Sapulpa, Creek OK. F: 211064869
- Inez (Ina) Irene Vickers Johnson, 1 May 1894 Osceola, St. Clair MO – 2 Jun 1980 Shasta Co. CA. Married on 18 Mar 1913 in Jackson Co. MO to John Homer Johnson (22 May 1879 GA – 7 May 1967 Redding, Shasta CA), the son of William Elsey & Alice Johnson. According to her obituary, Inez Johnson is buried in Lawncrest Memorial Park, Redding, Shasta CA but is not on Find A Grave as of 1 May 2023.

- Ralph Douglas Vickers, 15 Feb 1896 Osceola, St. Clair MO – 28 Aug 1896 Osceola, St. Clair MO. Not on Find A Grave as of 1 May 2023.

- Clarence Oman Vickers, 10 Dec 1901 Miami, Ottawa OK – 29 Dec 1949 [at home of his brother Ray “in Dodge.” OK death record reports his death in Dec 1950 in Miami, Ottawa OK.] Never married. When he registered for the WWII draft (14 Feb 1942), he was unemployed with an address of Box 35, Bowden, Creek OK. C.H. Vickers [brother Clark Haven Vickers] was his next-of-kin. Buried in Fairview Cemetery, Southwest City, McDonald MO. F: 62417747
- James Vickers, 1909 OK - In the 1910 census conducted 18 Jun 1910, James is 10 months old. His birthdate computes to ca. Aug 1909. Several erroneous linkages are found online – to a man who died in Boston MA & to a Black man who lived in Springville, Logan OK in the 1930 census.
