Des Moines, Ia., Feb. 8.—According to all official reports, there were twenty-two Iowa boys on the torpedoed Tuscania, possibly more.

According to the passenger list, there were thirteen in the Twentieth engineers. Six were members of the 158th aero squadron and three of the 107th supply train. Earliest lists of survivors show that C. H. Ineck and Dale C. Hazelett are among the saved.

Parents of William D. Lawrence Hear of Son's Rescue From Ship.

(Evening Tribune Special.)

WASHINGTON, D. C., Feb. 11.—

Iowa's loss on the Tuscania has narrowed to one.

Clyde C. Pellem of Cedar Rapids is the one missing Iowan. The others, including William D. Lawrence, who was believed to have been missing until today, are accounted for.

There is a probability that Pellem may not have gone down with the ship, although his name so far does not appear in the list of survivors.

The war department today wired the parents of Lawrence that their son was safe.

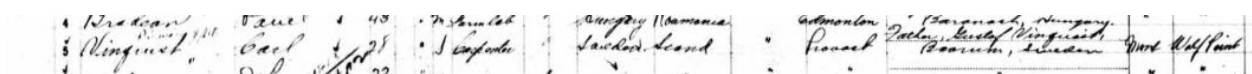

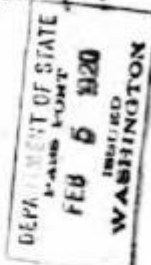



Cleveland Contractor Killed Diving Into Chautauqua Lake

Special to The BUFFALO EVENING NEWS.

LAKEWOOD, July 12.—A Cleveland building contractor, John Vinkuist, 54, of 1273 114th St., died of a neck fracture Sunday afternoon after he dived into about three feet of water at Stow. Coroner Theodore S. Morse of Brocton issued a verdict of accidental death.

Mr. Vinkuist, who was commodore of the Cleveland Heights Outboard Motor Boat Club, was visiting a cousin and her husband, Dr. and Mrs. Oscar Hannum of Bradford, Pa.

Witnesses said that Mr. Vinkuist, who was not familiar with Lake Chautauqua, dived from a private pier just north of the Bemus Point-Stow Ferry pier and struck his head on the bottom of the lake. Lakewood firemen used an inhalator in an effort to revive Mr. Vinkuist, who was pronounced dead by Dr. Hannum.

He is survived by his wife and a daughter.

DIVE INTO LAKE IS FATAL TO CLEVELANDER

Stow — The first day of his vacation proved fatal to John Vinqvist, 33, a Cleveland contractor who took up residence at the summer home of Dr. and Mrs. Oscar S. Hanum of Bradford, Pa.

The Cleveland man was killed Sunday afternoon when he dove into 32 inches of water here.

State Police from the Westfield and Chautauqua stations, conducted an investigation. Coroner Theodore Morse of Brocton said death was probably due to a broken neck. Vinqvist was the second person to die in Lake Chautauqua this month, Clayton Johnson of Lakewood was drowned near that village on July 1st.
