

Transcription:

Louis D. Mette, San Antonio, Texas – date entered Oct. 17, 17 – filed Oct. 19, 17 In re: Edward Van Hecke, probably a deserter At San Antonio, Texas.

Employe, instructed by Special Employe Needham, went to the City Police station where party was held, having been arrested by City Detective Albert King.

Van Hecke said he is a Belgian, 29 years of age, and that he came to the United States on April 1, 1913, entering at the Port of New York. He was born July 12, 1889.

After entering the country, he and his brother, Alois, 33 years of age, who came with him, spent one or two days in New York and then both went to Chicago, Ill. Where Edward went to work as a carpenter for the Matter Stock Car Company. They lived first on Clark street, number not remembered, and then Edward moved to So. 525 West 28th Street, where he was living on June 5, 1917. On March 1, 1917, Edward joined with the Nat Moies shows as carpenter and travelled with them. On June 5, 1917, they were playing at Sterling, Ill., but Edward gave his home address as 525 West 28th street, Chicago. Practically all the eligible show people registered, Edward said, giving their addresses somewhere in Chicago.

The show played west. At South Omaha, Neb., Edward received notice to appear for physical examination. This was received, he says, on September 17, 1917, and he was ordered to appear August 21. In his own language, he "put a letter" back to the Chicago board asking what to do, but he got no answer. Then he worked in Wortham's shows until they reached Waco, Texas, after which he and one Williams started to San Antonio, Williams saying he wanted to visit his folks here. Edward was picked up Friday of last week and held for examination.

On his person were found his registration card and the notice from the board to appear for examination. The registration card is made out to "Edw. Van Heka," and is signed by Dennis J. Egan as registrar. His registration number is 111.

The notice to appear for physical examination is dated August 17, 1917, and is from Local Board for Division No. 9, City of Chicago, 2901 Wallace street. On it the serial number of Van Hecke is given as No. 871 and his order number is No. 2620. He is ordered to report August 21 for physical examination. The notice is signed by M.E. Maher, chairman, and Bart J. Evans, clerk.

Van Hecke is held in jail at San Antonio, Texas, this city, awaiting reply to the following telegram sent to Special Agent In Charge F.P. Clabaugh at Chicago.

"F.P. Clabaugh, Chicago, Ill.----Edward Van Hecke, serial no. 871, order number 2620, Chicago local division No. 9, held here. Notice to appear for physical examination August 21 found on him. Please ascertain his status. (Signed) Barnes."


At San Antonio, Texas.

The following message was received in re above party, report on whom has been made by Employe showing he might be a deserter in that he failed to appear for physical examination when called by his local Chicago board:

"Chicago, Ill., Oct. 24, 1917.---Barnes, Federal Bldg San Antonio, Tex.---Reference Edward Van Hecke. Man is not deserter from army. If you desire will have local board here authorize any local board San Antonio to examine and forward physicians' certificate. Man can then be released or held pending mobilization orders. (Signed) Clabaugh.

Employe, by direction of Special Agent in Charge Breniman, sent the following telegram:

"M.E. Maher, chairman, Local Board No. 9, 2901 Wallace street, Chicago, Ill.---Department Justice holding Edward Van Hecke, serial 871, order 2620, who was notified appear before your board August 21 for physical examination but failed to do so. Will you authorize examination of man before one of our boards. (Signed) Barnes."

WASHINGTON, Feb. 9.—The war zone today gave up the names of hundreds of American soldiers saved from the torpedoed Tuscania.

But, as the war department statistical bureau worked to compile them that worried homes in this country might be assured of their son's safety, no new figures came in to extend hope that less than 125 United States soldiers had been lost.







• Alois Van Hecke, 18 Nov 1881 Stekene, Belgium - 15 Jan 1962 Chicago, Cook IL. In 1930 census living in Chicago, Cook IL. Data available in Cook Co. IL & Archdiocese of Chicago IL records. Alois declared his intent to be a citizen 23 Jan 1920 in Illinois; naturalized in Cook Co. IL court on 24 Sep 1920, a resident of 3252 S. Canal St. He entered the US on 29 Apr 1913. – Husband of Jeanette Selis, d. Nov 1945 & buried in the same cemetery as Alois. – On his WWI draft registration (12 Sep 1918), Alois Van Hecke lived at 527 – 28th Place, Chicago, Cook IL. He was b. 18 Nov 1881 in Belgium & was a non-declarant. He was employed as a carpenter at Mather Car Works, 45th & Halsted St., Chicago IL. His wife was Jeannette Van Hick. He was tall, with a medium build. In the 1930 census, Alois Van Hick, 58 Belgium, lived with wife Jeanette, 58 Belgium at 3254 Canal St., Chicago, Cook IL. Neither had an occupation. - Buried St. Mary Cemetery & Mausoleum, Evergreen Park, Cook IL but not on Find A Grave as of 21 Apr 2023. Alois's WWI draft registration, filed the one before his brother Edward's -
