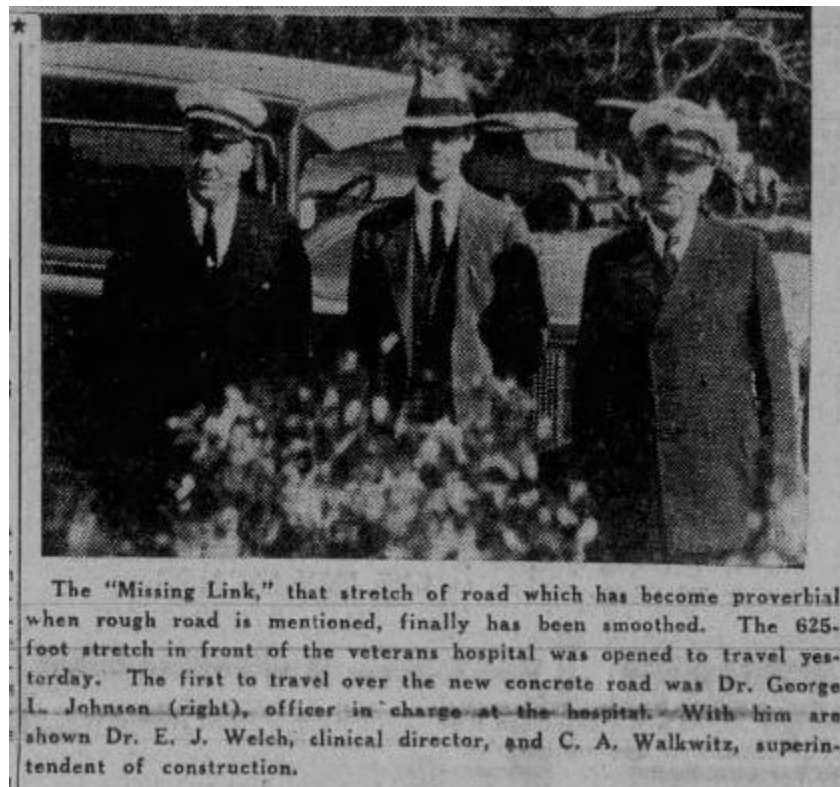

*Enlargement Program at Veterans Hospital Is Nearing Completion; New Heating Unit Is Being Installed

Additions and improvements to the United States Veterans hospital No. 90 will be completed by January 1, C. A. Walkwitz, superintendent of construction, said yesterday. It is possible that the final details will be completed a week before that date.

The water tower, 156 feet high, has been completed, as have the walls for the new central heating plant, the laundry and the garage.

The entire improvement project, including a roadway to the garage and laundry, and a paved parking space near the garage, will cost \$180,000.

Two Recall Tuscania's Sinking 18 Years Ago

Today was the anniversary of the sinking of a troop ship, Tuscania, off the coast of Ireland February 5, 1918, and among the survivors are two Manhattan men, Dan D. Casement of 610 Humboldt and Clarence Arthur Walkwitz of 1122 Houston.

The National Tuscania Survivors' association of the A. E. F. scheduled its annual reunion for today in Sheboygan, Wis., but neither of the Manhattan men attended. Fred A. Duxbury of Sheboygan is president of the association.

Mr. Walkwitz, now in the civil service and employed as superintendent of construction at Fort Riley, recalled that 210 persons lost their lives when the ship was torpedoed by the Germans about 6 o'clock in the evening.

Approximately 1,000 soldiers got off the ship into life boats. Mr.

Casement and Mr. Walkwitz were among the 1,000 who stayed aboard and were rescued by a British destroyer shortly before the Tuscania sank about 9 p. m. It was a terrifying three-hour wait, watching the boat slowly sink, Mr. Walkwitz said. They landed on the northern shores of Ireland.

At that time Mr. Casement was a captain of artillery and Mr. Walkwitz a lieutenant of engineers.

Mr. Walkwitz later spent 17 months in France, and one of his most ticklish jobs there was removing German mines from the battlefields. German prisoners were assigned to the task, but they were so fearful the Allied troops did the work themselves. Mr. Walkwitz also was in the St. Michel and Argonne offensives.

CITY ENGINEER OF WHEATON ASKED TO QUIT

Property Owners Hurl 'Incompetence' Charge

Resignation of Clarence A. Walkwitz, Wheaton city engineer and building commissioner, was asked at a meeting of the Wheaton city council this week by the Wheaton Property Owners council.

The property owners charged Walkwitz with "incompetency" in enforcing the city building code. Mayor William A. Gamon said the council would take the matter under advisement. He has requested Walkwitz, who did not attend the meeting, to submit a written report on the charge.

"The charges are altogether unfounded," Walkwitz told THE TRIBUNE. He said he had no intention of resigning. Walkwitz said his written report probably would be ready for the city council meeting Monday.

Charges Are Made

Louis H. Feltmann, vice president of the South East Home Owners association, brought the charge before the city council. As group spokesman, he claimed Walkwitz has "failed to take action" in building code violations, and in many cases had "failed to enforce ordinances."

Several building code "violation" charges were made. Among them is the home under construction at 1117 Sunset rd. where a basement wall collapsed last week in a heavy rain storm. After the collapse, Walkwitz said he would prohibit use of 8 inch concrete block or 8 inch plain concrete basement walls unless reinforced by steel. The building code allows the 8 inch wall.

At the city council meeting, H. F. MacKay, building inspector, said the collapse was not caused by faulty construction, but by additional pressure on the walls caused by saturation of the soil around the foundation.

Walkwitz was appointed in November, 1950, upon recommendation of Mayor Gamon. He succeeded Gilbert Smith. Walkwitz's appointment was seconded by Commissioner Wallace M. Conley.

With Engineer Corps

Walkwitz, 57, has lived in Wheaton since 1941. In World War I he was a lieutenant with the corps of engineers. Walkwitz said he has been with engineering and construction firms in a supervisory capacity for more than 30 years.

The Wheaton Property Owners council consists of the South East Home Owners association, the North East Improvement association, Fairway Home Owners association, Western Wheaton Improvement association, and the Wheaton Gables Improvement association. William L. Utti, president of the Wheaton Gables association, also spoke at the council meeting.

Several citizens' groups last month asked the Wheaton city council to remove Walkwitz on the ground of incompetency. No action was taken on the requests.

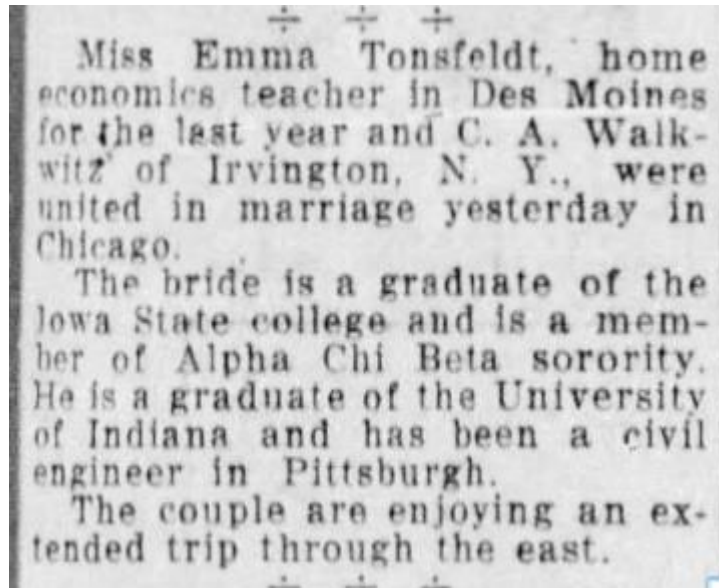
IBM Engineer Hurt In Owego Plant Fall
