



# WAS A SURVIVOR OF THE TUSCANIA

Rescued Passenger Fought With British Army and Is Now at Home

Special fo The Inquirer.

WILLIAMSPORT, Pa., June 16.— Corporal Bruce Woolever, who was a passenger on the Tuscania when it was sunk, and for a long time thereafter was believed to have perished, has returned to his home at Montoursville.

When the Tuscania was swallowed up by the ocean Woolever was taken with the other survivors to Brunsrene, Ireland, and cared for by the Red Cross. The dead were buried on the cliffs, over 300 feet above the water, off the point where the disaster took place.

Later the survivors were taken to England, given new equipment and placed in a training camp. Woolever was attached to the 42d Division for a time. Later he was transferred with his regiment to the British army, where he served until the close of the war.
