Vets Leader Emile Walle Killed; Highway 17 Claims Two Victims

Two traffic accidents claimed the lives of three persons Friday and yesterday, including longtime Santa Cruzan Emile E. Walle, 71, of 1025 Morrissey boulevard.

Also dead is a man identified as William Michael Dignon, 47, of East Palo Alto. At presstime early this morning, a passenger in the vehicle was still unidentified.

Walle was killed and his wife, Clarice, 68, received serious injuries when their automobile and another collided head-on late Friday morning on Zayante road near Graham Hill road in the Felton area.

California Highway patrolmen said the other vehicle, driven by Louis Chirone, 58, of San Francisco, apparently crossed the center line on a slight curve. Chirone, who also has a summer cabin at 4600 Zayante road, Felton, re-

ceived only minor injuries and was treated and released at Sisters hospital where he was taken by Santa Cruz Ambulance service. Mrs. Walle is reported in "fair" condition at the hospital where she underwent surgery for treatment of serious injuries. Officers said investigation of the accident is continuing.

The second accident took place early yesterday afternoon on Highway 17 near Vine Hill road about seven miles north of Santa Cruz. CHP officers said the southbound station wagon left the roadway, crashing into a 12-inch-thick oak tree some 15 feet down the embankment.

Both victims were pinned in the vehicle, which uprooted the tree by force of the impact.

Dignon, the driver, was identified by papers he carried. His passenger, another man in his 40's or 50's carried no identification, officials said. Funeral arrangements are pending at Irvin M. Smith and Sons mortuary.

Funeral services for Walle will

be held Wednesday at 10 a.m. at Smith's mortuary with Rev. Ed Muegge Jr. officiating. Interment will be at Golden Gate National cemetery, San Bruno.

Walle, a native of Belgium, came to the United States in 1912 to participate in international bicycle races.

The same year he moved to Santa Cruz where he lived, except for a few years spent in Sacramento.

He served in the army during World War I, and was permanently disabled when the USS Tuscania was torpedoed and sunk off the Irish coast in 1917. When he returned to Santa Cruz, he became active in veteran's affairs, and served three terms as commander of the Disabled American Veterans, Santa Cruz No. 52. He also held a 25-year pin for membership in the National Disabled American Veterans and received citations for his work, mainly for the Palo Alto veterans hospital.

Surviving besides his widow are: daughter, Georgette Fuschel

and her two children of San Andreas; and a stepson, Donald A. Bowers and stepdaughter, Mrs. Ernestine Wallace, both of Santa Cruz.

The trio of fatalities brings the year's county total to 28, as compared to 36 of last year at this time.

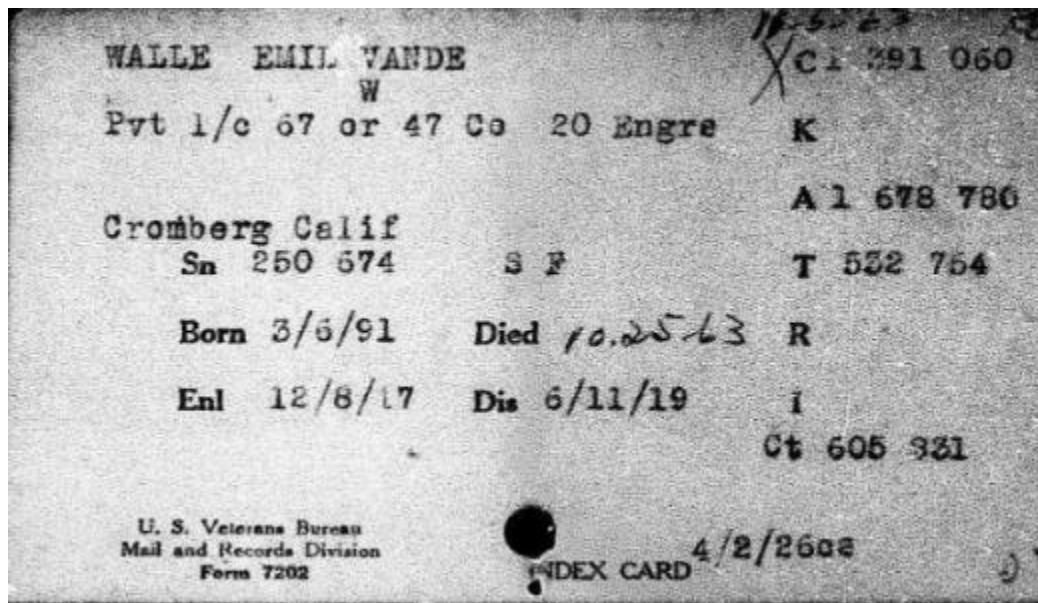

De jongste dochter Maria Vandewalle x Gustave Goethals zijn naar Wallonië uitgeweken; ze hadden een landbouwbedrijf in Warisoulx, een klein dorp nabij Namen. Hun dochter Germaine Goethals, geboren in 1927, stierf op de leeftijd van 39 jaar, nadat ze zich van het leven benam door vergiftiging.

De zoon Emile Vandewalle had een bewogen leven in Amerika. (Bron: Daniël Lansens 04.12.2020) [The son Emile had an eventful life in America.]

Op 22 september 1912 vertrok hij vanuit Liverpool met het schip Campania naar Ellis Island, New-York Amerika. [On 22 September 1912 departed from Liverpool on the ship "Campania" to Ellis Island, New York, America.] Hij werd Amerikaans soldaat en nam actief deel aan de eerste wereldoorlog, bij de 17e company, 20e Engineers. [He became an American soldier and took an active part in the first world war.] Met het troepentransportschip, de SS Tuscania, zou hij naar het slagveld in Europa overgebracht worden, maar op 5 februari 1918 werd het schip in de Ierse Zee door de Duitsers getorpedeerd. [With the troopship, the SS "Tuscania," he would be transferred to the battlefield in Europe, but on 5 February 1918 the ship was torpedoed in the Irish Sea by the German.] Emil kon gered worden. [Emil could be saved.] Hij keerde in mei 1919 als soldaat 1e klasse terug uit de oorlog. [He returned from the war as a soldier in May 1919.] Toch kwam hij niet ongeschonden uit deze oorlog; hij was voor de rest van zijn leven gehandicapt. [Yet he did not come out of this war unscathed; he was disabled for the rest of his life.] Na de oorlog diende hij drie termijnen als commandant van de gehandicapte veteranen in Santa Cruz. [After the war, he served three terms as commander of the disabled veterans in Santa Cruz.] Hij zette zich jaren lang in voor de oorlogsveteranen, die hem een ereteken van de National Disabled Veterans Association opleverde. [He devoted himself to the war veterans for years; which earned him a badge of honor from the National Disabled Veterans Association.] Hij woonde voornamelijk in Santa Cruz maar ook enige tijd in Sacramento. [He lived mainly in Santa Cruz but also for some time in Sacramento.]

Volgens de volkstelling van 1920 is Emil, samen met Hector Ondanck en Arthur Vermeulen werkzaam in een timmermanszaak in Hilt, Siskiyou Californië. [According to the 1920 census, Emil, along with Hector Ondanck and Arthur Vermeulen, worked in a carpenter shop in Hilt, Siskiyou, California.] Hector Ondanck was de zoon van Henricus en Maria Vandewalle, de zuster van Augustinus Vandewalle en dus de neef van Emile Vandewalle. [Hector Ondanck was the son of Henricus and Maria Vandewalle, the sister of Augustinus

Vandewalle, and therefore Emile's cousin.] Hector kwam op 2 mei 1905 aan op Ellis Island New-York. [Hector arrived on 2 May 1905 at Ellis Island, New York.] Hij maakte de oversteek met het schip Zeeland vanuit Antwerpen. [He made the crossing with the ship "Zeeland" from Antwerp.] Hector keerde terug naar België en trouwde op 5 maart 1913 in Oostkamp met Marie Louise Vermeulen. [Hector returned to Belgium and married Marie Louise Vermeulen on 5 March 1913 in Oostkamp.] Het koppel zette reeds op 21 maart 1913 terug voet aan wal in Amerika. [The couple set foot back in America on 21 March 1913.] Hun eerste dochter Flora werd op 2 december 1913 in Santa Cruz geboren. [Their first daughter Flora was born in Santa Cruz on 2 December 1913.] In 1915 volgde Julia en in 1917 Arthur. [Julia followed in 1915 and Arthur in 1917.] Niettegenstaande getrouwd met kinderen, liet hij zich in 1917-1918 als soldaat registreren. [Married with children, he registered as a soldier in 1917-1918.] Hector overleed op 27 mei 1936, op 50-jarige leeftijd. [Hector died on 27 May 1937, at the age of 50 years.]

Arthur Vermeulen werd geboren op 28 februari 1893 in Hertsberge en vertrok eveneens naar Amerika. [Arthur Vermeulen was born on 28 February 1893, in Hersberge and also left for America.] Hij zat samen met Emil op de getorpedeerde Tuscania. [He and Emil were on the torpedoed "Tuscania."] Hector Ondanck was zijn schoonbroer. [Hector Ondanck was his brother-in-law.] In 1921 kwam Emil kort terug naar Zwevezele en trouwde er op 30 mei 1921 met de in Zwevezele wonende Febronie Lava, geboren op 25 januari 1899 in Landegem. [In 1921, Emil briefly returned to Zwevezele and married on 30 May 1921 Zwevezele resident Febronie Lava, born on 25 January 1899 in Landegem.] De ouders van Emile zijn hierbij aanwezig en ondertekenden beide de akte. [Emile's parents are present and both signed the deed.] Theophiel Lava, vader van de bruid is niet aanwezig en heeft vermoedelijk sedert meer dan 6 maanden België verlaten. [Theophile Lava, father of the bride, is not present and has probably left Belgium for more than six months.] Blijkbaar was Theophiel reeds in december 1920 in Ruislede overleden. [Apparently Theophiel had already died in December 1920 in Ruislede.] De akte werd eveneens ondertekend door Arthur Vermeulen. [The deed was also signed by Arthur Vermeulen.] Arthur was eveneens zijn geluk gaan zoeken in Amerika en was een goede vriend van Emile. [Arthur had also gone to try his luck in America and was a good friend of Emile.] Na hun huwelijk trok het jonge koppel in 1921 terug naar Amerika. [After their marriage, the young couple returned to America in 1921.] We vinden hen beiden terug op de immigratielijsten. [We find them both on the immigration lists.] In Amerika kregen ze een dochter Georgette Vandewalle, geboren op 20 april 1922 in Susanville, 280km ten noorden van Sacramento, Californië. [In America they

had a daughter Georgette Vandewalle, born on 20 April 1922 in Susanville, 280 kilometers north of Sacramento, California.] In 1931 verkreeg Emil officieel het Amerikaans staatsburgerschap. [In 1931 Emile officially obtained American citizenship.]

In 1933 scheidde Emile van Febronie, die hertrouwde met Emer Emart. [In 1933 Emile divorced Febronie, who remarried Emer Emart.] Ze stierf op 23 februari 1967 in Merced Californië. [She died on 27 February 1967 in Merced, California.]

In 1934, een jaar na de scheiding hertrouwde Emil, zoals hij in Amerika werd genoemd, met Philomene Cools. [In 1934, Emil, as he was called in America, remarried, to Philomene Cools.] Zij was 13 jaar ouder dan Emil en eerder weduwe geworden van Edward Cools. [She was 13 years older than Emil and was widowed earlier from Edward Cools.] Philomene stierf op 1 januari 1953. [Philomene died on 1 January 1953.]

Op 26 juni 1954 trouwde Emil in Reno voor de derde maal. [On 26 June 1954, Emil married for the third time, in Reno.]

Frances Maude Boekenooogen Isliker was eerder weduwe geworden van Ernest Arthur Isliker. [Frances Maude Bokenoogen Isliker had previously been widowed from Ernest Arthur Isliker.] Slechts 2 jaar later stierf Frances Maude op 15 april 1956. [Frances Maude died only two years later, on 15 April 1956.]

Emil trouwde voor een vierde keer, ditmaal met Clarice Irish Salven. [Emil married for a fourth time, this time to Clarice Irish Slaven - misspelled in this sentence.] Ook zij was eerder weduwe geworden van John Joseph Slaven. [She too had been previously widowed, from John Joseph Slaven.]

Op 25 oktober 1963 kwam Emil om bij een verkeersongeval. [On 25 October 1963 Emil died in a traffic accident.] Hij werd 71 jaar. [He was 71 years old.] Hij ligt begraven op de Golden Gate National Cemetery, San Bruno nabij San Francisco. [He was buried in Golden Gate National Cemetery, San Bruno, near San Francisco.]

George W. Shreve Tells V.F.W. About Blue And Gray Reunion, Gettysburg

Mixing humor with serious observation, George Shreve told about his trip to the Blue and Gray reunion at Gettysburg before scores of friends who honored him last night in a public program at Veterans' Memorial hall.

Chairman of the evening was Commander V. L. Smith of the local post of Veterans of Foreign Wars, sponsor of the program.

Mr. Shreve kept his audience laughing frequently as he recounted some of the humorous aspects of his trip.

Brief talks were given by Mrs. Rose Rostron, Ada Bastedo, Emmet Rittenhouse, and Sutton Christian (who was Shreve's attendant at Gettysburg).

Rittenhouse, first commander of the local V.F.W. post, recalled that he had camped during the Spanish-American war near Falls church, Mr. Shreve's native community, and he told of several experiences during his "impressionable years" in Virginia.

Escorted to seats of honor by Lester C. Davis, officer of the day, were Mrs. Bastedo, daughter of the War of 1812; Mrs. Rostron, supervisor of Branciforte district; Mr. Rittenhouse; C. R. Bridges, commander of the Monterey Bay County Council of the Veterans of Foreign Wars; T. H. Rogerson, national chief of staff of the Marine Corps League; Emil Walle, representing Disabled American Veterans; Arnold Baldwin, past commander of the local post of American Legion; Mrs. Henry Hagquist, president of the Veterans of Foreign Wars Auxiliary of Santa Cruz; and Martha Fields, president of Watsonville auxiliary of V. F. W.

Letters From Wounded Have Future Value

Parents, wives and sweethearts of men in the armed forces were urged yesterday by Emil Walle, commander of the Santa Cruz chapter of Disabled American Veterans, to save all letters written by servicemen, especially those who are disabled in action. Commander Walle said the letters will be of great value in proving disability claims after the war.

"It is a safe bet," he said, "that records of the present war will be similar to those of World War 1, and will fail in many instances to show hospitalization or treatment for sickness, wounds or disabilities suffered in service. When the time comes to prove the service-connection of some ailment, it will be difficult to do so if the official record has been lost or misplaced and if there is no substantiating evidence.

"The letters come in as valuable evidence and are accepted as such by the veteran's administration."

The Santa Cruz Chapter of Disabled American Veterans is helping work out problems involving protective measures for men in the service as well as those now being released because of disability.

The disabled American Veterans is incorporated by an act of congress as the voice of men disabled in defense of the nation.

Emil had 4 wives. He divorced his 1st wife Febronie (the mother of his biological daughter) – was preceded in death by his 2<sup>nd</sup> wife, Philomene (who was 13 years older than he was) and 3<sup>rd</sup> wife Frances (who lived only 2 years after their wedding)- and was survived by his 4<sup>th</sup>

wife, Clarice. Febronie remarried after their divorce – Philomene and Frances were widows when Emil married them – and Clarice had been married 3 times before her marriage to Emil.
