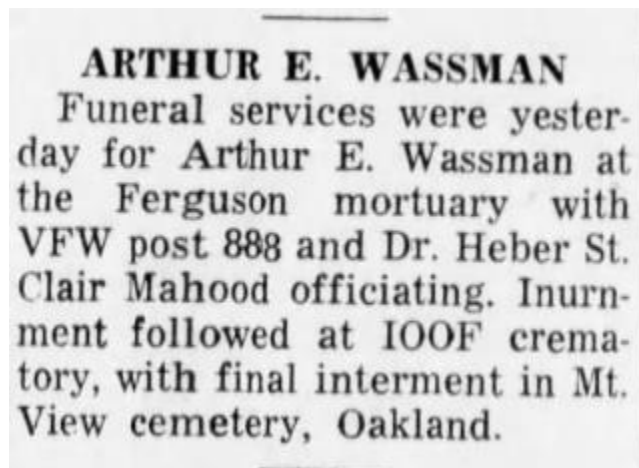

Many Santa Cruzans are looking forward with keen anticipation to the Art League's fourth annual Beaux Arts ball, to be Saturday evening in Coconut Grove, with festivities starting at 9 o'clock with a Pageant of Nations and costume parade.

Some persons are asking "What is a Beaux Arts Ball and when did it originate?"

According to authorities on the subject, the "Bal des Quatres Arts" is a long-standing tradition that dates back to 1892, staged by the Paris School of Beaux Arts. The ball is named after the school's four arts: architecture, painting, sculpture and engraving.

Fashionable Parisians dressed to look like gods and goddesses of ancient Rome. Numerous legends are woven about the frolics of the eternal gods and goddesses when they departed from Olympus to mingle with mortals.

About 1 o'clock, the grand procession began and with eyes masked, the figures danced about with sky blue, chalk white, green and purple vying for supremacy, as a barrage of balloons cascaded above the merry-makers. The grand march of Aida was always played and prizes were awarded for best costumes.

Superior Judge George Samuels today called the March jury panel. Out of fifty men and women in the venire only one failed to answer. Bailiffs were unable to find John L. Todd, 307 Peralta Apartments, Oakland, and his name was stricken from the list. None of the jurors summoned asked to be excused from duty, probably because Judge Samuels, in an address made to a civic club several days ago, declared he would make it hard going for anyone seeking to evade jury service.

JURY TAMPERING CHARGE SECURES MAN NEW TRIAL

Asserting that he was convinced that Mrs. Katrina Wassman, juror in the burglary trial of Peter Martiolli, was the one who first opened the conversation between herself and Robert Jarvis, complaining witness in the case, Superior Judge Lincoln S. Church today granted Martiolli's request for a new trial on the grounds that his conviction had followed misconduct on the part of a juror.

Mrs. Wassman several days ago precipitated a court investigation by reporting to Judge Church that Jarvis had approached her in the court house corridor and asked her to acquit Martiolli. During the investigation Jarvis produced witnesses who testified that they had seen Mrs. Wassman first speak to Jarvis.

Upon the granting of the new trial for Martiolli today, Deputy District Attorney Wade Snook announced the intention of the district attorney's office to appeal. Martiolli is accused of having robbed a barber shop operated by Jarvis at 468 Twelfth street.

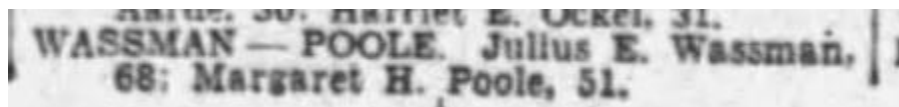

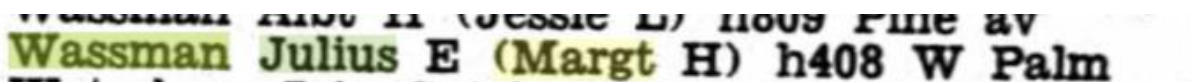

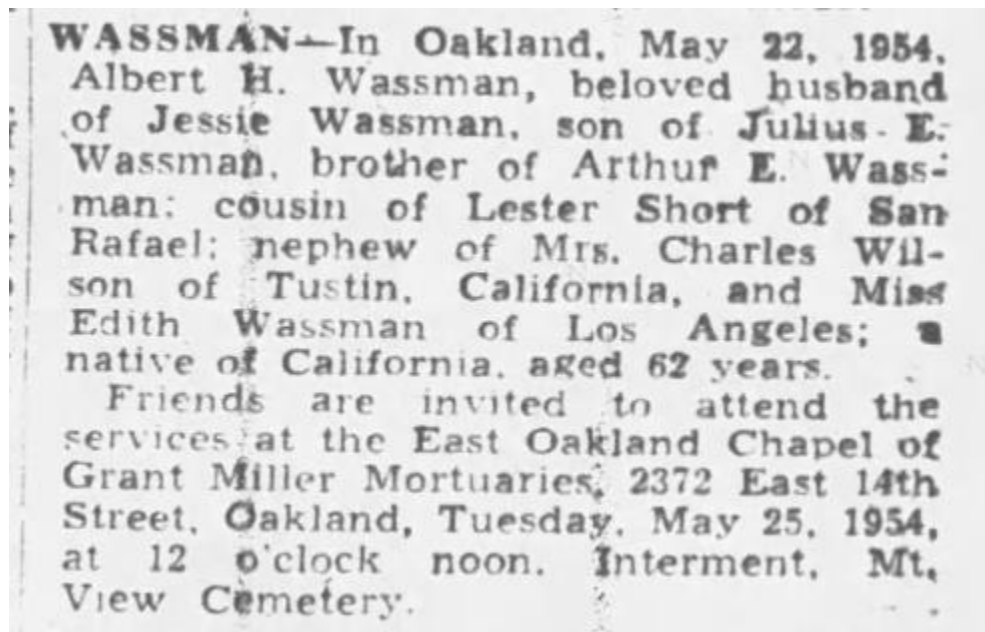
