Mr. Waddingham died Wednesday at San Diego. He was Avalon city manager from 1920 to 1928 and had been connected with the Santa Catalina Island Company since the close of the World War.

CITY ENGINEER, WATTS

Not an experimenter who might cost the city money, but a practical engineer with plenty of satisfactory results to show for his work is what the city of Watts secured when they gave over their engineering problems two years ago to Mr. Waddingham.

Young, bright, ambitious, still on the shady side of thirty, his native town Ft. Bascom, N. M., may well expect to chronicle his advancement in his chosen profession. Equipped with a good education, other than college, and successively engaged in irrigation, mining and municipal work covering ten years' actual service, the municipal work now in course of completion or contemplated at Watts is in good hands.

To show just what is being done in Watts the work on fourteen streets is under way; four miles of cement work is in; a sewer and drainage system is contemplated; and the total cost of all improvements will total \$110,000, of which \$50,000 is now available from a recent bond sale—and all of this work is under the direct supervision of A. B. Waddingham, city engineer of Watts.

HOPES W. C. T. U. WON'T STOP TOBACCO

LOS ANGELES, March 16.—Our men aboard the Tuscania behaved like veteran heroes. Amid all of the excitement and all of the terror which comes to those in mid-ocean when they know their ship is sinking, not a man showed it outwardly. I was glad to see how they took it. The English said the discipline could not have been better."

In this brief yet graphic manner Capt. A. B. Waddingham, attached to an engineering company of the American expeditionary force, on board the Tuscania, torpedoed February 5, writes to his wife at her home, 1616 Reid street, this city.

"The only thing I saved was my berth assignment card on the ship. That I am sending to you as a souvenir," writes Waddingham. "Arriving in Ireland everything was done for us.

"The Red Cross is doing fine work and those who needed money got it from them. I have changed my opinion of the Y. M. C. A. The men in charge are real men and they made us at home in their huts. I lost all the sweaters and things you so lovingly knitted, also the things you helped me get, but I came out with the locket and pen you gave me.

"I get three meals a day and enjoy

them, except the coffee. I was around to canteen to get some tobacco, but the Tommies had had a payday and it was gone. English tobacco is not good. The Y. M. C. A. carries the best tobacco, and I hope the W. C. T. U. don't stop any American tobacco on its way here."

TUSCANIA SURVIVOR BACK FROM WAR ZONE.

**LOS ANGELES ENGINEER SAW
MUCH SERVICE OVERSEAS;
WAS GASSED TWICE.**

On board the Tuscania when it was sunk by a German torpedo in the Irish Sea, twice gassed and once wounded by a bursting bomb and once knocked unconscious by flying rocks and timbers from a building wrecked by shellfire, Capt. Albert B. Waddingham, 1616 Reed street, returned yesterday from the war zone.

Capt. Waddingham, who is an engineer, received his commission and was sent to France in January, 1918. On February 5 the Tuscania, on which he sailed, was sunk in the Irish Sea, and, although many were lost, Capt. Waddingham found a seat in a lifeboat and landed on the coast of Ireland. From Ireland he was sent to England and then to France.

During the captain's first six months of service he was attached to the French army and saw much action with the French engineers. He also saw service with the First, Second and Eighty-eighth divisions of the American army. Although Capt. Waddingham took part in none of the greater battles of the war, he was in the front-line trenches and under artillery fire almost the entire period of his service with the American Expeditionary Forces.

German gas caught Capt. Waddingham twice while serving with the French army, and while with the American forces in the Toul sector he was struck by a piece of bursting bomb, but only slightly wounded. Later he was knocked unconscious, but not wounded, by a bursting shell. Capt. Waddingham stated yesterday that, following a short rest, he would reopen offices in the Tajo Building.

"GO EASY" ON LAW VIOLATORS, AVALON OFFICIAL WRITES

Los Angeles.—James E. Bond, chief of the dry squad of the Los Angeles county sheriff's office, made public here a letter he said he had received from A. B. Waddingham, city manager of Avalon, Santa Catalina island, off shore from San Pedro, asking the sheriff's office to overlook violations of the state prohibition enforcement act at Avalon.

Bond's forces seized twenty cases of liquor at a house in Avalon and the dry squad chief declared that he intended to continue enforcing the Wright act there despite Waddingham's purported assertion that "the citizenship of Avalon does not desire arrests and prosecutions for technical violations of the Wright act."

Waddingham's letter, as given out by Bond, also said:

"As you know, this is a pleasure resort and we are dependent on tourists who come here during the short summer season for our livelihood to carry us through the entire year. So long as people are not guilty of disorderly conduct we are satisfied. It would be a very serious handicap if it should become known that, while people have conducted themselves in an orderly manner, they had been arrested for the possession of liquor for their personal use."

Waddingham, 1535 Second Ave. W., who lost his life when the automobile in which he was returning home from Mount Rainier, with three daughters and a son-in-law, dropped 75 feet down an embankment on the Nisqually Canyon road Sunday evening.

The steering gear on the left wheel broke. Waddingham's son-in-law, E. E. Scofield, who was at the wheel, had almost succeed in stopping the car when it moved forward just far enough to take the fatal drop 75 feet into the canyon.

On the way down, the machine struck a tree, crushing Waddingham to death and pinning Scofield beneath the machine.

Waddingham's daughters, Mrs. Scofield, Mrs. George Hughes of Canton, O., and Miss Florence Waddingham were thrown clear of the car. They rolled down the hill and were picked up at the bottom and rushed to Eatonville hospital with Mr. Scofield on a hand car. They escaped with slight injuries with the exception of Mrs. Hughes, who suffered a broken and dislocated hip.

Until the return of the body, said relatives today, no funeral arrangements will be made.

The victim of the accident was former president of the Master Builder's Association of this city, where he had lived 22 years, and at the time of his death was vice president and sales manager of the Puget Sound & Alaska Power Company.

Waddingham came here 22 years ago from Riverside, Cal. His wife died four months ago.
