



#### Two Attala Boys Lost.

The hearts of our people were made sad the first part of the week when the news reached us through the newspapers that two Attala county boys were reported missing after the sinking of the transport Tuscania, off the coast of Ireland. Their names are Thomas F. Wasson and Homer Pullin. Mr. Wasson is a son of Mrs. M. F. Wasson, of Kosciusko. He had been enlisted in the service of the government only a few months. Few people. if any, besides his family, knew that he was on the Tuscania. Mr. Pullin is from the neighborhood of French Camp. We do not know to which of the Pullin families he belongs, since there are several families of that name in the northern part of the county.

The sympathies of the entire citizenry of the county are with the grieved families of these two noble young men who have given their lives for their country as truly as though they had been killed in line of battle. #### AN ATTALA COUNTY BOY WENT DOWN WITH THE "TUSCANIA"

Official dispatches from Washington, giving the revised list of those lost on the Tuscania, contain the name of Thomas S. Wasson, post office Kosciusko, Miss. This young man gave his life for his country, just as truly if he had been slain upon the battlefield. His life blood was poured out a libation to Liberty, and calls loudly for vengeance. That the soldier boys of Attala county, as well as the boys from every county in Mississippi will remember his death when they meet the enemy, there is little doubt.

It was the memory of the murder of Travis, Crockett, and Bowie at the Alamo that won San Jacinto, and Texas independence. Just so the memory of the brave and heroic Wasson will strike down his murderers at the hands of Mississippi boys.

#### Resolutions on the Death of Mr. Fred Wasson.

Whereas, i has been ascertained that Mr. Fred Wasson, beloved son of our sister, Mrs. M. F. Wasson, lost his life recently when the British transport Tuscania went down at the hands of a German submarine, we, the members of the Woman's Missionary Society of the First Methodist Church, Kosciusko, Miss., of which the deceased was a faithful member, and in memory of his life and expressive of our appreciation of him and sympathy for his mother and sisters, we offer the following resolutions:

- (1). That while we deplore his untimally death, we rejoice in the heroic and self-sacrificing spirit which prompted him to spare not himself in such noble service. It has been truly affirmed that "We are as near Heaven by sea as by land."
- (2). That it is the sense of this body that the town of Kosciusko has lost one of its most exemplary young men; that the First Methodist Church, has lost a devoted, consistent, and appreciated member, and that the cause of hu manity has lest one of her most worthy and fearless heroes. He fell in the path of highest duty.

- (3). Be it resolved that we extend to Sister Wasson and her family our deepest sympathy in their bereavement, and assure them of our love and prayerful interests.
- (a). In that we share with them as far as we may, this tremendous loss, the statement that "death loves a shining mark," was abundantly verified when the b dy of Fred Wasson sank beneath the turbulent waves, but Fred gave his life unselfishly for all that is dear and sacred to our institutions, our homes, our Christianity, and our civilization, and the Great Father who doeth all things well, has only permitted this life to asseend into the higher and fuller realities, where there are happiness and reward.
- (4). Resolved, siso, that a copy of these resolutions be farnished the family of Sister Wasson, one each to the papers of this city, and one to the New Orleans Christian Advocate.

Resolutions On the Death of Fred Wasson by Kosciusko Methodist Sunday School.

Whereas, having learned of the death of Mr. Fred Wasson, beloved son of Mrs. M. F. Wasson, of this city, who recently lost his life in the sinking of the British transport as a result of the ruthless submarine campuign conducted by the Germans, we the members of the Methodist Sunday School, of Kosclusko, Miss., of which the deceased was a "regular attendant, consecrated and devoted Christian member, and in memory of his membership, his presence, bistlife, his helpful and beneficial influence, and sympathy for his mother and sisters, we submit the following resolutions:



#### THOMAS FREDERICK WASSON

We gladly give space to the following letter from the Capt. of Fred Wasson's Company to his mother here.

Peace to the ashes and and a nations gratitude to the noble boy, and sympathy to his loved ones especially his mother.

Head Q. Co.D. 6th Bn. 20 Engrs A.E.F.—April 9, 1918.

To the Parents of Thomas Fred Wasson:

It is with deep regret and heavy heart that I write you regarding the death of your patriotic son Fred, who was a member of Co. D. 6th Bn 20th Engineers.

As you know we were aboard of the ill-fated steam ship Tuscania, which was torpedoed off the north coast of Ireland at 5:50 P.M. Feb.5, 1918.

On this particular day Fred was well and in fine spirits and when we were struck, marched to his life boat station with coolness, got off in the boat assigned to him, and got safely away from the ship. All went well with the boat until the shores of the Isle of Isla, were reached, just off the Scottish coast.

By this time the sea had become very rough, and being dark
tabout 2:00 a.m. of Feb. 6th, the
boat was broken to pieces on the
rocks before the occupants realized their danger. Though all
were equipped with, and had on
life belts, they were of little use
on such a rocky coast.

r. Fred's body was recovered the next day and, together with others, were buried with military honors by the survivers, assisted by the Scottish authorities and the people of the island. The kind Scottish people were very tender in their care of both the living and the dead, and lavished a profusion of flowers on the caskets of those who are no longer with us. Poor fellows, now sleeping this last sleep with the solemn music of the ocean, beating against the sturdy rock cliff; this will be their requiem. Gone but not forgotten by loved ones at home and comrades abroad.

No. 7 Charlott St., Port Ellen, Islay, Scotland. this gentle man stated that he would be very glad to learn from the people of the men who rest in Port Ellen, and that no expense would be spared to grant their wishes so far as possible.

We who survived will not forget those who were lost, and while our time my come later; we hope that we may be spared until we can render some payment to the pirates who caused so many to go permature ly.



James Alexander Wasson was born June 14, 1840, Green County, Georgia, the son of John Alexander and Eliza Bush Copeland Wasson, who were married May 16, 1833, in Green County, Georgia. He received his medical degree from Tulane University, New Orleans, La.

James Alexander Wasson lived in Attala County from about 1860, and practiced medicine in Attala County for approximately 40 years, until his death December 19, 1909. He also served as dentist for some of his patients.

He was a Mason, a steward in the Methodist Church at Liberty Chapel and later in the Methodist Church at Ethel. He was superintendent of the Sunday school at McCord School.

During the Civil War he served in the family Tan Yard, making shoes and harness for Army use in Confederate Army.

He was first married to Ella G. Smith on October 12, 1865, and to this union were born the following children: Ellen, who died in infancy; John Housman, who received his medical degree from Tulane; Jane (Thompson); Naomie Elizabeth (Bell); Nellie Bush (Little); William James, who married Mattie Lucile Brooks; Queen Adrameda (Miller); and Dr. Ulysses Smith Wasson who married Annie Mae Dean.






