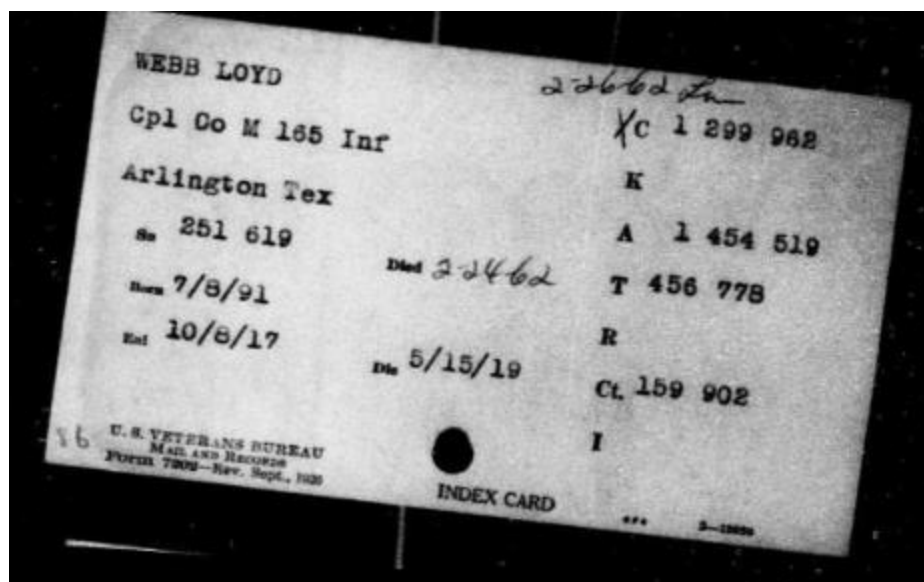

Last Monday afternoon Loyd Webb while trying to rescue a couple of hogs from the turbulent waters of "Mill Branch," noticed two of his favorite Plymouth Rock roosters go drifting by with the muddy tide. 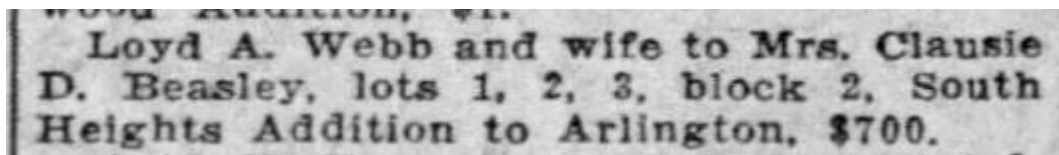

All Houses in Arlington Now Numbered Correctly

ARLINGTON, Sept. 24.—Houses of all the folks in Arlington—like it or not—were correctly numbered for the first time Tuesday.

For a month, L. H. Huff and Lloyd Webb have gone from house to house placing new and different numbers.

Patiently, to each householder, they repeated their story of Arlington for the past many years, of

mixed-up numbers, of numbers starting with "5" in the fourth block, of numbers in sequence separated by as much as two blocks and of odd and even numbers on the same side of a street.

"Arlington has at last grown up, and neatly and correctly numbered houses will add much civically," they repeated again and again.

Some few of the folks didn't like the idea, they reported, but by and large the reshuffling was welcome. So Tuesday everybody had a brand new number.

The whole thing started with the building of the new \$67,000 post-office, and the renumbering was necessary so the mail could be kept straight, even though the mailman knows practically everyone hereabouts.

The work included a survey of the entire city. Now all east and west streets are evenly numbered on the south sides and all north and south streets are evenly numbered on the west sides.

Oldtime residents blame the former mixup on the fact that Abram Street was not considered a street (no one remembers exactly why) when the interurban tracks formerly were located there.

Man Hangs Self in Jail

ARLINGTON, March 22.—Burford Wayne Richardson, 22, employe of the North American Aviation Corporation at Dallas for 13 months and a resident of Handley, was found hanged in the city jail here early Sunday by Police Sergeant Lloyd Webb.

Chief of Police A. B. Cribbs stated that Richardson was jailed shortly after 2 a. m. on a charge of intoxication.

Richardson's body, hanging from the cell bar by his leather belt, was discovered at 7:30 a. m.

Justice of the Peace Marion C. Dalby returned the verdict of suicide.

Survivors are his mother, Mrs. R. A. Richardson of Handley, four brothers, A. T. Richardson of Wayland, Rayford Richardson of Abilene, Wendell Richardson of Handley and Clayton Richardson of the United States Navy, and four sisters, Mrs. R. W. Smith and Mrs. L. A. Robertson of Odessa, Mrs. G. A. Gesparek of Wichita Falls and Mrs. M. L. Agme of Cisco.

The body was taken to Cisco, where funeral services will be held Monday afternoon. Interment will be in the Cisco cemetery.

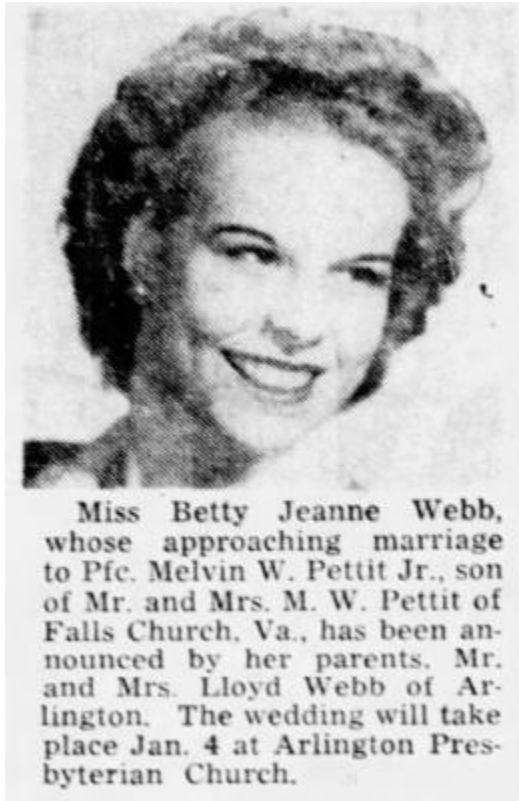

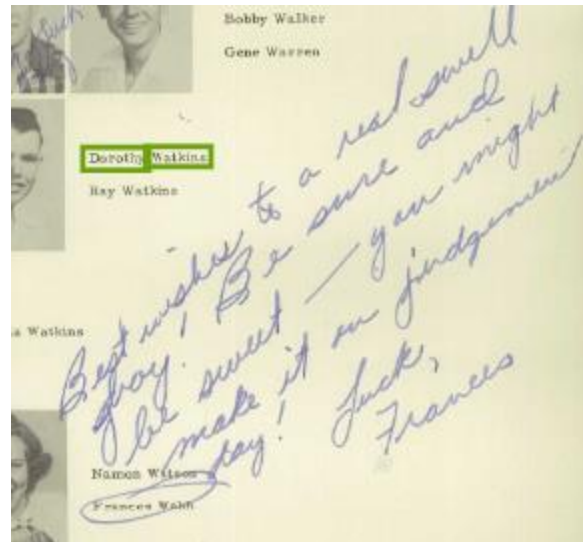
