

201 in Henryetta.





MORRIS BOY WAS A TUSCANIA SURVIVOR

Sunday's Okmulgee Democrat says: "At 11 o'clock last night a telegram was received by the Democrat from Secretary T. T. Blakely at Washington, stating that Earl Sumner of Morris, who was on board the torpedoed transport Tuscania, was safe. The telegram also stated that forty other Oklahomans are reported safe, but does not mention William J. Weber of Henryetta who was also on board. Weber has a brother in Okmulgee, who is anxiously awaiting news from Washington. Secretary Blakely states that the list of Oklahomans saved is not yet complete."

In addition the above information Mrs. R. H. Ferguson, mother of Earl Sumner, received a cablegram from him Saturday night stating that he had landed safely in England.

Sumper was a Morris barber and his name was among the first thousand drawn in the selective draft. He went to Camp Travis with Okmulgee county's first contingent.

HENRYETTAN IN WAR ZONE SENDS SOUVENIRS HOME

MRS. WILLIAM WEBBER MADE PRESENT OF SHELLS WHICH SENT MISERY INTO HEART OF KAISER WILHELM.

Mrs. William Webber of this city, is in receipt of two souveniers from the western battle front in France, sent to her by her husband William €Bill) Webber, who is now in the 7 thick of the fighting. The souveniers are made from empty shells of the French 75s, and are in the form of vases, the handicraft of Private Webber, a blacksmith.

On one of the shells is the date 1914, while on the other is 1918, the first figure representing the beginning of the worlds war and the second 8 represents the year in which America began to take an active part in the b great conflict. The brass is handsomely hammered and the work shows the handicraft of the maker, who apparently took great pains in his arrangement of the souveniers.

muskogee2 The date of the marriage is April 3, 1887. They were married in the home of Green Crowder, who was Maggie's guardian, because she was 16 yrs old. William was 25. It was his second marriage, her first of course. They were married in Monroe County, IL.

I am still searching for the marriage license of John Weber and my grandmother. She was married in between Weber and Crowder to a John Smith. I have a copy of that record also, but not the divorce record. He lived in Kimmswick, Mo. That license shows Maggie as 20 and John as 23. They were married in Jefferson County, MO.

A family story tells that when William Crowder died (of measles!) in 1889, Green Crowder hired John Smith to court and marry Maggie to transfer ownership of a farm given William and Maggie when they married. It happened, and then the divorce from John Smith followed. We lose Maggie then until the census shows her married to John Weber, with children of his, hers, and theirs in the home in St Louis, in 1900.

My dad and uncle were born in Feb of 1905 and John Weber died of pneumonia in August of the same year.


At the time of his death my grandparents lived at 2113 DeKalb, in St Louis.

ST. LCUIS, Mo., Aug. 28.—(Spe-up vere bequeathed to each of the cirl.)—Suit for a one-eleventh share ten heirs. The suit was filed by B. of an estate valued at \$100,000 based L. Matthews.

on an ante-nuptial contract alleged to have been made in 1871, was filed at Clayton today by William Kilius, a blacksmith of Henryetta, Okla., against the ten heirs of the estate of John Heintz, who died in St. Louis county in May, 1913.

The petition asserts that Mrs. Wilhelmina Kilius, a widow, with one son, William, then 2 years old, agreed to marry John Heintz if he would adopt her son and treat him in every respect as their own child. With this understanding, the petition alleges, they were married in 1872. Mrs. Wilhelmina Kilius Heintz died the following year.

The child was apprenticed as a blacksmith and in his young manhood moved to Oklahoma. When his stepfather died, it is alleged, Kilius was not mentioned in the will, by which sums of property values from \$1,000 up were bequeathed to each of the ten heirs. The suit was filed by B. L. Matthews.

According to the family story cited above: Following the death of his son William, Green allegedly hired John Smith of Kimmswick ME to court and marry his daughter-in-law Maggie so that Smith could transfer ownership of a farm given to his son William & Maggie when they married.
