

EX-BUILE MAN, TUSCANIA HERO, IS GUN VICTIM Thomas Weir, Saved With 40 Others When Trans-

port Sank Feb. 5, 1918, Passes at Deer Lodge.

Thomas Weir, 45, former Butte World war veteran, who survived the torpedoing and sinking of the transport Tuscania in the Irish channel, Feb. 5, 1918, died this morning in a Deer Lodge hospital from a gunshot wound in his abdomen.

Weir, who had been employed by the Milwaukee railroad as a substation operator at Morel, 22 miles west of Butte, with 40 other American soldiers, was taken from a raft off the coast of Scotland clad only in his underwear and wrapped in a blanket after the Canadian ship carrying United States troops had sank, taking 213 other soldiers to the bottom with her.

The former soldier was found yesterday by George Huffman, wounded and unconscious, in the Hoover creek district 18 miles northwest of Deer Lodge. Huffman notified Mrs. Bernard Sauber of Gold Creek, who (Continued On Page Two) TUSCANIA HERO IS GUN VICTIM

(Continued From Page One) in turn notified the sheriff's office in Deer Lodge. Weir was brought to the Deer Lodge hospital, where he died without regaining consciousness.

His wife, Florice, and two children. James and Thomas, were with him shortly before he died at 3:15 o'clock.

City Attorney E. M. Keeley, Sheriff Fred Valiton and Coroner R. W. Ross left at noon today for Hoover creek to investigate the shooting. Undersheriff Charles Smolack previously expressed the belief that the shooting was accidental. Weir was found dressed in hunting clothes and apparently had been hunting.

His rifle was found lying beside him, officers said. Sheriff's deputies said they did not know the caliber bullet with which he had been wounded as the bullet was lost when it passed through his body.

Weir was born in Los Angeles, Calif. When a young man he came to Butte and had made his home here for about 15 years. He left several years ago for Morel. He was a member of Silver Bow post No. 1, American Legion. Ralph Rand, post commander, today recalled Weir's war record and told of his sensational rescue from the icy waters of the Irish channel.

TRAGIC DRAMA IN FORESTS CLAIMS LIFE

Hunter Mistaken for Animal And Fatally Wounded by Aged Trapper

Special to The Tribune.

DEER LODGE, Nov. 18.—A tragic drama of Montana forests was enacted when George Huffman, 80, pioneer Powell county trapper, mistook Thomas Weir, 45, former Butte World war veteran, for an animal and shot him fatally, according to Sheriff Fred Valiton.

Huffman, Sheriff Valiton says, confessed to him that he fired the fatal shot. The trapper said he is nearsighted and did not know his target was a human until after he had fired and investigated.

Weir was found unconscious in the Hoover creek district, 18 miles northwest of Deer Lodge, with a bullet wound in his abdomen. He was brought to a Deer Lodge hospital, where he died. Huffman was arrested shortly after Weir was found shot but his arrest was not made known until Huffman's purported confession was announced.

Saw Moving Object

According to the sheriff, Huffman said he was engaged in his usual routine of hunting and tending his trap lines. He sighted a moving object about 100 yards away in a clearing in the timber and fired. He was horrified, he said, when he discovered he had shot a man.

Huffman went to his cabin near the clearing where Weir was wounded, Valiton said Huffman told him, and returned with a blanket, on which he laid the wounded man. The trapper then went to the Gordon ranch near by and summoned help.

Bernard Sauber was called on the telephone by the Gordons and Sauber notified the sheriff's office at Deer Lodge. Deputy Charles Smollack responded to the call, accompanied by Dr. R. E. Brogan of Deer Lodge. Huffman was placed under arrest and brought to Deer Lodge, where he was incarcerated in the county jail for investigation in the shooting.

Deer Lodge Hunter Wounded by Shot From Another's Gun







DEER LODGE, Nov. 16.-U.P.-A gunshot wound today resulted in the death of Thomas Weir, 45. one of the survivors of the United States army transport Tuscania, torpedoed and sunk by a German submarine on Feb. 5, 1918.

Weir, who was born in Los Angeles and who lived for many years in Butte, was found Sunday in the Hoover creek district 18 miles northwest of here by George Huffman. He was unconscious and was taken to a hospital here where he died. His widow and two sons survive.

An investigation was ordered, although some officials believed the shooting was accidental. Weir was dressed in hunting clothes and his rifle was found beside him.

Weir left a job as substation operator at Morel, near Butte, to go to war. He and 39 other doughboys were rescued from a raft off the coast of Scotland. The sinking of the Canadian vessel resulted in the loss of 213 American soldiers.

SHERIFF IS NOT READY TO DISCLOSE FINDINGS IN WEIR DEATH AFTER DAY'S PROBE

DEER LODGE, Nov. 16.—(Special)—After a day-long investigation into the fatal shooting of Thomas Weir, 45, Sheriff Fred Valiton of Powell county tonight said he was not ready to disclose his findings.

Weir, former Butte war veteran and employe of the Milwaukee railroad, died in a hospital here this morning after he was found with a bullet wound in his abdomen in the Hoover creek district, 18 miles northwest of Deer Lodge. He was on a hunting trip.

Aiding in the investigation were County Attorney E. M. Keeley and Coroner H. W. Ross. It had been previously stated by officials that the death of Weir appeared acci-

Death of Thomas Weir is Shock to Community

Whitehall and Valley residents were shocked by the news of the death of Thomas Weir, a former resident here, He had been employed by the Milwaukee railroad at Morel, -22 miles west of Butte.

Cause of death was a gunshot wound in the abdomen, received while he was hunting Sunday in the Hoover creek district, 18 miles northwest of Deer Lodge. He was found by a trapper, and brought to the Deer Lodge hospital where he died Monday morning.


Florice, and two sons, James and Thomas; his parents, two brothers and two sisters.

Trapper Sentenced To Three Years on Manslaughter Count DEER LODGE, Nov. 23.--(U.F.--A three-year penitentiary sentence today was imposed by Judge R. E. McHugh

George Huffman, elderly Powell county shepherd, must serve three years in the Montana penitentiary because he shot and killed a hunter. Huffman was not hunting, but when he heard the brush rustle not far from his camp wagon, he looked across the gulch, thought he saw a coyote, and fired, killing Thomas Weir, a former Butte man out seeking game.

Weir's death is not the only case in the northwest where a hunter has been shot by another, but it is the only case of record in which the man who did the shooting was not himself a member of a hunting party. It is evident there was some circumstance in connection with Huffman's act that warranted the charge filed against him. Huffman extenuated by declaring he thought Weir was a coyote.

Three years is a long time to be deprived of liberty. To have it recorded that carelessness accounted for the death of a fellow human, leaves a record that can never be erased. The incarceration of this aged sheepherder perhaps will serve as an object lesson to all those who go into the timber with guns. Not until men realize that it is never safe to shoot until you are sure the object is what you believe it to be, will the stories of death by accidental shooting be avoided.

Stricken en route to his office in the Davenport bank, building, John P. Weir, chairman of the Scott County Republican Central committee and a former county attorney, dropped dead at Third and Harrison streets at 10:45 a. m. Monday. He was 51 years of age.



Death today took Charles T. Cooper, who began practice of law in Davenport about 40 years ago and who has been inactive for the last ten years.

He died at a local hospital at 10:30 a.m. following a lingering illness.

Mr Cooper, who was 67 years old, bad lived in Scott county virtually all of his life, it was recalled today by friends. He had no survivors of immediate relationship in this vicinity. A brother, Dr, William A. Cooper, resides in Baird, Ia., and a sister, Miss Melissa Cooper, in Natchez, Miss. A brother, Frank A. Cooper, well known in Davenport law circles, preceded him in death. No arrangements have been made for the funeral, but it was said today that the Scott County Bar association will meet to attend the services in a body. His body has been removed to the Halligan funeral home.






