STANLEY WELLMAN '18 TELLS OF TUSCANIA TORPEDOING.

EAST LANSING, MICHIGAN - FRIDAY APRIL 19, 1918

Stanley F. Wellman one of this year's senior class and now a corporal of the 158 Aero Service Squad. A. E. F. France who was aboard the ill fated Tuscania when it was torpedoed off the coast of Scotland has written the following to his mother Mrs. George Walter in East Lansing. It was the sinking of the Tuscania that took the life of Wm. R. Johnson '12 the first M. A. C. man to be lost in the war.

"We left New York and had been 13 days on the water when we were hit by the torpedo at 5:55 at night. The color sergeant and myself had just returned from supper and were occupying a state room near the top of the ship. I had just stocked up with tooth paste, soap and various things from the ship's store and was packing them away when the explosion came. It seemed as if I had been hit in the head with a board. The explosion was terrible. It knocked my roommate out of bed where he had been lying down reading and threw me to the floor. To make things more weird and ghastly, the lights went out for the torpedo had hit the ship's engine which furnished the light.

We grabbed our hats, overcoats, and life preservers and walked, not ran, for the life boats to which we had been assigned. There was very little confusion which accounts for the small loss of life. When we arrived on deck we found that the life boat to which we had been assigned had been wrecked by the explosion. There was nothing to do but wait and watch, for no man would have been coward enough at this time to get another life boat and thereby, perhaps, take another man's life.

We saw hundreds and hundreds of men leave the ship, and still we waited, watched and prayed. Finally a torpedo boat destroyer pulled alongside the ship, and took the remaining men off. The colors of our squadron went off first and then the men, and when I finally landed on the destroyer, which was about a minute before she pulled away, I asked for the time and it was 8:12 PM. I had been on the sinking ship two hours and 17 minutes but was not excited because I felt that God would send us help before we drowned. We were taken to Buncrana, Ireland, and here we stayed for a few days. It is a wonderful country with the most beautiful scenery I have ever seen. There are high hills and beautiful valleys, the hills platted out with green fields and hedges. The way the people have treated us since we have been here I shall never forget. The awfulness of the thing did not dawn on me for a day afterward. It seemed like a dream."

Stanley F. Wellman, 68, of 337 N. Clemens Ave., real estate salesman, died Saturday at a local hospital. Mr. Wellman retired as general manager of the Michigan Elevator Exchange in 1952 and since then has been with Edward G. Hacker Co. and Porter Realty.

He was a life-time resident of Lansing and was a member of the Church of the Resurrection and Holy Name Society of the church, and also one of the founders of the Resurrection Athletic Association. WELLMAN ABOARD TUSCANIA, BELIEF

Letter of Lansing Man is For-
warded to Miss Eva
Rogers.

That Stanley Wellman of East Lansing was on the torpedoed transport Tuscania as a member of the 158th aero squadron is indicated. At the time of his enlistment, Nov. 19, he was a senior at the Michigan Agricultural college. Wellman was a corporal.

Press dispatches did not include the name of Wellman among those on board but before leaving he left a note to be sent to Miss Eva Rogers of the Reo Motor Car company upon the safe arrival of his squadron in Europe. The note read as follows.

"Dear Eva: When this reaches you I will be safely landed.

"Stan."

When the news of the sinking of the transport came to the war department letters left at the point of embarkation were forwarded to the proper parties with a communication from the commanding general. Miss Rogers received the following communication from Major General Shanks.

"Headquarters Port of Embarkation,

"Hoboken, New Jersey,

"February 8, 1918.

"The enclosed communication was left here, to be mailed upon the safe arrival of the S. S. Tuscania abroad. As the great majority of the mail left was simply signed with the first name of the sender, it is impossible to state whether he has arrived safely abroad or not and this communication, has, therefore, been sent you simply for personal reasons and does not indicate the safe arrival of the sender.



Tells of the Torpedoing of the Tuscania.

Stanley F. Wellman, formerly of 226 Grand River ave., East Lansing, who was on board the Tuscania, writes the following letter to his mother, Mrs. George Walter.

Dear Mother: I have moved again and am now located somewhere in England. My first letter was very brief, because I did not know how much would pass the censor. I was on board the Tuscania, the English liner that was torpedoed. We left New York and had been 13 days on the water when we were hit by the torpedo at 5:55 at night. The color sergeant and myself had just returned from supper and were occupying a state room near the top of the ship. I had just stocked up with tooth paste, soap and various things from the ship's store and was packing them away when the explosion came. It seemed as if I had been hit in the head with a board. Now don't worry, just smile and be brave, because I am safe, sound and feeling fine. They did not get me with their tin fish torpedo, and they won't get me. We're going to whip the kaiser's whole bunch, and will be home in less time than you think.

GRADUATING CLASS HALF LAST YEAR'S

**Manner in Which War Cuts

The extent to which war's levies have made inroads upon the student body of the Michigan Agricultural college was strikingly brought out today with the announcement by the college authorities of the names of those who will be awarded degrees on commencement day, May 30. Only 160 students will receive sheepskins this spring. This number represents about one-half of the membership of the class as it was a year ago—making it one of the smallest that have left the campus in many years. Members of the class who are in one branch or another of the army and navy number 146, while of the 103 masculine members of the class who will be graduated in May a majority of them are already enlisted in the officers' reserve corps, or are preparing themselves for special lines of duty with the fighting forces.

HASLETT, July 16 — Organization of the Lake Lansing Improvement association with the purpose of eliminating pollution of the lake was effected last night at a meeting of about 70 property owners.

Stanley Wellman of Lansing was elected president, Richard Tubbs, of Haslett, vice president, and Mrs. Earl W. Schuon of Haslett, secretary-treasurer. ELEVATOR EXCHANGE MANAGER IS NAMED

Neil H. Bass to Head Co-operative Following Resignation of L. E. Osmer

Appointment of Neil H. Bass as manager of the Michigan Elevator Exchange, effective December 1, 1940, and the acceptance of the resignation of L. E. Osmer, as co-manager was announced Wednesday by M. J. Burkholder, president of the board of directors of the Michigan Elevator Exchange.

Bass has been co-manager with Mr. Osmer since 1934 and has been associated with the company since 1921.

"Mr. Osmer during the past 20 years of service has built the Michigan Elevator exchange from a small struggling co-operative to one of the largest co-operative handlers of grain and beans in the United States, and the largest handlers of grain and beans in Michigan," Mr. Burkholder said Wednesday. "We regret the loss of the services of Mr. Osmer after 20 years of hard, efficient, satisfactory service to the Michigan Elevator Exchange," he added.

Probably no other large grain and bean company in the United States is in better position than this organization to make the change in management without interrupting service, officials of the company have pointed out. Mr. Bass, the new manager, Stanley Wellman, grain buyer; Major C. S. Benton, traffic manager and assistant bean buyer; E. P. Rendall, comptroller, and Ward King, manager of the Port Huron terminal bean processing plant, all have more than 15 years experience with the organization.

Stanley F. Wellman, acting manager of the Michigan Elevator exchange, said marketing of beans is "apt to be a problem child" after the war, "because the normal consumption in the United States of 12,000,000 bags is far less than present production of 22,000,000 bags." The only relief in the post-war marketing picture, Wellman said, would come from export to foreign countries.

Other Grains Maturing

A new problem faced elevator men, however, with reports that oat and barley crops were ready for cutting. Already some of each crop is arriving at elevators clogged with wheat.

This problem, faced by Michigan growers and elevator men, results from the wheat cutting being delayed about two weeks because of cold weather earlier in the season.

Stanley F. Wellman of the Michigan Elevator exchange, said this area still was in "bad shape" as far as storage facilities were concerned.

It was his belief, however, that re-


