New Jersey had fifteen boys aboard the Tuscania when she was torpedoed by a German submarine last week, of which number three were from Monmouth County. They are Thomas G. Welstead of Matawan, son of Mrs. Mary Wilstead, a private in the 158th aero squadron; Corporal Hobard M. Edmunds, son of Mrs. Mamie Edmunds of Keansburg, 107th Supply train, and Arthur P. Brown, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. Perrine Brown of Keyport, private in the 158th Aerosquadron. Welstead and Brown were among the rescued, while Edmunds is reported among the missing. It is possible that the latter may still be alive and the government's final report is awaited with much interest by the family of young Edmunds.

HOBART EDMUNDS RESCUED.

Was On the Troop Ship Tuscania, Torpedoed Last Week.

Sergt. Hobart C. Edmunds of Laurel Avenue, West Keansburg, was one of the survivors of the torpedoed British troop ship Tuscania. Sergt. Edmunds was the only young man from Keansburg aboard the ship at the time of the disaster. Arthur P. Brown ,son of Mr. and Mrs. Perrin Brown of Keyport, and Thomas G. Welsted, son of Mrs. Mary Welsted of Matawan, were also aboard the ship and were saved. Mr. Welsted was very well known in Keansburg during the summer months, and for several seasons occupied a bungalow at Sheehan's camp.

Thomas Welstead, who had a very narrow escape from being sunk by a submarine during the early part of the war, has received his honorable discharge.



LOYALTY KEYNOTE OF TALKS AT A. L. BANQUET

Nearly 100 Men Attended Annual Dinner of the Matawan Post Last Night; Mayor Is Toastmaster.

An array of speakers discussed matters of current interest at the annual banquet of Matawan Post No. 176, American Legion, last night, in the Legion Hall, attended by nearly a hundred men, and one of the largest ever held here. Mayor Edward W. Currie, serving as toastmaster, had a jest or taunt for each "victim" he introduced, exhibiting an uncanny knowledge of their pasts.

Captain Hardy Slicer, U. S. A., stationed at Fort Hancock, spoke in most enthus, astic terms of the work of the Civilian Conservation Corps, stressing its moral value. Having visited the camps of the Corps from coast to coast and being attached to the one on Sandy Hook, he felt competent to dwell on its work nationally. Taking 300,000 youths from the tenement district of New York City with no outlook, to the forests, had made men of them and contributed to the strengthening of the nation's morale.

Councilman F. Howard Lloyd with the topic, "Loyalty to Government," urged his hearers to get behind the country's President, regardless of political party allegiance, saying that though he was "on the other side of the fence," he had great admiration for the work Franklin D. Roosevelt is trying to do in this critical time. The Legionnaires should take an active interest in all governmental affairs, he thought. Congressman William H. Sutphin discussed national legislation and also expressed appreciation of the work being done by the Auxiliary.

Burnett's Decision On Welstead Appeal Is Expected Shortly

Residents And Officials Testify At Hearing In Newark Mon.; Currie Represented Boro

RODGERS IS HEARD

Asked As To Character Of Neighborhood; Possible Traffic Hazard Cited During Testimony

Decision on the appeal of Thomas G. Welstead against the action of the Matawan Boro Council in refusing to grant him a liquor license for a tavern at 277 Main Street is being reserved following a hearing Monday in the Newark offices of the Alcoholic Beverage Commission.

Mr. Welstead was represented by John F. Meehan, Jersey City attorney. The interests of the boro and Matawan residents who opposed the license grant was represented by Mayor Edward W. Currie, acting boro solicitor.

Edgar VanBuskirk, Adiel "Mitzie" Strang and Lloyd Cuttrell, appeared as witnesses for Welstead. Cuttrell, the only one of the three who admitted living in the immediate neighborhood of the 277 Main Street address, affirmed that the neighborhood was of an excellent residential character and that taverns several blocks distant could take

care of the needs of the residents.

Under examination VanBuskirk admitted that he lived one and a half miles from the proposed tavern and Strang testified he lived two and one-eighth miles distant. Strang said he felt a tavern at the address would make a living for the proprietor.

Weistead introduced photographs showing other business places in the immediate neighborhood.

Boro Clerk William A. Rodgers, called to the stand as a witness for the boro, testified that Matawan, with a population of 2700, already had eight licensed saloons. He also declared that a petition containing 146 names of people opposing the granting of the license had been filed. The signatures on the petition were of residents in the immediate neighborhood, Rodgers added.

Questioned as to the character of the neighborhood, Mr. Rodgers testified it was one of the finest in the boro. Maps were introduced into evidence to show the exect location of the residences of the signers of the petition.

Before he left the stand Mr. Rodgers declared that Weistead had presented no petition from residents favorable to the granting of the license.

Those who testified in opposition to the license grant were Edward L. Lisk his wife, Mrs. Elmore Kattner, Abraham Vreeland and Edward Ziegler. Mr. Lisk introduced pictures of residences in the neighborhood and stressed the point that no saloon had been located in the neighborhood for forty years. The nearest was one-half mile distant, he maintained.

The other opposition witnesses stressed the traffic hazard that would result because of the nearness to the intersection of State Highway Routes 9-4 and 34 and the lack of parking facilities in the section.

Testifying for the boro, Mayor Currie decirred that the opposition to Weistead was not personal but was based solely on the location. He atressed the restricted neighborhood, the traffic hazard and the lack of parking space.

Councilmen George W. Parker, Robert G. Thixton and Merritt J. Warwick, who voted against the granting of the license, testified along the same lines as the mayor. Councilman Albert B Smith, who (Continued on page four)

Costello (1893-1969, F: 172547796) whom he married in St. Joseph's Church, Keyport, Monmouth NJ on 10 Jun 1928. Buried in Saint Joseph Cemetery, Keyport, Monmouth NJ. F: 172544688
- John Welstead, 31 Aug 1912 Brooklyn, Kings NY 16 Oct 1992 Freehold, Monmouth NJ. Since Thomas Welstead died in 1904 & stepfather James A. Power died in Jul 1911, based on a possible date of John's conception of Nov 1911, it is unclear who is John's biological father. It may also be unclear who is John's biological mother, as Mary would have been around 46 years old when John was born. Resident of Freneau NJ in Dec 1954 when his brother William died. Resident of Matawan NJ in Aug 1975 when his brother Thomas died & in Jan 1979 when his sister Elizabeth died. Husband of Eleanor McGiff who died in 1977. Buried in Green Grove Cemetery, Keyport, Monmouth NJ. F: 173642436
