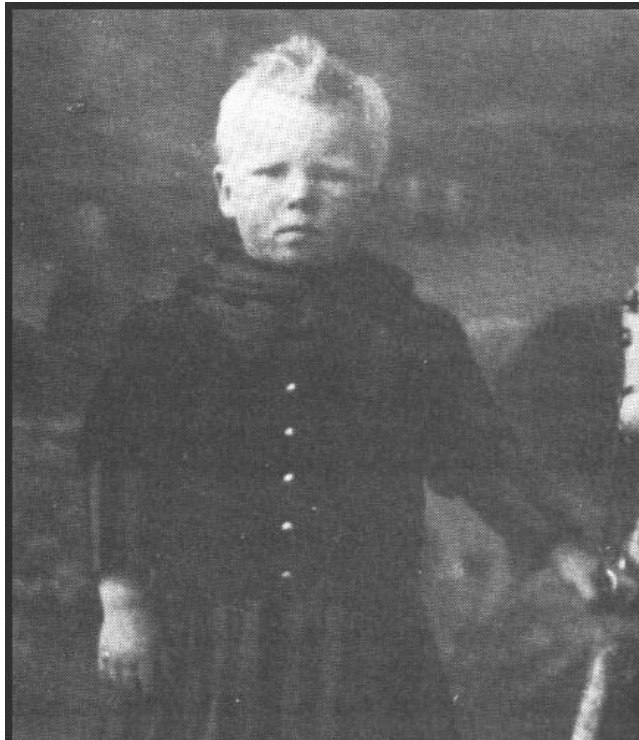

Funeral services for Goalman A. White, 73, Augusta, retired dude rancher and cattleman, will be held Friday at 2 p.m. at the Augusta Community Church with Fr. Charles G. DuBoise, Great Falls, officiating. Burial will be in the Augusta cemetery, where American Legion Post No. 51 will conduct military rites.

White, former operator of the White and White Dude Ranch on the North Fork of the Sun River west of Augusta, died Thursday night at a local hospital where he had been a patient since Jan. 1.

A native of Oregon, where he was born Nov. 6, 1888, near Portland, White came to Montana with his parents to the Augusta area when he was 2.

He served in the Army Corps of Engineers during World War I, and following his military service returned to the Augusta area where he began operating the dude ranch.

In 1940 he married the former Winnie Mae Stevenson in Great Falls and they purchased the Eberl Ranch on the Dearborn River, which they operated 14 years until retiring and moving to the town of Augusta.

He is survived by the widow; a stepdaughter, Mrs. Joseph W. (Virginia McCauley) Pahl, Denver; two brothers, Herman, McCall, Idaho, and S. J., Great Falls; one sister, Mrs. Pete Garino, Augusta, and two grandchildren.

White was a charter member of the Augusta American Legion Post.

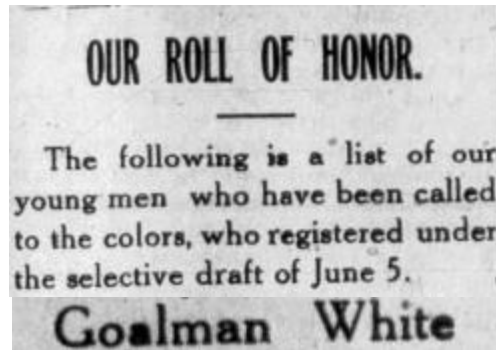

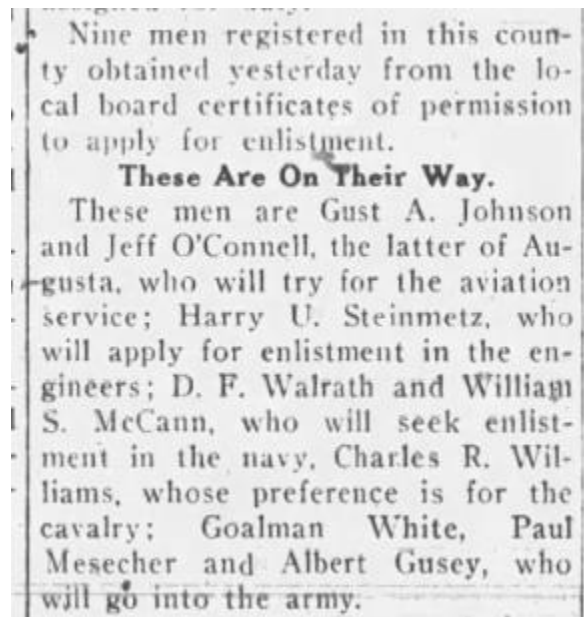

Goalman White who arrived home last Friday night from over seas military duty, perhaps had as nasty an experience as any one who crossed the ocean and got back with a whole skin. Goalman was a member of the 20th Engineering Corpse, and was a passenger on the Tuscania when torpedoed on the coast of Scotland. He was one of the last men to leave the ship and was in the life saving boat one whole night on a rough sea. He was detailed to help bury the rescued bodies of the drowned men and assisted in the burial of 219. He was lost from his company several weeks during which time he took in the sights of Ireland, Scotland and England. Goalman doesn't want any more war.

Augusta Men Will Guide Tourists

Over the mountain trails from Augusta to Salmon lake in the Flathead country is a horseback trip that Chet Nixon and Coalman White, guides of Augusta, have arranged as a sidetrip for tourists along the Park-to-Park trail from Yellowstone to Glacier park.

The fishing in Salmon lake and tributary streams is said to be the best in Montana. Tourists who want to make a mountain trip through the majestic Rockies will find this trail over to the Flathead one of the most picturesque in the whole northwest. Automobiles may be left at Augusta and the whole trip made on horseback, the guides furnishing horses and all camp equipment.

It is a sidetrip that should not be missed by anyone who enjoys camp life in the mountains, and royal fishing among the salmon trout pools of the Flathead.

GUEST RANCHES CLOSE UP FOR THE SEASON

AUGUSTA, Sept. 24—With the coming of fall, many guest ranches are closing their summer tourist season. The White and White ranch has just closed a very successful season. The good fishing near this ranch has made it a very popular resort all summer.

The White and White ranch is owned by Everette and Goalman White. Both men have long resided in this region and are experienced mountaineers. Everette White is the son of Sylvanus and Charlotte Nickolson White, pioneers of Minnesota, who came to Montana when Everette was a boy, settling near what is now the town of Sun River.

White learned to know the mountains well, working for 14 years for J. H. "Jack" Burke as well as other large cattle outfits, taught him much about livestock raising and summer pastures in the mountains.

Goalman White, his partner, is a nephew of Everette, and has spent all his life in the mountains, except the few months in France during the World war.

These men have chosen a most desirable place for a guest ranch on the bank of the Sun river a short distance below the Gibson dam. The ranch is reached by a bridge over the river a mile above the Diversion dam.

The location and house are among

the best in this part of the country. The ranch house is of logs, large and well planned, the living room a place of interest.

A large stable with more than 40 saddle horses, and 20 saddles as well as many pack saddles is just below the house, inviting an easy access to the fishing and hunting grounds above.

Miss Hazel Davis of the high school cafeteria has been house keeper during the summer. Many parties are held by local people at the ranch house throughout the year. Preparations are now underway for the entertainment of guest during the hunting season.

***** Eberl and Lawson Ranch Sold to Goalman White *****

Goalman White has purchased the ranches of Eberl and Lawson at Clemons, Montana. Fifty years ago or more Frank Eberl and Bill Lawhon came west from Iowa and took up land upon which they have resided continuously since. Here they took their brides, who came out from Iowa to make home for and raise the families of the two sturdy pioneer men. Eleven children Mrs. Eberl raised, six girls and five boys Mrs. Lawson raised two, a boy and a girl. Mr. Lawson and Mrs. Eberl has passed away. Mr. Eberl has had a son Bill living with him and Mrs. Lawson and her son Alen live on their ranch. Just what they will now do remains to be seen. All the other children of these two families are out in the world making their own way. The ranches rest in one of the prettiest settings in Montana. Most of the land is of meadow or good pasture, none mountainous or very rocky. One large lake sets beside the Eberl old log home in the fields springs and wet spots provide water and irrigation for grass and hay. The Lawson home sits back out of sight from the road against a hill. They get

the road against a hill. They get drinking water from a spring below. These buildings have been kept in better repair the white washed little log home greeting the visitor cheerfully as he suddenly comes upon it round a little hill. The road that cuts the two ranches apart leads toward Dearborn canyon, the mouth of it. The grass grown hills in pleasant contrast to the pine covered mountains beyond and above that lure one on to promised charms of the hazy depths.

Guest Ranch Owner Sells His Interest

Goalman White Buys Lawson & Eberl Sheep Ranches on Dearborn

AUGUSTA, Oct. 17.—(Special)—Goalman White, for many years co-operator of the White & White guest ranch, has sold his share of the enterprise and bought the Lawson & Eberl sheep ranches north of the Dearborn river.

Over 50 years ago these two ranches were settled as homesteads by William Lawson and Frank Eberl, both of whom had come to Montana from Ohio with William J. Eberl, old-time storekeeper of Augusta and brother of Frank. Lawson and Frank Eberl married sisters and soon after located on the ranches in the Dearborn country. There they began some farming, branched out into cattle raising and finally acquired sheep, which they ran together each summer on land owned by both.

William Lawson died about a year ago and is survived by his widow, Jane Lawson, and two children, Allen, who has been associated with his parents in ranching, and a daughter, Mrs. Vernon, of Cascade county. Mrs. Frank Eberl died a number of years ago and is survived by her husband and 10 children. A son, William, has been associated with his father in the sheep business.

White also bought the sheep and will continue to operate both ranches as one sheep ranch. He is the son of Joseph A. White, one of Augusta's oldest settlers and a pioneer of the state.

Ranch and farmlands consisting of more than 2,300 acres in the Augusta area have been deeded to R. L. Meredith of Great Falls by Winnie Mae White and Goalman White, both of Augusta, for approximately \$34,700 in a deed filed with Clerk and Recorder Florence Thielen.

White died of natural causes Friday in a local hospital.

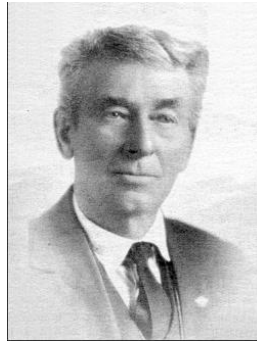
