# ABOARD TUSCANIA ARE AMONG THE RESCUED

Press reports received by The Birmingham News Saturday night Indicated that at least eight Alabama soldiers aboard the transport Tuscania escaped when the ship was torpedoed Tuesday. The number of men from this State on board the transport is problematical, but that they were few is indicated by the reports thus far received by the War Department. Confusion still exists in the official figures of the Americans lost, but the War Department reports state that only 113 are missing.

# FROM BRUCE WHITE

Labrit, France, Dec. 27, 1918.

Dear Mother:-

I received your letter and box today. The box was in good shape the candy and cake were just fine. You could not have sent me anything that would have been appreciated more than that candy. The fountain pen came in right too, for I did not have one.

I came here yesterday with 39 other men from my company. We will be here about ten days, I guess, and then go back to our company at Captieux. So you see we will spend Christmas here—I think we will have a good time.

Labrit is a very small place—only about 2,000 inhabitants, but I think we can go to Mar-de-Marson X'Mas—it is a nice town of about ten or

twelve thousand people.

tweive thousand people.

I sure was glad to get back down here. We stayed at Souilly, a little place about fifteen miles from Verdun, for two weeks, and I think it rained every day while we were there. The mud was about six inches deep; we didn't do any work there. I think we were ordered to go there before the armistice was signed, and then they did not need us and we came back here. The trip was worth something, as I saw lots of people and got to go to Verdun. I wish you could see that place. No civilians living there, and not a building that was not bombed; some of them with just one wall standing. I guess you wonder what I do Sundays for pastime. Well, there isn't much in this little town, although we can buy nearly everything to eat and drink; so that is about all I get out of it. There are a few boys and girls, but as I don't speak much French, I don't fool with them much. No, I haven't heard from Charles but one time since he came over here. I answered his letter and kept thinking I would hear from him again, but haven't. I expect he will get back home before I do. It is hard to tell when we will go back. Some think the last of February and others think that it will be three or four months. I guess a lot of the

boys are on their way back. I was among the first to come over and may be among the last to go back, but anyway, it will be a happy day when I do get there.

Well, I will close for this time and write again soon after X'Mas. Write as often as you can. Much love to all,

# MAN HURT IN CRASH

S. B. White Claims Florida As Home; Injured At Snowdon

MONTGOMERY, Ala., Aug. 22.—S. B. White is in a serious condition here Saturday in a local hospital, following an accident in which his car was struck by a freight train at the Snowdon crossing. White claims he is from Florida, but his car had a Geneva, Ala., plate. Physicians raid his condition was critical.

#### TRAIN HITS AUTO

S. B. White was seriously, probably fatally, injured shortly after 6 o'clock Saturday morning when a Ford coupe in which he was riding was struck by an Atlantic Coast Line freight train a few feet from the depot at Snowdoun, Ala.

The injured man, whose car bore a Geneva, Ala., tag, gave his residence as Florida. He retained complete consciousness following the accident, despite injuries which physicians later diagnosed as a fractured spine and broken hip.

Several residents of Snowdoun witnessed the collision and rushed to the scene of the tragedy, finding White in full possession of his senses, but unable to move. He told them that he had been driving all night, coming toward Montgomery, and that he was going at a fast rate when attempting to cross the rail-road tracks.

Leak's ambulance made a hurry call to the scene of the accident and the injured man was brought to a local infirmary, where physicians announced his condition as critical. The victim is said to have told those who were the first to rush to his aid that he held no hope of living. His car was badly damaged, being hurled 25 feet by the impact with the freight engine.

#### Prominent Families Hold Third Annual Reunion






