Would Like to Come

Miss Bessie Gibbons, Baraboo, has received the following letter:

Dammartin, France,
December 10, 1918.

Dear Cousin:

Will write a few lines to night. We just got through supper.

Well, Bessie we are at peace over in this country. It seems queer, believe me, but guess it is true.

We were in the lines when the war ended.

We met the 26 division on the Toul sector the last of March. We were there until the last of June when we went toward a rest camp about 200 miles away. When we got to Meaux, a little way east of Paris, we were called up on the Chateau Thierry front where the Germans were making a big drive on Paris, but the old 26 turned them the other way. From there we went to the St. Mihiel front and started a drive there, captured ground that the Hun had held for four years. There is where we saw real no-man's land. Well, from there we went to the Verdun front and we were there until the last shot of this great war was fired.

We were moving toward the coast but have stopped now, but think we will sail for America about January 15, at least I hope so.

I have seen all of the beautiful France I care about. Take me home now, but you know we don't have anything to say about that.

How is every thing around there anyway? How is your mother now? I guess my girls are all getting married are the rest? I read in the papers that about 10,000 men are married over here but I am not in the bunch but may be if they keep me here much longer. Ha! Ha! Well will close.
