He sought no exemption, and while he was not strong physically he felt that if the board and examiners passed him he should accept their decision. When he reached Camp Travis, Lieut. Boaden told him that he was not strong enough for the strenuous work of the training camp. He was placed in the agricultural department and was sent to France for that purpose. He had suffered from stomach trouble for a number of years, having spent some weeks in Mineral Wells in 1916 for the relief of same. He had never entirely recovered from that trouble.

At the time of his registration, he was making his home with W. S. Mills, a Baptist minister at Mill Creek. When he received his papers to fill out, he certified to same. He was advised not to do anything as he could not possibly pass the examination and he would not seem a "slacker" and having so much confidence in the friend who gave this advice he

He was a quiet reserved man, had no bad habits and always attended to his own business. He never refused to aid his friends in any way that he could,

His wife was prostrated by the sad news and it has cast a gloom over the entire county. He will be missed from his circle of friends, but he has gone to his reward and it is a great consolation to his wife and friends to know that he died as he had lived, not shirking his duty to his country, but answering the call to the colors with the same courage that he had met the rebuffs of the world, as a Christian and a true man. He had so builded in this life, and always said in his letters to his wife that should they not meet again on this earth, that he wanted her to so live she would meet him in the other world. Such lives as these should be examples to help us make each day more worth while and be better people by having known such men.

He had planned to build them a home on his farm near town and

they had made plans for a bright and happy future, but the God who "Knoweth and doeth all things well," knew best and took him home where there is no more parting and no sorrows for those who lived as he had, in the "Fear and admonition of the Lord," Mrs. Wilson's father, Mr. Underwood, died in November, 1917, and about two weeks later her brother, a soung man in the spation corps, was crushed to death in the wreck of his machine at Palestine, Texas.

TRAGIC DEATH OF AN OLD CITIZEN

Sheriff Carpenter and County Attorney Greer were called to the W.M.G.Wilson home, near Myrtle Springs, to investigate the death of that old citizen Saturday morning. The word that came to the sheriff's office was to the effect that Mr. Wilson had shot and killed himself, but on investigation the officers decided that circumstances surrounding his death were such as to warrant full investigation of the tragic occurrence and accordingly Mrs. Wilson, her sister, Mrs. Pool, and a man named Isham, with the latter's 13 year-old daughter, were arrested charged with the murder.

On going to the place, Wilson was found lying on the side of a neighboring road, leading away from his home. He was lying face down with a pistol in his left hand and a bullet wound behind the right ear. There was a deep gash at the point where the bullet entered and the skull showed to have been beaten with an instrument of some kind. Physicians opened the skull and found the bullet directly opposite the point of entrance, this leading officers to doubt that Wilson could have held the pistol in such a position to shoot himself.

Further enquiry led to the information that Wilson and his wife had separated and that at her request Isham, who lived on the Wilson farm, had come over to move her things out. It is the belief of the officers that a general row and perhaps fight occurred in the yard and while this was in progress one of the women knocked him down. The officers have it that at one time Wilson drew his gun on Isham and that the latter ran behind the wagon, preventing the enraged man from shooting him.

The parties under arrest concur in the statement that Wilson shot himself, after leaving the house, and that they saw him commit the act. The little girl states they all went to the place of shooting after hearing the shot fired and found him in the position he was when the officers arrived. The little girl was first to leave the scene and states that she was first to phone about the tragedy. She thinks she heard a shot after leaving, but of course has no idea who fired it or for what purpose. Officers and physicians are of the opinion that he was knocked insensible and that the pistol was then placed in the wound and fired.

Mrs. Wilson was the divorced wife of a man named Jackson who was tried in district court at Canton last year on a charge of bigamy, she having married Wilson, after Jackson had married another woman in the county. Recently Wilson was beaten by "white caps," this occurrence having been investigated by the recent grand jury, with what result we are not informed.

Deceased formerly resided in either the Tundra or Jackson community and was well known. Burial took place at Edgewood. He was 60 years of age and Mrs. Wilson is his junior by about twenty years.

Funeral services are pending at Colonial Funeral Home for Charles Franklin Wilson, 82, of 922 Sam Hill, who died in Irving Community Hospital Sunday.

An aircraft industry worker, Wilson retired in 1957 and has been an Irving resident since that time. He was born Oct. 13, 1888 in Myrtle Springs, Tex. He had been subject of a front page story in the Irving Daily News October, 1963 when 75 guests commemorated his 75th birthday. Father: William M. / W.M.G. Wilson, 15 Oct 1852 TN [Oct 1855 in 1900 census] – 14 Feb 1920 Van Zandt Co. TX. His mother's 1st name was Emily; in the 1860 & 1870 censuses, he is listed with her but no father. Found dead with a gunshot wound to the head. He & William Riley's mother Nancy were divorced. She had married a Jackson but then claimed he had committed bigamy. Jackson was tried for bigamy in Canton TX district court in 1919. W.M.G. had married Nancy Thorp/Tharp [also found with first name Mincy in the 1920 census; he age 62 & she age 36). With the help of a man named Isham, Nancy was moving items from her previous household. At some point, W.M.G. had a gun & Isham hid behind a wagon for protection. W.M.G. was then found dead on the road with a gun in his hand. William Riley's 13-year-old sister Rosa Lee said her father was dead in the road, as did the other witnesses – Nancy, Nancy's sister Mrs. Pool & Mr. Isham – but then said she heard a shot after she had left the scene. The sheriff & coroner thought the bullet was in the wrong place for suicide & arrested them all. No further details could be located.

His 2nd wife Nancy Thorp (ca. 1886 TX) was the daughter of Joseph F. Thorp & Nancy Barbara Essery.

W.M.G.'s TX death certificate lacks much information – cause of death as well as parents. W.M.G. is buried in Edgewood Cemetery, Edgewood, Van Zandt TX.

According to the newspaper obituary copied above, William left home at age 17. Although not strong, he was drafted but found not strong enough at training camp so assigned to an agricultural department. He had health issues with his stomach prior to the war. When he registered for the draft, he was living with Baptist minister W.S. Mills at Mills Creek. He had married Ethel Underwood on 12 May 1917.

William told Ethel, who was living in San Antonio TX, to leave there & return to Canton TX while he was at war. Her father had died in Nov 1917 & then her brother died about 2 weeks later while in the aviation corps at Palestine TX.
