

IOWA CITY, Ia., Feb. 12.—Special: William Wingler, whose home is in Riverside, is reported as one of those saved from the ill-fated Tuscania, which encountered a torpedo in the war zone. William Wingler enlisted in the national army at Cedar Rapids in November last as a mechanic, having had some experience along this line, and was being moved toward the firing line in record time.



# Deaths William Wingler Dies at Age 70

RIVERSIDE — William Wingler, 70, of Riverside died today at Veterans Hospital in Iowa City, where he had been a patient several weeks.

Requiem mass will be at 9 a.m. Friday at St. Mary's Church at Riverside, with the Rev. W. F. Boeckmann officiating. Rosary service will be at 8 p.m., Thursday at Sorden & Adams Funeral Home, Riverside. Burial will be in Riverside Cemetery.

Mr. Wingler was born July 15, 1896, in Washington County, the son of Frank and Clara Prymek Wingler. He married Helen Kucera June 8, 1926, at Riverside. A retired grocer, he spent his entire life in the Riverside area. Mr. Wingler, a veteran of World War I, was a member of the Riverside American Legion post and of St. Mary's Church.

He is survived by his widow, one son, William Jr., in the Navy: and two brothers, Ernest of West Burlington and Frank of Mulkay, Ill.

#### Wingler On Tuscenia Saved.

William Wingler, a lad of 20, whose former home was Riverside, Ia. is reported as one of the men saved from the ill-fated Tuscania when it encountered a torpedo in the North sea. Tuesday night Wingler came to Riverside several years ago from the east and resided with his uncle, Louis Smith, and his Uncles Joseph, John and James Wingler. The mother of the young man has been dead many years and his father lives in Canada.

William had been employed for the most part at farm labor but had some mechanical experience and a mechanical turn of mind, so that in November he went to Ce-

dar Rapids and enlisted as a mechanic.

William Wingler, grocer, recalled today as the 19th anniversary of the day 2,400 American soldiers en route to France on the Tuscania were torpedoed by a German submarine. He was one of 65 men, who rode a lifeboat, intended to hold not more than 50, from 6 p. m. until nearly midnight when they were picked up by a trawler off the Irish coast.




found out as yet. Although Bulchtisk sustained very serious injuries, to by he was resting easily, and it is thought that he has all chances of recovering.
