





Elizabeth Oosterheert

March 14, 1922 - February 2, 2005 Grand Rapids, MI Elizabeth Oosterheert's favorite place was at home with the company of her loved ones. She was a true family woman who you could count on when you needed a helping hand or when you needed someone to listen. Her heart was her strongest muscle, and she was always full of love for her family and many friends.

By the year 1922, the Great War had receded into history and Americans rejoiced in the prosperity of the Roaring '20s. With big band music playing over radios and filling dance halls, Americans everywhere found reasons to celebrate. In Grand Rapids, Michigan, Ralph Winkel and his wife Sarah Wondergem certainly had reason to celebrate. On March 14, 1922, they welcomed their daughter Elizabeth into their home on Fuller NE.

Elizabeth was the third child in her family of seven children and the eldest girl. She attended Creston Christian School, which was located just a few blocks from the family house. After Creston, she went to Grand Rapids Christian High School, where she graduated with the class of 1940. As her choice of school reveals, Elizabeth was very devoted to her Christian education. Every day she had to walk to and from school, a distance of over three miles. But this daily trip soon turned into a pleasure, for Elizabeth walked both ways with a friend Ellen Whip. For Elizabeth and Ellen, this was the beginning of a friendship that would last a lifetime.

After her graduation from Grand Rapids Christian, Elizabeth began working in the office of Keeler Brass; she did their bookkeeping. It was through this job that Elizabeth met the love of her life, a handsome young man named Alfred Oosterheert who worked in the factory. Though the exact facts of their meeting is unsure, a romance soon developed.

Just a few months after they began dating, Alfred was drafted into the military. Though he was promptly sent to Europe as a member of the engineering corps for the Army, he and Elizabeth stayed in touch by corresponding regularly. When stationed in Texas, prior to going overseas, Elizabeth even traveled down to see him. After his discharge, he returned to Grand Rapids and asked Elizabeth to marry him. She agreed.

After their wedding, the young couple settled down on the south side of Grand Rapids, near South High School. Alfred continued to work at Keeler Brass and soon after Dexter Lock, while Elizabeth found a bookkeeping job at Blodgett Hospital. While living on the south side, she and Alfred were blessed with their first child Phyllis. Elizabeth decided to stop working so that she could entirely devote herself to motherhood, and soon, a second child named Dick was born.

With a growing family, Elizabeth and Alfred hoped to move back to the North Side of the city. They managed to have a home built on Kelsey NE. The Oosterheerts soon moved in, and this would be the family residence until Elizabeth moved into the Holland Home. Here Elizabeth welcomed her final two children into the world, Steven and Judy. With a happy family of four children, the Oosterheerts enjoyed summer vacations at various cottages that Alfred and Elizabeth would rent. It was always a fun time, and the family looked forward to it every summer.

Following in their mother's footsteps, all the Oosterheert children attended Creston Christian School. During the children's school years, Elizabeth was an active parent in the ladies groups that supported the school. She was a room mother and also helped prepare the monthly "hot lunches" at the school. She was also active in the Tea Groups, another fund-raising group that worked to benefit the school. Elizabeth was very much a Christian mother, showing her beliefs in her actions instead of her words. She was always kind and patient. She would never say anything bad about a person, and always succeeded in finding the positive in others. Her children remember her as a very Godly lady.

At home, Elizabeth always made great efforts to take care of her family. She was an excellent homemaker whose cooking and baking always beckoned an eager dinner table. While this was important, she was also a wonderful nurturer. Elizabeth was always supportive of her children and their activities. She also looked after her in-laws when Alfred's mother was ill and unable to cook. Every Sunday evening she would prepare a meal and take it over to their house, so that the entire family could enjoy dinner together.

Elizabeth and her family share a long history with East Leonard Christian Reformed Church. Her parents were charter members in the congregation, and it was in this church that Elizabeth was baptized. She and Alfred were married there. When Alfred passed away in 1999, his funeral took place at this church. Elizabeth was a lifelong member. She and Alfred attended every Sunday, and they were both involved in the Church's activities. Though neither took on a leadership position, they were always eager to support the Church in whatever ways they could.

Throughout her life, Elizabeth remained very close to her two sisters. They would travel together, mainly to places like Traverse City, and at least once a week they would do something together. The three sisters kept to a regular schedule: breakfast together on Wednesday, getting hair done on Friday, going to Church on Sunday. She was the listener of the three, which was very important.

When Alfred retired, Elizabeth had another travel companion. She and Alfred sometimes traveled to California to visit their son Dick who lived there. While in the Golden State, they traveled around the area and enjoyed their time together.

In most of Elizabeth's adult life, she was affected with arthritis, causing her lots of pain and discomfort. Despite her debilitating condition, she never complained and she never allowed it to keep her from doing the things she loved. 

October 10, 1926 - June 26, 2018 Grand Rapids, MI With ways all her own, Jo DeGraaf added much to the lives around her. Devoted and dedicated, everyone loved her loving and helpful nature. Although she could be opinionated at times and brutally honest, Jo was a welcoming woman who lived by way of example. It was a joy to share her company and faith-filled heart. Dearly loved by her family and friends, Jo will be fondly remembered.

Jo's story began on October 10, 1926 in the riverfront city of Grand Rapids, Michigan. The daughter of Ralph and Sarah (Wondergem) Winkel, it was an exciting time in our nation during the heyday of the Roaring Twenties. Major U.S. manufacturers were implementing the beginning of the first eight-hour, five-day work week, and factory towns were flourishing. Born Josephine Anna Winkel, Jo was the fifth of eventually seven children in the Winkel home. She grew up alongside her siblings with whom she was close, Dick, Cornelius, Elizabeth, Jeannette, Raymond, and Willard. Her father worked as a belt sander before later becoming the proprietor of his own grocery store while her mother was a busy homemaker. Raised in faith, Jo's parents were charter members of East Leonard Christian Reformed Church where her family attended regularly and stayed active. In addition to her family, the Winkel's always seemed to have a boarder. Jo often recalled saying there were always "ten around the table", meaning her two parents, she and her siblings along with a usual boarder

The onset of the Great Depression created financial havoc from coast to coast. Jo and her family, like many, saw their share of struggles, too. They made their home in the Fuller and Leonard Street area where Jo's father eventually had his own grocery store. Despite the times, Jo and her siblings found themselves enjoying numerous adventures, fun, and a little mischief. They especially loved cranking up the car for quick spins around the orchard in addition to Christmas traditions and other holiday celebrations making treasured memories along the way. When the store closed on Saturday nights, the family would pack up the car and go to Vogel Center to visit family. Even though they never experienced family vacations like we know today, these were memorable trips that would include a flat tire along the journey and a refreshing, cool drink of fresh water from the well that everyone always looked forward to.

Jo was a bit mischievous growing up and she certainly paid the price for it, too! Her parents would "send her to the farm" when she needed reminders of hard work and discipline, and she despised getting up early and she hated animals. She often got "stuck" mowing the grass, and she disliked that also! She found herself getting into trouble at school, too, but instead of the farm, she spent a lot of time being sent to the hall. Jo liked to roller skate and often took the bus downtown to Division Street to skate. During her teen years she worked at the family grocery store as a clerk and soon became quite proficient at math and adding up the orders in her mind so accurately that customers wanted the other worker to better their chance of getting something for free when a mistake was made!

Jo attended Creston Christian School for elementary before going on to attend Grand Rapids Christian High School. She always walked to school because there was rarely a ride available. She met Clarence DeGraaf while roller skating after he was discharged from the Navy. Before long they were married and to their union they shared the love of three wonderful children. Chuck came along in 1949, and Mary followed in 1952. Tim completed their family in 1959 because Jo was lonely for a baby to hold, or so the story goes! Jo was a great mom. She attended all the kid's ball games and was active in their schooling. Through- out the years she peeled hundreds of apples to bake pies for fundraisers for the Christian School Association. An excellent cook and talented baker altogether, Jo's specialty included Vamino bars and her favorite restaurants were Red Hot, Stoneys, and Mr. Steak. A strict parent, Jo kept tabs on her kids. It wasn't easy hiding things from her because she knew everything they were up to. She'd even check if the TV was warm when the kids weren't supposed to be watching it. She made a loving, good home for her family which was always so sparkling clean one could see their footprints when you walked across her vacuumed carpet.

Having remained very close to her sisters, Jeannette and Elizabeth, Jo was always the designated driver as the other girls didn't drive. Once a week, Jo would pick them up and they'd each get their hair done together after having a nice breakfast out. Hairspray was very important to Jo as well as looking her best. She was a nice dresser and was always well put together. She also traveled with her sisters twice a year each spring and fall to Traverse City for a few days.


When it came to music, Jo was fond of country and western music, particularly the sounds of Johnny Cash and Patsy Cline. Saying Jo was an avid reader would be an understatement. She took them to breakfast every Sunday morning and on their way home from somewhere they'd stop by her house where she'd always treat them to a cold coke and candy or ice cream.

For many reasons, Jo DeGraaf was beloved by all she encountered. She could be a little feisty at times with her honest demeanor, yet that was only one of the many things to love about her. Generous and always lending a helping hand, Jo was empowered by her strong and active faith. She will be lovingly remembered for the many ways she loved her family and for her strong faith in Jesus through all circumstances. Dearly missed, Jo leaves behind a legacy of cherished memories never to be forgotten.

Ray Winkel

July 29, 1930 - October 17, 2018 Grand Rapids, MI With a deep love for his Lord, Ray Winkel was every bit a devoted and dedicated husband, father, grandfather, great grandfather, and friend. With faith as his guide, he was a wonderful example for his children to live by. His servant's heart lived for helping others, and his patience was without end. Ray also had a love for people in general, and could easily strike up a conversation with anyone. Selfless in all ways, Ray lived with integrity and devotion to his Lord and the family he so treasured. He will be long remembered and deeply missed.

With the onset of the Great Depression, by 1930 the unemployment rate had already reached astounding levels. Prohibition was law of the land while gangsters ran the streets of the big cities. Despite these trying times, entertainment and America's passion for baseball was a welcome deviation from everyday worries. Yet for Ralph and Sarah (Wondergem) Winkel, the year brought much hope and promise when on July 29, 1930 in Grand Rapids, Michigan they celebrated the birth of their son, Raymond.

The sixth of eventually seven children, Ray grew up alongside his siblings, Dick, Cornelius, Elizabeth, Jeanette, Josephine, and Willard in their family home on the city's Northeast side. His father worked as an insurance salesman and also managed the family grocery store at the corner of Leonard and Fuller while his mother looked after their household and took care of boarders. With seven children in tow, the Depression was extremely tough as they struggled to maintain their business. As charter members of East Leonard Christian Reformed Church, they relied on their strong faith.

Ray was close with his siblings and each day they walked to school together. Despite the times, Ray enjoyed boyhood adventures with his siblings and neighborhood friends. He held close fond memories of visiting extended family who owned a farm in Vogel Center, Michigan. During these visits, his family would all pack into one car and make the trip to visit his cousins and enjoy time spent on their farm. Beginning at the age of eight, Ray began living and working on the farm each summer which taught him an impeccable work ethic he carried his whole life through. Family get-togethers and the holidays were also an important part of Ray's upbringing and heritage, which he continued with his own family.

During his youth, Ray enjoyed the outdoors with his many cousins and friends. Although he never much cared for working on cars, he had an eye for them and particularly liked driving them. From the start, Ray was a likable young man. His easy way with strangers afforded him the blessing of many close friendships throughout his life. Through church and school, he developed a love for gospel music and sang for pleasure throughout his life. He graduated from Central Christian High School.

With the Korean War well underway, Ray was soon drafted to serve in the U.S. Army. For 22 days he traveled by ship on the long trek overseas and never once got sea sick. Due to the ship crossing the International Dateline on Christmas Day, he never had Christmas that year. On their arrival, Ray's platoon was asked if anyone knew how to type and Ray stepped forward as he had taken a typing class in high school. As fate would have it, he was given an office assignment and during the entire two years he was stationed in Korea he never saw the inside of a foxhole.

Ray returned home to Michigan following the service and worked odd jobs he could find, including Eberhard's Grocery Store. Dorothy Slachter from Lucas, Michigan was a young college student attending St. Mary's Nursing School. One weekend, when Ray and a friend planned to drive up North to hunt, Dorothy asked him for a ride to her nearby hometown. Ray and Dorothy shared great conversation and a wonderful visit on that car ride, and once back in Grand Rapids, Ray asked Dorothy out.

Their first date included a movie, and for the next two years they dated which came to include abiding love. On November 18, 1955, they were happily married at Dorothy's parent's house in Lucas and a dinner reception was held in nearby Cadillac, Michigan. After the reception, they ran into a terrible snowstorm while heading home to Grand Rapids, and were forced to spend the night in a little cabin in Big Rapids. They shared a laugh when they saw the sign on the door that read "Done Roaming." Later that week they traveled to Ft. Lauderdale, Florida where they enjoyed a memorable honeymoon.

The newlyweds settled into an apartment on Crescent Street for a short time before buying a house at 1256 Kelsey Street NE where Ray's sister, Elizabeth lived right next door with her family. Although they had to borrow money for the down payment, the house was theirs and it was where they would raise their four children, making treasured memories along the way. Daughter, Bonnie came along in 1956, followed by their son, John in 1958. Nancy was born in 1961, and Amy completed their family in 1965.

Ray was a devoted family man. As a father he was loving and supportive, and his children could easily come to him for advice and direction. Ray had patience like no other. He taught Dorothy to drive along with all the kids and also taught them to golf. By 1960, Ray was working for the U.S. Postal Service as a mail carrier, yet even on his days off he'd work with his brother in law, Clare, painting houses to earn extra money.

Ray and Dorothy were committed to a Christian education for their children. Although difficult at times, they made many sacrifices to do so. It paid off as Ray witnessed his children thrive in their faith and secure a solid education for their futures. With his work rotation, every sixth Saturday Ray and Dorothy packed up their family to visit Dorothy's mother up north. In addition to these special times, they also spent funfilled family vacations in Florida, Yellowstone National Park and Niagara Falls.

A lifelong member of East Leonard Christian Reformed Church, Ray's undeniable servant's heart shone bright through his church activities. There he served as an elder, deacon, and was a member of the Special Projects Group and played on the church softball league for years. Although he liked some of the newer music in church, he preferred the sacred hymns he came to know and love from his youth.

Ray was a good conversationalist and had a gift for remembering names and faces. When he worked as a postman he could even remember people and their street numbers. When grandchildren came along, Ray was overjoyed. Ever loving and involved in the lives of his grandchildren, he was sure to attend their concerts, games and other activities. Ray's grandchildren and great grandchildren were the happy recipients of his loving hugs, and time spent in the big rocking chair. In retirement, Ray and Dorothy traveled to Hawaii and wintered in Florida for a number of years. From his early years and beyond, Ray loved nothing more than some of his favorite delicacies which included peanut butter sandwiches. He also favored cheeseburgers with "nothin on it", one of Dorothy's delicious beef roasts, mashed potatoes and raisin custard pie.

From meager beginnings, Ray Winkel lived with integrity and a hard work ethic. Most importantly, he achieved a life filled with the love of family, and a legacy never to be forgotten. Ray never lost sight of where he came from and appreciated every blessing that came his way. Truly a man of God, Ray's patience and perseverance throughout his life is to be admired. With faith, he served his Lord and family well and for those he leaves behind, Ray will be remembered with great love and affection.






