Floyd Winn Tells of Experience on Tuscania.

Floyd Winn, of the Twentieth engineers, son of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Winn, was aboard the ill-fated Tuscania, and in a letter to his parents he tells of his escape.

"We had been on the water 13 days and hadn't had a bit of trouble at all until that evening just a little after dark. It was five minutes to six when there came an awful vibration of the ship and a terrible explosion and the ship settled over to one side quite a bit. I was down in the hold where I slept when it struck. I had to go up four flights of stairs to get to the lifeboat I had been assigned to. As soon as the torpedo struck every light on the ship went out, leaving everything in total darkness. As soon as it struck I went to my bunk and put on my mackinaw and life belt and then went out on deck. Everyone was going to his life boat and getting ready to go down. I went to the place where I was to take my boat and it never came down. Then they called for some help to get the boats down, so I went up to help. The ropes were broken. I helped get some of the other boats down. A destroyer then came up along side of the ship and the men went down the ropes on to it. I went up to where they were going down to the destroyer and started down and got about half way down and it steamed away. The submarine was shooting torpedoes at it.

I climbed back up the rope and got on the sinking ship again and after helping pull up some men that were on the ropes I went back and helped get down some more life boats and then after awhile the ship gave a list to the starboard side and the deck was so steep that you couldn't walk on it without something to hold on to. About that time another destroyer came up and I went down a rope on to it. I was on the ship about two hours after the torpedo struck and about 45 or 50 minutes after I quit her she blew up in the middle and went down."

An application of the city of East Helena for a 100 per cent increase in municipal water rates will be heard by the state railroad commission in the house chambers at the state capitol on July 8.

The board said the application claims that increased rates are necessary for at least one year or until a further commission order to permit paying "excessive operating costs" during the year 1948-49. The hearing will begin at 10 o'clock in the morning.

On the same day the board will hear an application of Consolidated Freightways, Inc., for general tariff revision on rates on intrastate movement of household goods in Montana. Changes are sought in minimum weights allowed, addition of charges on packing, accessorial and overtime labor charges. Some rates are to be increased and others decreased, the application stated.

Also on July 8 the board will hear an application of Floyd Winn of Thompson Falls for a clarification of his permit to haul property in private service between Thompson Falls and Missoula.



Thompson Falls, Nov. 28.—After two days spent in examination of 32 veniremen, a jury was secured late this evening in the case of Edith Colby, held for murder in the first degree. As the jury was not filled until about 4 o'clock, taking of testimony was deferred until tomorrow.

Spokane friends of Miss Colby are rallying to her support. Today saw a number of them in court and more are expected to arrive later. Among the witnesses from Spokane who will testify in her behalf are W. V. Valentine, G. F. McCarthy, George J. Bolks, former progressive county chairman; J. H. Heckel, a printer; A. Germain, secretary of the pressmen's union; Attorney William Riddle, Thomas Gamble, a politician; Richard Reinertson of the republican committee; Mrs. Emily Hughes, former secretary to the city health officer; A. McNeill, Mrs. Charles Whipple and W. D. Knight.

Dr. George Downs will submit expert testimony regarding Miss Colby's mental condition. The jury is composed of 11 ranchers and 1 car repairer. All are non-residents of Thompson Falls. Only two favor capital punishment.

The jurors finally accepted are: William West, Trout Creek; E. Hyre, Camas; J. C. Cook, Parma; H. Harris, Noxon; G. E. Moore, Parma; Alfred E. Todd, Camas; Forest L. Pullis, Oliver gulch; John Pullis, Oliver gulch; Arthur Clear, Plains; Isaac Engle, Noxon; J. F. Winn, Belknap, and S. Sievert, Paradise.

A Shafer, a farmer of Camas, who had been accepted by the attorneys for both sides, was excused by the court when word was received that his child was dangerously ill.

New Sawmill to Be Operated by Dixon Farmers

**Eight Months' Operation Is
Assured by Lumber Or-
ders Already Filed.**

Dixon, Oct. 5.—(Special)—Charles Pylatt of Belknap, who has been operating the Jocko lumber yard in Dixon, and Elan Winn of Thompson Falls have purchased the Henry Larson sawmill at Noxon and will move it to Dixon. Mr. Winn has a crew of men who are busily engaged in removing the mill to Dixon where it will be run on a cooperative basis. Individual farmers will purchase standing timber and stumpage from the state. The lumber will be cut from each farmer's individual timber holdings by a regular crew of men and supplied to the mill, the mill to charge a certain amount for cutting and finishing. All the Dixon farmers have signed up a stated amount of lumber and the mill now has enough signed orders for about eight months' work. There will be over a million and a half feet of timber cut through the Dixon mill this year. A planer will be installed as the business warrants same. The mill will open about October 15.

Mr. Winn of Thompson Falls has sold his property at that place and has moved his family to Dixon. He will be in charge of the mill. Fred Wipplinger will have charge of the logging crew supplying the mill with material. C. E. McLaughlin has been appointed bookkeeper and treasurer. Mr. Pylatt and Mr. Winn will operate the mill on a contract basis. About twenty men will be employed regularly.

Mr. Pylatt will continue his mill at Belknap in connection with his holdings in the Dixon mill. This employment will greatly benefit the community, taking a number off the relief rolls. The Jocko lumber yard was taken over during the summer by Mr. Pylatt from the H. C. Neffner estate and was in charge of his son-in-law, Harold Barret of Belknap. Mr. Barret left last week for Seattle to take up Diesel engineering and Mr. Winn is now in charge, having purchased an interest in the lumber yard.

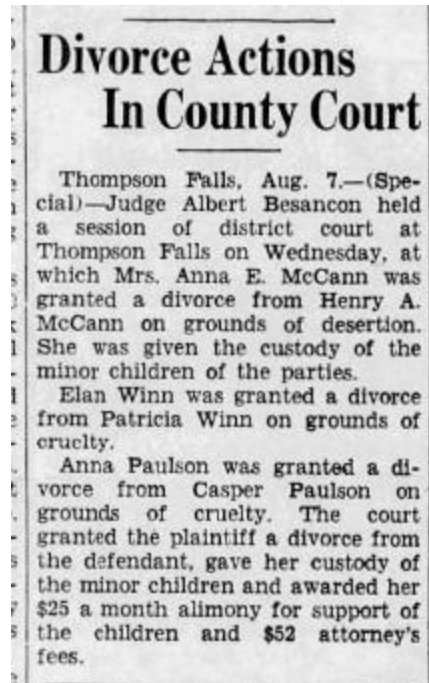

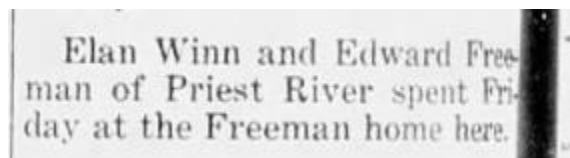
