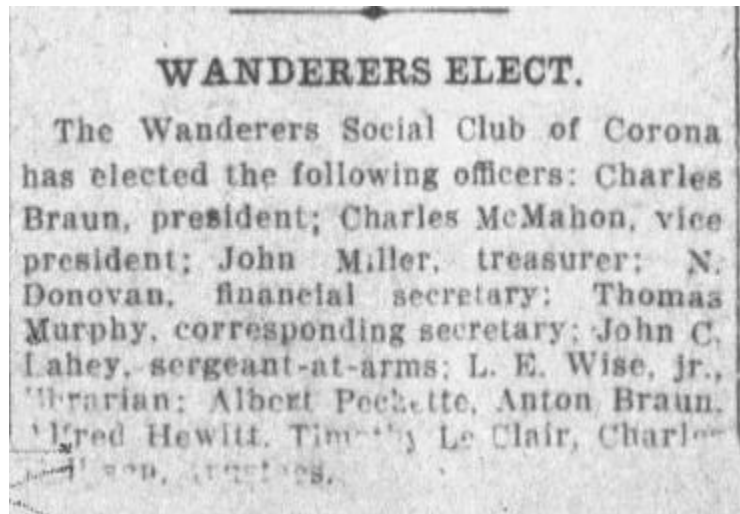

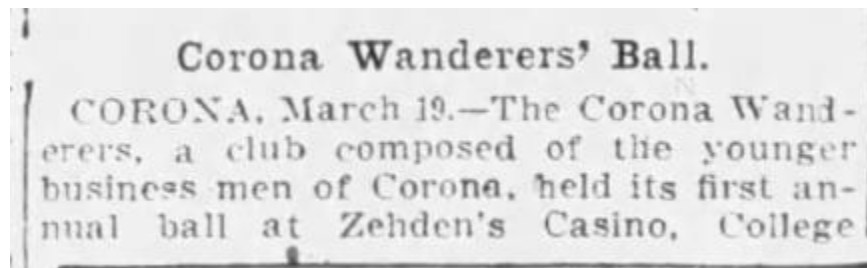

New York Men Aboard Tuscania

Mr. and Mrs. Lawrence Wise, of 88 Eighth street, Woodside, are anxiously awaiting some word of their son, Lawrence Wise, jr., who was aboard the U. S. Transport Tuscania, as a member of the 158th Aero Squadron, U. S. A. When seen at the home last evening, the parents said they had received no word through the government whether their son was safe or not. Mrs. Wise said that just forty years ago this month she visited relatives in Cork, Ireland, and she hoped her son was safe on Irish soil now.

Lawrence Wise, jr., is 27 years old, and the only son of Lawrence Wise, sr., a retired hotel man. He attended school in Woodside and also the Bryant High School in Long Island City.

August 15, 1917, he enlisted in the aero service, going first to Fort Slocum, thence to Camp Kelly at San Antonio, Texas, and later to Lake Charles, La.

On January 15 the 158th Aero Squadron arrived in New York and the young man was permitted a short leave to visit his family, reporting the next day at Garden City. Shortly after this he boarded the ship for Europe.

Mr. and Mrs. Wise have one daughter, Miss Jennie Wise, who is employed in the Medical Supply Department of the Army, in Manhattan.

"It was just forty years ago this month that I was visiting in Cork, Ireland, where I hope my boy is safe and well today," said Mrs. Lawrence Wise, mother of Lawrence E. Wise Jr. of the 158th Aero Squadron.

Scores of friends of Mr. and Mrs. Wise called at their residence, 88 Eighth street, Woodside, L. I., last evening and today, to seek further information relative to their son, who was well known in Woodside, where he was a member of St. Sebastian's Catholic Church and various societies connected with the church. Lawrence Wise Sr., is a retired hotel man, formerly prominent in Democratic politics.

Lawrence Wise Jr. visited his home in Woodside on the night of January 15, previous to his sailing. He is 27 years old and an only son. He is a graduate of Public School No. 14, Woodside, and was a student at Bryant High School, Long Island City. The young man enlisted in the aero service on August 15, last. He first went to Fort Slocum, and thence to Camp Kelly, St. Antonio, Texas. Later he was sent to the flying field at Lake Charles, La., where two Corona airmen were killed recently. Leaving Lake Charles, the 158th Aero Squadron entrained for New York and it was due to the fact that the train was stalled at New York that permission was given the young man to go to his home at Woodside and remain there over night on January 15. He reported at Garden City, L. I., the day following.

The fate of only 5 of the 74 Brooklyn and Long Island men on the Tuscania was in doubt today. It is known that 69 have been saved, 65 being on the official list of survivors sent out by the War Department and 4 others communicating with their relatives by private cablegrams.

RELATIVES CLING TO HOPE.

Families Await News of Bartolomeo, Maystrick, and Wise.

Families of the New Yorkers who were on the *Tuscania* who had not been accounted for were still spending anxious hours in the hope of good news yesterday. Among those who have not yet been accounted for is Corporal Adolph Bartolomeo of the 213th Aero Squadron, who is 28 years old. He enlisted on Dec. 18 at Mineola. Before enlisting he lived with his wife at 572 Steinway Avenue, Astoria, L. I. He was employed by Steinway & Sons, piano manufacturers, Long Island City, and had composed songs.

Joseph G. Maystrick, private in the 213th Aero Squadron, 35 years old, lived with his father, John Maystrick, at 30 Clark Street, Astoria, L. I. He was a plasterer and active in local politics. He was an intimate friend of Corporal Bartolomeo, and was a member of the Queensboro Lodge, 878, B. P. O. Elks.

Lawrence E. Wise, Jr., private in the 213th Aero Squadron, enlisted on Aug. 15 at Mineola and was sent to Kelly Field, San Antonio, Texas, and Lake Charles, La., where he received his training. Before his enlistment he lived with his father, Lawrence E. Wise, at 38 Eighth Street, Woodside, L. I. He was 23 years old and a graduate of Bryant High School. Formerly he was a clerk in New York.

At least one Long Island man was among the 171 victims of the Tuscania buried in Scotland yesterday. Associated Press dispatches from a Scottish port contain the name of Joseph G. Maystrick of 30 Clark street, Astoria, L. I., as among the identified dead.

Woodside Youth Was Aboard the Ill-Fated Tuscania.

Woodside, Feb. 20.—Lawrence E. Wise, jr., son of Mr. and Mrs. Lawrence Wise, of Eighth street, is safe in Scotland, according to a telegram received from Washington last night.

Lawrence Wise is a member of the 158th Aero Squadron, which sailed aboard the ill-fated Tuscania. This is the first word the family has received since the sinking of the transport. The members of the family had about given up hope, as his name failed to appear among those saved or the identified dead.

Official notification has also been received of the safety of Lester N. McKenna, of Flushing.

L. E. WISE JR. SAFE; SAILED ON TUSCANIA

**Dreyer Only Long Island Boy
Unaccounted For.**

Parents of Lawrence E. Wise Jr. of 98 Eighth avenue, Woodside, L. I., have received official notification from the War Department of the young man's safe arrival abroad. Wise, a member of the 158th Aero Squadron, was on the torpedoed Tuscania and his fate was in doubt until last night.

With Wise's safety assured, only one Long Island man is unaccounted for. He is Richard F. Dreyer of Sea Cliff, L. I., a member of the 100th Aero Squadron. There were seventy-four Brooklyn-Long Island men aboard, with two perishing—Joseph G. Maystrick and Adolph Bartolomeo, Long Island City chums, both members of the 213th Aero Squadron.

Mr. and Mrs. Richard Dreyer have given up all hope that their son is safe and have reconciled themselves to the belief that he perished when the ship sank. Shortly before the Tuscania sailed he had been ill in Mineola with measles and was far from well when the transport sailed.

Washington, D. C., February 20—Seventy-four American soldiers aboard the torpedoed liner Tuscania remain unidentified or unaccounted for today, according to the latest lists of survivors and missing available to the War Department and the Associated Press. Included in this number are thirty-three unidentified dead buried in Scotland, and forty-one still reported as missing.

COLORED MAN WHO USED RAZOR ARRAIGNED IN COURT

**Declares He Does Not Need a Lawyer
and Will Conduct His Own
Case on May 9.**

With four charges against him George Taylor, colored, 31 years old, of No. 1689 Atlantic avenue, coolly told Magistrate Furlong, in the Gates Avenue Court yesterday, that he didn't need the services of a lawyer, and was ready to have three of the cases tried.

"I have all my witnesses in the three cases, but not in the fourth," he said, "and I want time to git 'em."

Taylor was arrested on Wednesday evening of last week by Officer Cahill at No. 839 Herkimer street. Cahill had been looking for him since Jan. 30 on a warrant which he secured from Magistrate Furlong. Cahill broke up a crap game on Atlantic avenue and he charged Taylor with having threatened to shoot him.

Taylor was arraigned the following day, and held for examination. As soon as that fact became known to people living in his section of the city, the police began to receive a number of complaints against him. Lawrence E. Wise, a saloonkeeper at No. 1727 Atlantic avenue, alleged that Taylor, on December 6, of last year, had entered his saloon, and drawing a revolver, told him he'd shoot unless he were given a drink, free, right away.

James E. Rhodes, a laborer, living at No. 1695 Atlantic avenue, charged Taylor with having struck him on the mouth with his fist on the morning on Jan. 24 because he refused to give him money when he asked for it.

The principal charge was made by Albert Oliver, also colored, of No. 9 Sumpter street. He said that on April 8, at the corner of Ralph avenue and Fulton street, Taylor slashed at him several times with a razor. He had no witnesses for this, and was held in \$1,000 on this charge until the 9th, and the other charges were down for the same date.

TO FIGHT FOR ITS HIGH SCHOOL.

All Woodside Stirred Over Decision of the Board of Education.

The Board of Education of the city of New York has not one friend in all of the village of Newtown in the borough of Queens. The central body proposes to abolish the high school which has existed in Woodside almost since consolidation, and send the children now attending it to the new high school building in the Long Island City section. When the Rev. E. N. Gannon of St. Sebastian's Catholic Church told 200 Woodsiders on Thursday night that for "ways that are dark and tricks that are vain," the central board was very peculiar, he was cheered.

The priest was speaking at a meeting held in Raesch's Hall, in Woodside. Capt. Harold B. Christensen, president of the Woodside Protective Association, was the chairman of the meeting, and the priest was the chief speaker. He said it was his intention in the near future to establish a parochial school in connection with his church, but that fact instead of making him indifferent to the retention of the high school, made him all the more anxious to have it for the benefit of the children of his flock when they grew older. The removal the priest said, would be an outrage on the fastest growing village in the borough. The step was demanded by scheming politicians and not with a view of benefiting

the children or of cutting down expense or anything else that was laudable.

No high school in the State, Father Cannon declared, had a better record than that of Woodside. The parents knew and admired the principal and his teachers. The proposal to remove the school was a piece of effrontery. The people of Woodside were largely of the class that had to make sacrifices to educate their children and the added cost of 10 cents a day car fare to Long Island City would shut out scores of children in a few years, for their parents could not afford that extra cost. Father Cannon made a strong plea for a bold fight to retain the school.

Commissioner Charles Ritter of the local school board read a statement showing that the Woodside high school stood in the front rank of high schools in the State. Chairman Joseph Heatherington of the same board pledged himself and fellow commissioners to help in the fight. He said he could not see what purpose there was in removing the school. It could not be expense, as expense could be curtailed easily in other directions.

To show there was no politics in the opposition to the removal of the school, James Osborne, the local Democratic leader, and O. H. Green, who heads the Republicans, vied in denunciation of the removal. Richard D. Adams and J. D. Gilloit also spoke, and a call was made for money to defray the expense of the fight. About \$200 was pledged. This committee was named to take charge of the fight: James Osborne, L. E. Wise, Samuel J. MacKenzie, C. T. Timonier, J. S. MacKenzie, J. D. McEwen, R. Leslie Smith, H. D. Christensen and Oliver H. Green.
