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
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Excerpt from "To the Line of Fire: Mexican Texans and World War I" by José A. Ramirez, Texas A&M University Press, 2009, page 94:

In discussing the sinking of the Tuscania [note: casualty figures are incorrect in the book's preceding paragraph]:

For weeks after the attack, the Texas press kept its readers abreast of the latest developments in the story, as many Texans were aboard the ill-fated ship. Among these were several Tejanos. Most, like Marcos Armijo of El Paso, who saved a nurse from drowning after falling overboard, [this was reported widely in 1918 but is not true; the two women aboard, employees of the Anchor Line] safely slid down ropes to their lifeboats] survived the disaster. But some were not so fortunate. Nine Tejanos – Sixto Flores and José Ybarra of Laredo, Rosendo Diaz of Alice, Florencio Heras of Alfred, Angel Pérez of Rosenberg, Guadalupe Garza of Benavides, Lucio Ramos of San Antonio, Cirilo Rodriguez of Bergsmill, and Juan Pérez of Buerne – perished in the frigid waters off the Irish coast. In Alice, the Tejano community held a ceremony to honor the victims of the attack.

JOSE YBARRA LOST HIS LIFE WHEN TUSCANIA WENT DOWN

Young Man Among Selective Registrants Who Responded to Call Victim of Submarine.

According to official accounts published of the casualties of the transport Tuscania, which was sunk recently by a German submarine, one Laredo boy, Jose Ybarra, was among those who perished.

Young Ybarra was among the national army men from Webb county and was the son of Romulo Ybarra, a well known butcher here. Ever since the sinking of the Tuscania the fate of the young man had been in doubt, but first reports said he was among those saved later that he was among the missing but would probably be rescued, and at last comes the official information that he was among those who lost their lives.

BODY OF FIRST LAREDS BOY BROUGHT FROM OVER THERE

Remains of Private Jose Ibarra, Who Lost Life Off Irish Coast, Will Arrive in Laredo Tomorrow.

The remains of Private Jose Ybarra, one of the victims who lost his life when the U. S. Transport Tuscania was torpedoed off the Irish coast in 1917, will be brought to Laredo on tomorrow morning's train, this being the first body of a Laredo soldier boy to be brought back from foreign fields, the body of Ybarra being interred on the Irish coast until recently, when it was exhumed and was brought back to the United States.

Jose Ybarra, who was a native of Laredo and son of Mr. and Mrs. Romulo Ybarra, enlisted in the national army in 1917 and was on his way to France at the time the transport was torpedoed and a number of American boys perished in the foundering of the Tuscania. Romulo Ybarra, the father, left here today for San Antonio to meet the remains in San Antonio and accompany them to Laredo. On arrival here the remains will be met by soldiery and the funeral will take place with full military honors.

Confusion over identity:

This Jose Ybarra was confused in 1918 newspaper accounts with a boxer known as Joe Rivers or Mexican Joe. Some of the erroneous stories:

Dallas, Texas, April 4.- Joe Rivers, Hone-time noted lightweight boxer, has given his life for his country. m The war casualty list sent out from Washington contained the name, Jose ul Ybarra, private, Laredo, Texas, as one of the victims of the German submarine which sank the transport Tuscania last th Ybarra was the correct name month. of Joe Rivers, who gained fame as a boxer. He came into prominence as a featherweight by knocking out Danny Webster, checking the career of Joe Coster, of Brooklyn, and also stopping Oliver Kirkwood, all in 1911. Rivers a short un. while later sank into temporary obliviou be. when he fell before Johnny Kilhane. The next year, 1912, he regained some of his lost prestige by knocking out Frankle Couley and Jack White, but 10: again he was set back when he attempted to dethrone Ad Wolgast as king of the titlightweights, the champion being credited with a knockent after one of the most sensational fights in the history of m: boxing. After this memorable struggle with Wolgast, Rivers never assonated to more than an in-and-soter. Although he stopped Knockout Brown, he suffered a similar fate himself when he fought Wilill lie Ritchis in 1913, his arcord fling at the lightweight title. A knockout victory over Matty McCue in 1914 sent him to nd the front again, but he was a top-liner only until he met Frankie Cullaban, in 1915. Callahan secred a knockout is 1111 the second round, giving him the reputation he now boasts. From that time Rivers' same erept ms into the sporting columns only when be fought, and the 1918 boxing record be carried virtually the only decision on the last fight in which be participated—that with Bobby Wangh in Star City, N. M. on November 14 of last year. Rivers look on a fool in the thirteenth round.

As the first American boxer to make the supreme sacrifice for his country. Joe Rivera former lightweight fighter, will go down in ring history as a true-blue hero. Unheralded, unsung, this young man, who came within an ace of defeating Ad Wolgast for the lightweight championship, gave up his life for his country. His name was contained in the latest casualty list of the illfated Tuscania. The name appears as Jose Ybarra, private, Laredo, Texas. started out as a featherweight and gained some fame by knocking out Danny Webster and stopping the career of Joe Coster. Later he lost his prestige by going down before Johnny Kilbane. In 1912 he became too heavy for the feather class and began fighting lightweights. He met Ad Wolgast in that year for the title and lost only after a memorable battle and a dubious decision. In that fight, staged July 4, both boxers were lying prostrate on the floor in the thirteenth round when Rivers was counted out. Wolgast on the floor as the result of a right to the jaw, and Rivers apparently fouled. Both of the little fellows were covered with gore from belt to head, after fighting like tigers to a draw up to that The thirteenth round opened with Rivers sending a cracking right to the jaw,

JOE RIVERS DEAD.

WASHINGTON, April 4.—Jose Ybarra, who was listed by the war department as among the identified dead from the Tuscania, is understood to be Joe Rivers, purilist.

LOS ANGELES, Cal. April 4.—Joe Rivers, pugilist, reported to have gone lown with the transport Tuscania, boxed an exhibition bout with Leach Cross here about two weeks ago.

SAN DIEGO, Cal., April 4.—Joe Rivers, reported in Washington dispatches to have been identified with Jose Ybarra as a victim of the sinking of the transport Tuscania, fought Chief Abernethy, an Indian pugilist, here on March 22g some time after the Tuscania was sunk.

Rivers is believed to be in Los Angeles. He has not enlisted. Fight promoters who have been in the game many years said there was no doubt it was the original Joe Rivers, once a runner up for he lightweight championship, who fought Abernathy.

REPORT OF RIVERS' DEATH WAS MISTAKE.

When the casualty list of the Tuscania was printed the list included the name of Jose Ybarra, Laredo. At once everybody concluded that it was Joe Rivers, the lightweight boxer, and his obituary was written in more than one column. But, as Mark Twain once said, when a story of his death was printed: "It is greatly exaggerated."

So it seems in the case of Joe Rivers. First we got the denial from Sam Wallach, brother of the famous Leach Cross, and now we get it from another source and this one appears quite authentic. Our informant is C. C. Edwards of this city, who, in a letter to us, fieclares that he has just arrived from Los Angeles, where, two weeks ago, Rivers boxed a four-round bout with Leach Cross at a newsboys benefit, and that besides he has seen him many times since the Tuscania disaster.

Mr. Edwards also says that Joe Rivers is the fighter's real name and that he was born in Los Angeles twenty-nine years ago. Joe, he says, is living at Santa Barbara with his wife and that, although he tried to get a job as boxing instructor at one of

the soldier camps, he was turned down and that was as near as he got to getting in a uniform.


