Last Man's Club Will Be Formed by Survivors of Chippewa War Units

Reunion of World War Veterans Will Be Held Here Sunday Afternoon.

Survivors of Chippewa Falls' three military units, Headquarters Company, Band and Company A of the Fourth Wisconsin Infantry, who left here on August 11, 1917, for the World war and later became part of the famous Thirty-Second Division, are to hold a reunion in the American Legion club rooms Sunday afternoon, when a Last Man's Club will be organized. Announcement of the meeting to start at two o'clock, was made today and it is proposed to make the reunion an annual affair after effecting a permanent organization and electing officers.

It is expected the reunion will be attended by a large number of veterans for the plans call for a real old-fashioned get-together session. Members of these three organizations enlisted not only from Chippewa Falls but from all parts of the surrounding country and when they meet Sunday, the "boys" will have a great opportunity to compare notes of what they have been doing since the war ended in 1918 as well as talk over the many experiences and hardships they went through together in those never-to-be-forgotten battlefields of France.

Officers of the three Chippewa units when they left for the front included Major E. A. Firth, Capt. John Schneller, Captain P. J. Pangborn, Captain Robert L. Wiley, First Lieut. Harley Lea Vasseur and Bandmaster Louis Altman.

Three Veterans' Home Members on Tuscania When Ship Was Sunk

Waupaca—The torpedoing of the Tuscania by a German U-boat at 5:45 p. m. Feb. 5, 1918, will never be forgotten by Hank Kleist, Jack Loftus and Ed Yell of the Wisconsin Veterans' Home.

As to their personal experiences, the men will relate little of the misery of the 14 hours they spent on a raft before being rescued.

When the boat was torpedoed, Hank was injured and after his rescue he spent six weeks in a hospital. Upon reaching land he found his meal ticket in his shirt pocket, and that ticket now occupies an important place in the Home museum.

Loftus and Yell left that ship with forty or more comrades, with no drinking water and no provisions. All were inadequately clothed.

Many young men from Chippewa County served their country proudly during WW1.

We have been fortunate to have a few artifacts that originally belonged to one of these men, Oscar Bjork, that have been donated to the Historical Society.

On January 24, 1918, Oscar sailed out of New Jersey on board the Tuscania, a luxury liner that had been refitted as a troopship. It carried approximately 384 crew members

and 2,013 army personnel, including many soldiers from the Chippewa Falls area. On the bitterly cold evening of February 5th, it was torpedoed by a German submarine and sank only a few miles off the coast of Northern Ireland. About 210 of the crew and troops were lost.

The wreck of the Tuscania lies between Scotland's Islay Island and Northern Ireland's Rathlin Island under 330 feet of water. Many of the soldiers on board were saved and cared for

by local people.

Fortunately, Oscar survived this ordeal and we are grateful to have been given his Tuscania Survivors Certificate and his Roster of the Wisconsin Tuscania Survivors Club along with his uniform. In the Roster he is listed as Vice President of the Club.

The following is an article that ran in the Chippewa Herald six days after the Tuscania was torpedoed:


